

Al snaps business titan jaywalking

#F_AI_L An Artificial Intelligence system in China publicly shamed one of the country's most prominent business executive for jaywalking - after spotting their mug going past on the side of a bus.

Dong Mingzhu, the chair and <u>public face</u> of industrial giant Gree Electric is a well known public figure in China, and beyond: Fortune named her the <u>fourth</u> most powerful businesswoman outside the United States this year.

The *South China Morning Post* reported that an image of Dong on the side of a bus was captured by police traffic cameras, and fed into a shaming gallery increasingly used in Chinese cities.

Shenzhen was the $\underline{\text{first}}$ to adopt this method of keeping public order. Some systems go further and $\underline{\text{spray}}$ jaywalkers with water.




