'OneVoice Platform' Mission Statement

Committed Governments working with WADA in keeping sport free from doping in every corner of the world and protecting the rights of athletes so they can compete cleanly on a level-playing field by speaking with one voice.

What is 'OneVoice Platform'?

- <u>Intergovernmental co-ordination</u> mechanism on WADArelated issues
- Established at the Public Authorities (PA) Meeting in Seoul (Korea) in <u>November 2017</u>
- Functions since <u>1 January 2018</u>
- Led by the <u>WADA Vice-President</u> (representing PAs)
- Aimed to further strengthen the role of WADA as the global regulator in the anti-doping field
- Permanent Secretariat provided by the <u>Council of Europe</u>


Why is 'OneVoice Platform' needed?

- Governments represent <u>50% of WADA</u> and the fight against doping is a matter of public interest
- Governments hold <u>18 seats in the FB and 5 seats in the ExCo</u> (in addition to the current WADA Vice-Presidency)
- The involvement of governments in the fight against doping constantly rises
- Governments' representatives in WADA lack natural forums for discussions outside of the ExCo/FB
- Considerable inter-regional differences exist
- Frequent rotations of PA political representatives in WADA bodies

How will 'OneVoice Platform' function?

- Facilitates exchange of views between the PA representatives in order to consolidate positions before meetings
- Enables PAs to **react quickly** to the emerging anti-doping issues and timely formulate proposals
- Ensures 'institutional memory' despite the rotation of PA members in WADA
- Uses two sets of procedures:
 - Before WADA meetings
 - Between WADA Meetings

What will the 'OneVoice Platform' do?

• <u>Immediate priority</u> – to ensure the functioning of the effective co-ordination between PAs and active engagement of all regions

Medium-term Priorities:

- WADA Funding
- Review of the WADC and other elements of the antidoping system
- Promoting better dialogue between the PAs and Sport Movement on anti-doping matters
