a resource for sustainable development and quality of life in a constantly evolving society.

Cultural heritage as a sharing responsibility

develop the frameworks which make possible joint action by public authorities, experts, owners, investors, businesses, non-governmental organisations and civil society.

Respect for a diversity of interpretations and establishment of processes for conciliation.

Commons // sustainable economy

The conservation of cultural heritage and its sustainable use have human development and quality of life as their goal.

Cooperation // democracy

Recognising individual and collective responsibility towards cultural heritage and developing innovative ways to co-operate

Who is involve in the Faro process? // producers

An active civil society, facilitators, political players, public institutions, profit and non-profit private sector.

How does it work? // production

A common vision of heritage, a willingness to cooperate, a common interest, a capacity to act.

What does it produce? // products

Diverse narratives, new socio-economic models, implementation of human rights, democratic participation and social inclusion.
