Dear friends,

The Hansa, Cultural Route of the Council of Europe, Region Gotland and the European Institute of Cultural Routes are pleased to invite you to the Training Academy in Visby, Sweden 4-7 June 2019.

Gotland, the largest island in the Baltic Sea, sits around 90 kilometers off the south-eastern coast of Sweden and 130 km from the Baltic States. Gotland is an island full of contrasts, an exciting destination with fabulously beautiful scenery, exotic culture and 800 km of coast. An island with a fascinating history and an unusual flora. The countryside is varied, with everything from desolate heaths to lush meadows, spectacular cliffs and sandy beaches. Long, rolling horizons, giant rocks and untouched forests.

Gotland's history, beauty and unique nature attracts visitors from all over the world.

The Hanseatic town of Visby

Gotland's central location in the Baltic has had a great influence on its exciting history. The Hanseatic town of Visby is a UNESCO World Heritage site since 1995 because of its unique cultural values. As a former Viking site, Visby became the main trade hub for the Hanseatic League in the Baltic Sea between the 12th and the 14th century. Its 13th-century city wall in all 3,5 km long, medieval church ruins, warehouses and wealthy merchant homes from the same period make it the best preserved fortified commercial trade town in Northern Europe.

Gotland is well known for its high food standards and fine ingredients, Visby has been called Sweden's most restaurant dense city and is proud to be home to some of the country's best restaurants.

HISTORY IN SHORT

Membership of the Hansa made the town rich and Visby developed during the thirteenth century into one of the most magnificent towns in the Baltic region. The townscape was distinctive for its imposing stone houses. Foreign merchants, craftsmen, seafarers, and people in the service of the church came here, so that Visby became a meeting place for different cultures. The German influence was to affect the life and appearance of the town. Almost 200 stone buildings from the Middle Ages are preserved in whole or part, a striking proportion of them showing features of Romanesque style. In several places in the town, multi-storey trading houses still stand with their stately stepped gables, high cellars and facade decoration in Gothic style. Another typical feature of the town is the wooden architecture of the seventeenth and eighteenth centuries, with houses built in half-timbering or of horizontal beams slotted into uprights. Many of these houses also have interiors painted with great artistry.

Churches and ruins

The Christian church was an important part of life in the Middle Ages. More churches were built in Visby than in any other town in Sweden. Within the city wall there were thirteen known church buildings. Some of them were parish churches, while others belonged to monasteries or were built by the foreign trade guilds of the Hanseatic town. After the waning of the medieval economic boom and in the wake of the Reformation, all the churches except St Mary's, the present-day cathedral, were left to their fate. St Mary's, originally built for the German population of the town, but was already from the inauguration in 1225 used both by the German and by the local parish. The church was rebuilt in Gothic style in the fourteenth century.

The ring-wall/town wall

Visby is surrounded by an unusually well-preserved defensive wall. It is about 3,5 km long and 11 m high. It was built to ward off foreign invaders, but it probably also served to emphasize the independence of the town from the surrounding countryside. The construction of the wall began in the mid-twelfth century, it was built of limestone, with an outer and an inner face enclosing an inner mixture of rubble and mortar. The wall has three main gates and over fifty towers.

TRAVEL

There are several travel options between Visby and the Swedish mainland provided by BRA flyg, Scandinavian Airlines and the ferry company Destination Gotland. The ferry takes just three hours and a flight from Stockholm takes around 40 minutes.

When flying Scandinavian Airlines please not the possibility to book combi-tickets!

Flights

There are many daily flights between Stockholm and Gotland via Bromma and Arlanda airports. There are also flights all year round from Gothenburg and Malmö.

Ferry

Ferries to Visby depart from Nynäshamn, 60 km south of Stockholm; buses timed to ferry departures leave from Cityterminalen in Stockholm. Tickets for both the bus and ferry can be booked through www.destinationgotland.se. Cars can be taken on the ferry and it is of course also possible to rent a car once you get to Gotland. The crossing takes 3 hours and 15 minutes.

A southern ferry line departs from Oskarshamn (province Småland) with the same on-board facilities. This crossing takes 3 hours and 10 minutes.

Registration of participants

The fee to be paid is EUR 100 for representatives of Certified Cultural Routes and EUR 130 for all other participants.
