#### 5. TRAVEL TO / FROM PORTUGAL

Travel expenses of some participants will be covered by the Council of Europe in conformity with Council of Europe's rules. Please ask the Secretariat whether your travel is covered (or not) by the Council of Europe.

#### 6. MEALS

Coffee breaks will be provided by Policia Judiciária.

Lunch expenses will be borne by each participant. However, lunch at the canteen of the facilities costs 6 euros (approx.).

#### 7. TRANSPORT TO / FROM THE AIRPORT

Lisbon airport (Humberto Delgado Airport) is situated 20 minutes from the city centre, and it has an efficient public transportation network (metro, bus, taxi).

And in order use public transportation there is the need to purchase the Lisbon Navegante card that can be conveniently purchased at several locations throughout Lisbon, ensuring easy access for residents and visitors.

- Metro Stations: Most metro stations in Lisbon have ticket offices or vending machines where you can buy the Navegante Card. This is often the most straightforward option for travellers arriving by metro from the airport or other parts of the city.
- 2. Carris Outlets: Carris is the main bus and tram operator in Lisbon, and their customer service centres or kiosks at significant transportation hubs usually sell the Navegante Card.
- 3. **CP Stations**: If you're arriving in Lisbon by train, the CP (Comboios de Portugal) stations also offer the Navegante Card for sale, making it convenient to purchase your card as soon as you arrive in the city.
- 4. **Authorized Retailers**: Various shops, newsstands, and convenience stores across the city are authorized to sell the Navegante Card. Look for the "Navegante" logo displayed at the entrance or counter of these establishments.
- 5. **Online**: While the physical card needs to be purchased in person, some services allow you to top up or add specific passes to your existing Navegante Card online using your credit card, offering convenience for those who prefer digital transactions.

It's worth noting that the Navegante Card costs a nominal fee (0,50€), and you'll need to load it with **credit or specific travel passes**, depending on your needs.

Once purchased, the card is valid for unlimited trips within your chosen Pass's designated zones and duration.

#### **METRO**



The metro entrance can be fund when you exit the airport very easy to identify by its colour red. The Lisbon Airport has a Metro (subway) station with a direct line to the city centre. The 'Aeroporto – Saldanha' line takes you to downtown Lisbon in about 20 minutes. The Metro network will allow you to move around the city at ease. It is a quick and inexpensive way to get around, plus you'll get to see Lisbon's subway stations – each with its own theme and décor.

#### Tariff Metro Lisbon:

- 1.80€ valid for unlimited journeys on "Carris" (Bus network) and Lisbon metro Networks, for 60 minutes following the first validation.
- 6.80€ Unlimited travel for 24H (Including Trams and Buses).

#### Running Hours:

- The Metro operating Hours are from 6:30am to 1am on the following day.
- Is it possible for the people to find a train service Through Lisbon in every 6 to 9 minutes.

#### BUS

Several bus lines stop at the airport arrivals terminal, taking you to different parts of the city. However, please note that the maximum baggage size allowed in these buses is 50x40x20cm. If your baggage exceeds this size, you must take the airport's specific buses (Aerobus and Airport Shuttle).

Fare (on-board): €1.80

You must purchase the "Navegante" electronic travel card, which you can then top up with balance for your journeys, which can be used both for the Metro and for "Carris" (bus network):

Single Fare Price: €1.4524H Network Pass: €6.30
