EU Statistics on crime and criminal justice

Anne Clemenceau EUROSTAT

- The Commission established the Action Plan 2006-2010 to develop a comprehensive and coherent EU strategy to measure crime and criminal justice
- The 2009 Stockholm Programme reiterated the need for "adequate, reliable and comparable statistics" on crime and criminal activities
- In 2012, a new Action Plan covering the 2011-2015 period underlined the strategies to be adopted in order to improve the collection of crime statistics.
- First data collection thereof, with the reference year 2005, was organised in 2007.

- Coordination was set-up with the UN Office on Drug and Crime (UNODC) to collect data through the United Nations Surveys on Crime Trends and the Operations of Criminal Justice Systems (UN-CTS).
- 2014 was the first joint Eurostat/UNODC statistical data collection on crime and criminal justice
- In addition to the information required by UNDOC, some data are also collected for specific areas of interest to the European Commission
- The UN-CTS collection and consequently also the Eurostat data collection are updated and revised constantly, ensuring consistency of the data over time

 The data on criminal offences published by Eurostat are classified according to the crime categories defined in the International Classification of Crime for Statistical purposes (ICCS)

- The basic data providers are several different public authorities, such as the police, prosecution, courts, and prisons.
- The National Statistical Office coordinate the data provision, though in some countries it is the Police or a Ministry



- Most common crimes are regulated by national law and covered by national statistics. When a crime is regulated by EU law, it is often mandatory for the member states to provide data
- Crime data are aggregate figures from administrative sources
- The data and metadata are voluntary collected and agreed at the yearly working group meeting
- They cover EU Member States, EFTA countries, Candidate Countries and potential Candidate Countries.

- Recording, reporting and production system;
- National crime definitions and international statistical definitions;
- Statistical unit and statistical population;
- Statistical definitions, reference times,
- Counting methods and calculation methods;




Products from the regular data


- Eurobase, statistical web database, user-defined tables and output files. https://ec.europa.eu/eurostat/web/crime/data/database
