





« Crisis » : what do you mean ?

« Once women have achieved equality, they will be your masters . . . » - Cato the elder, Consul of the Roman Republic, - 194 BC Each time gender equality is progressing : the same tune again and again

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Achieving gender equality doesn't belong solely to my generation, or to me (like social justice or the preservation of our environment). It is a long term issue and each one of us has the choice to contribute positively or negatively.

It is not a personal choice, it is a Professional duty.

Step by step, little by little: getting a short term and concrete action is the key to don't be demotivated.

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A CONCRETE EXAMPLE, reducing the average length of a hospital stay in a country may be a legitimate aim, but it will have a differentiated and heavier impact on women: the care needs that are not covered by hospitals will have to be taken over by families, in practice, mostly by women in the families.

Too much work and not enough time.

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In a short-term it is a bit of extra work (reading, training), but then it is a transformative approach and a personal and collective benefit

The most difficult thing is to start. You can choose a small step. Moving to action is the most important!

A lot of tools and support are available.

And the deal is not getting an extra

workload but adopting a gender

perspective in your current priority. For

example ...

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Planning the production of sex disaggregated statistics is doing something! It is a crucial first step.

Today, sex-disaggregated statistics are available in a wide range of areas and for most European countries.

We have reached gender equality; this is not an issue in my country/commune/ organisation.

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structural inequalities exist in most areas and societies.

What do you think to do a report on your country/ commune/organisation to gather material about this unprecedented miracle?

Nature made us different: men and women are biologically different, so differences all along our lives are normal.

Differences is not the same as inequalities.

« Complementary », could you explain it to me please ?

Don't you think it is a naturalisation of Sexism, same happened with Racism when some people were using science and biological arguments to explain the inferiority of slaves?

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Gender quotas are legal positive actions, promoted by different standards at European and at international level (e.g. Council of Europe Recommendations, Article 157 of the EU Treaty, Article 4 of CEDAW Convention).

The European Court of Human rights has stated that 'the right not to be discriminated against in the enjoyment of the rights guaranteed under the [ECtHR] is also violated when States (...) fail to treat differently persons whose situations are significantly different'

We have a woman mayor/ president/director so there is no problem with gender equality.

The sole presence of women as decision-makers or in a project does not guarantee that policies or activities will take into account a gender equality perspective or improve the situation.

It is true that *some* women have reached some decision-making positions, but generally women are still underrepresented. This is a structural issue, not an individual question.

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What theory are you talking about? Gender is only an academic concept.

Domestic and sexual violences in a lot of families is massive and violent.

Gender based stereotypes are limiting the individual identities and diversity, not the contrary.

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Feminism is a political movement looking for equality between men and women, not to invert the domination

No one here is against men, but looking for equality, no more no less

« Going too far » : what do you mean ?

It is not a question of discrimination; women do not want to be involved in politics/ projects/media.

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Women can do it if they are given the opportunity to do so and if the atmosphere is not hostile towards their participation

it is difficult for newcomers to enter bodies where the same group of persons has been working together for decades, because newcomers challenge existing habits and are not always welcome.

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Gender equality is a human right recognised by several international conventions to which each Council of Europe member state is committed (e.g. CEDAW, Council of Europe standards)

culture and traditions cannot be used to breach legal and policy commitments towards gender equality and human rights.
