


- Examination of 16

- Several sites do not comply with their reporting obligations for several years = small feedback
- Setting a scoring systems




- In 2018, 12 on-thespot appraisal visits to areas whose ED is due in 2019
- A check-list to help independent experts to structure their assessment reports agreed





 Reshufflling the ED website with the creation of the dashboard bringing together the application files, the annual reports, the awards, the awards on-the-spot appraisal visit reports


