## THE CONGRESS OF LOCAL AND REGIONAL AUTHORITIES

## Resolution 200 (2005)<sup>1</sup> on natural and industrial disasters: local authorities facing emergencies

The Congress, bearing in mind the proposal of the Chamber of Local Authorities,

- 1. Having taken note of its Resolution 129 (2002) on local authorities confronting natural disasters and emergencies;
- 2. Reiterating its concern at the frequency of natural disasters, which often hit European towns and regions, but which most recently devastated Southeast Asia, destroying hundreds of thousands of lives:
- 3. Aware of the fact that most natural disasters are unpredictable and, hence, unavoidable;
- 4. Convinced that, in these circumstances, it is important to combine all efforts with a view to controlling events and managing the consequences as efficiently as possible in order to save human lives;
- 5. Considering that it is important that the different institutional levels work together, and that, in this context, local authorities have a vital role to play;
- 6. Anxious to help local authorities meet their responsibilities in the event of natural disasters, which result in the loss of human lives, situations of distress and extensive damage;
- 7. Aware of the experience acquired in some countries and by some local authorities, and of the importance of taking due account of such experience;

- 8. Drawing attention to the contribution made by the Council of Europe's Open Partial Agreement on Major Hazards (EUR-OPA) and welcoming the fruitful cooperation that this body has established with the United Nations Office for the Coordination of Humanitarian Affairs (OCHA);
- 9. Sharing the opinion of the Chamber of Local Authorities on the potential value of a handbook drawing on the experience and knowledge acquired in this field and setting out essential measures for reacting in emergency situations,
- 10. Approves the handbook "40 measures for local authorities in dealing with natural hazards" prepared by the Committee on Sustainable Development and the Chamber of Local Authorities;
- 11. Asks the Bureau of the Congress and the Committee on Sustainable Development to:
- a. disseminate the handbook as widely as possible through the members of the Congress, national associations of local authorities, bodies specialising in the training of local and regional authorities and non-governmental authorities, in particular those working in the fields of public safety and sustainable development;
- b. continue to co-operate with organisations specialising in the management of natural disasters, such as the EUR-OPA partial agreement and the OCHA, in particular by seeking their support in setting up and operating a network of towns which have been victims of natural disasters and for the implementation of the present resolution;
- c. pay special attention to the development of a "risk culture", the aim of which would be to help citizens to cope better with disasters.
