Council of Europe Landscape Convention

Autonomous Regions have almost total political and administrative autonomy, except for national defense, foreign affairs and internal security policies.

In the mainland there exist administrative regions, and the five Regional Coordination and Development Commissions are responsible for implementing the national policies, such as regional and territorial development as well as environment at the regional level. Some ministries have regional delegations to implement their sectorial policies at the regional level (for example, culture, agriculture, health).

The Municipalities, with directly elected bodies, are responsible for defining and implementing local level their own policies in areas such as socio-economic development, territorial planning, public supply, sanitation, health, education, culture, environment and sport.
