HELP Network Strategy

- 1. Reinforce the role of the HELP Consultative Board, Justice Training Institutions, Bar Councils and European HELP partners (FRA, EJTN & CCBE).
- 2. **HELP will try to be more reactive** to Justice Training Institutions' requests.
- 3. Integrate in initial training at least HELP courses on ECHR and Interplay ECHR-EU Charter.
- 4. Involve EJTN and CCBE in the development/update of HELP courses.
- 5. Integrate in initial and continuous training other HELP courses
- **6.** Translate HELP catalogue in your national language.
- 7. From the highest possible level (judiciary and Bar Councils), circulate HELP info (e.g.catalogue) within judges, prosecutors and lawyers.
- 8. For Focal and Info points, share knowledge/catalogue among their peers, particularly those working in criminal issues not only human rights peers.
- 9. Promote HELP courses as **self-learning** & reference/working tool.
- 10. Self-learning: HELP courses to complement university programmes CM Rec(2019)5 on the ECHR system in university education and professional training
