European Judicial Training Report

 240 000 or 18,1% of all EU justice professionals trained on EU law in 2021

 Continuing upward trend for lawyers, court prosecutors' office staff and notaries in comparison with pre-pandemic years 36 000 participants or 2,7% of all EU justice professionals in EU(co)- funded training




 no profession reached the quantitative objectives of the European judicial training strategy for 2021-2024

- substantial decrease
 by -25 % in comparison
 to 2020; -63 % for
 lawyers
- Considerable differences
 between Member States
 and professions






European Judicial Training Report 2022-Training of judges & prosecutors on EU law

Percentage of lawyers participating in continuing training activities on EU law in the EU and the Western Balkans








