## Peer mediation for conflict resolution in VET schools

## **Montenegro**

## DESCRIPTION

In Montenegro, violence – domestic, peer-to-peer and online – and its prevention is part of syllabus for the compulsory subject of Sociology. It includes 36 lessons in total in 3-year VET schools and 72 lessons in total in 4-year VET schools.

In addition to that, since 2019, peer mediation for conflict resolution has been implemented in most VET schools. The schools have teams of **students trained for peer mediation** through programs provided by NGO organisations on adhoc basis or by teachers. **Teachers receive their training** through programs – basic and training for trainers - created by the governmental Centre for alternative resolution of conflicts (<a href="https://centarzaars.me">https://centarzaars.me</a>) and accredited by the Bureau for Education Services for the in-service training of teachers (<a href="Profesionalni razvoj">Profesionalni razvoj</a> – Zavod za školstvo Crne Gore). The activity is implemented on a **need basis**, from 2 times per week to once a month.

The activity is currently assessed by the Bureau for Education Services through an **external assessment and quality assurance** based on school indicators. An **internal assessment** is also carried out, for example though schools' self-evaluations.

## REFLECTIONS

Peer mediation provides students with the opportunity to **take responsibility** for their actions and **empowers them to cooperate** in finding solutions to problems. Moreover, it improves **communication** between students, and between students and teachers, while helping students develop skills such as **listening**, **critical thinking and problem solving**. Peer mediation has been shown to be more effective for resolution of conflicts than measures taken by head teachers or school management.
