- their evolution throughout three centuries of European history.



Routes of Reformation objektives


- To highlight and raise awareness of the unifying character of the Reformation and its heritage, as well as the long-lasting and far-reaching impacts of its legacy across Europe;

- To support European integration.






















Activity Highlights
