



- b. to continue with the work of the Commission, a special programme for the revision of school textbooks and the preparation of to set-up horizontal networks based on greater mutual religious dialogue, but furthermore to encourage the introduction into curricula of the global dimension of peace and active co-operation and, on the other hand, to encourage the European Union in the growing interdependence between the North and the South;
- c. to support the dissemination of cultural and religious works illustrating the common roots of the continent, and widely where our common roots are common to all peoples of the continent; this knowledge and understanding should be shared by all Europeans;
- d. to use the media as a multiplier to further known and accepted European values and to promote partnership between the North and the South;
- e. to step up the work of the North-South Centre on combating exclusions, limiting government intervention and promoting equal opportunities in the member states, in order to enable them to evaluate the existing activities and programmes where necessary to better use the resources available in the regions most in need of them;
- 8. Invites the Committee of Ministers:
  - a. to further develop the "quadrupartite" structure of the North-South Centre, involving governments, parliaments, local and regional authorities and civil society and formal and non-formal organisations both in its statutory bodies and in its activities; to ensure that the Centre is able to coordinate and consolidate a more open and neighbourly relationship between the North and the South;
  - b. to support a decentralised approach in those countries that have participated in the North-South Centre to do so as soon as possible and the implementation of development projects, via a direct involvement of local and regional authorities;
  - c. to devise, with the consent of the member states concerned and particularly active in the North-South Centre (Denmark, L, SO C)
