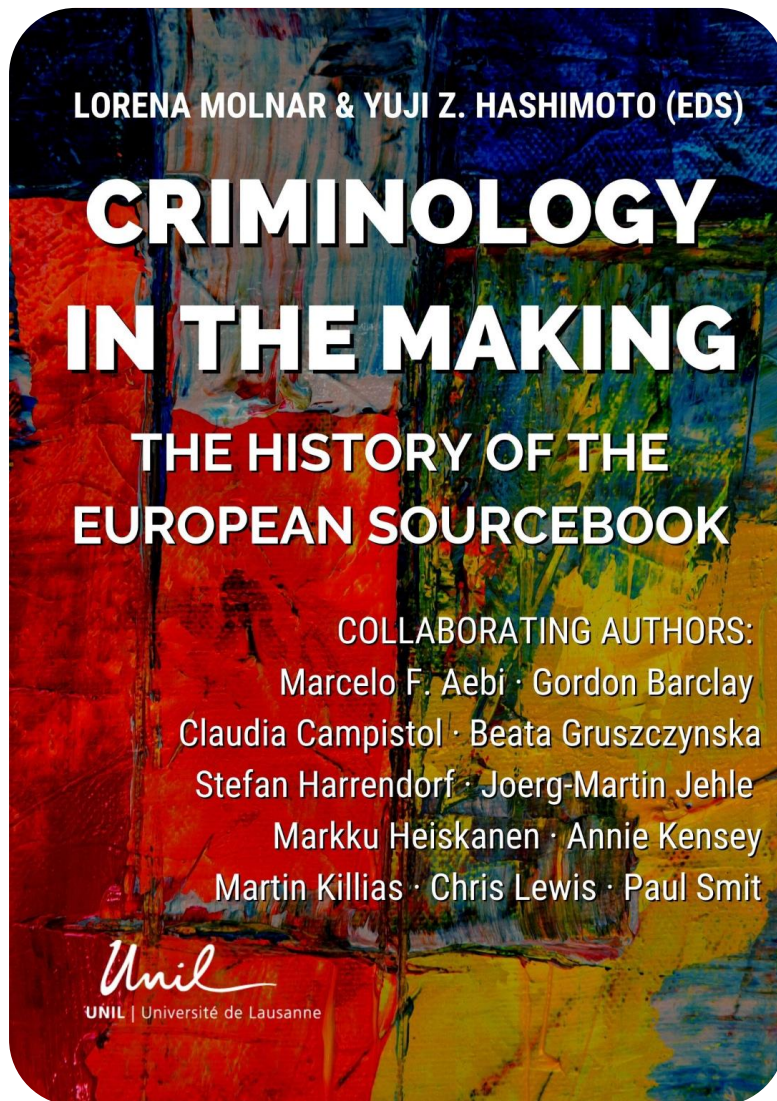
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# Context

- Core team of the European Sourcebook (ESB)
- **Aim:** to study the evolution of the ESB through time and space
- **ESB assets:**
  - International project composed by scholars and practitioners
  - Time series (1990-2016)
  - Methodological focus
  - Contribution to science – open access data



## ***(Meta)criminology***

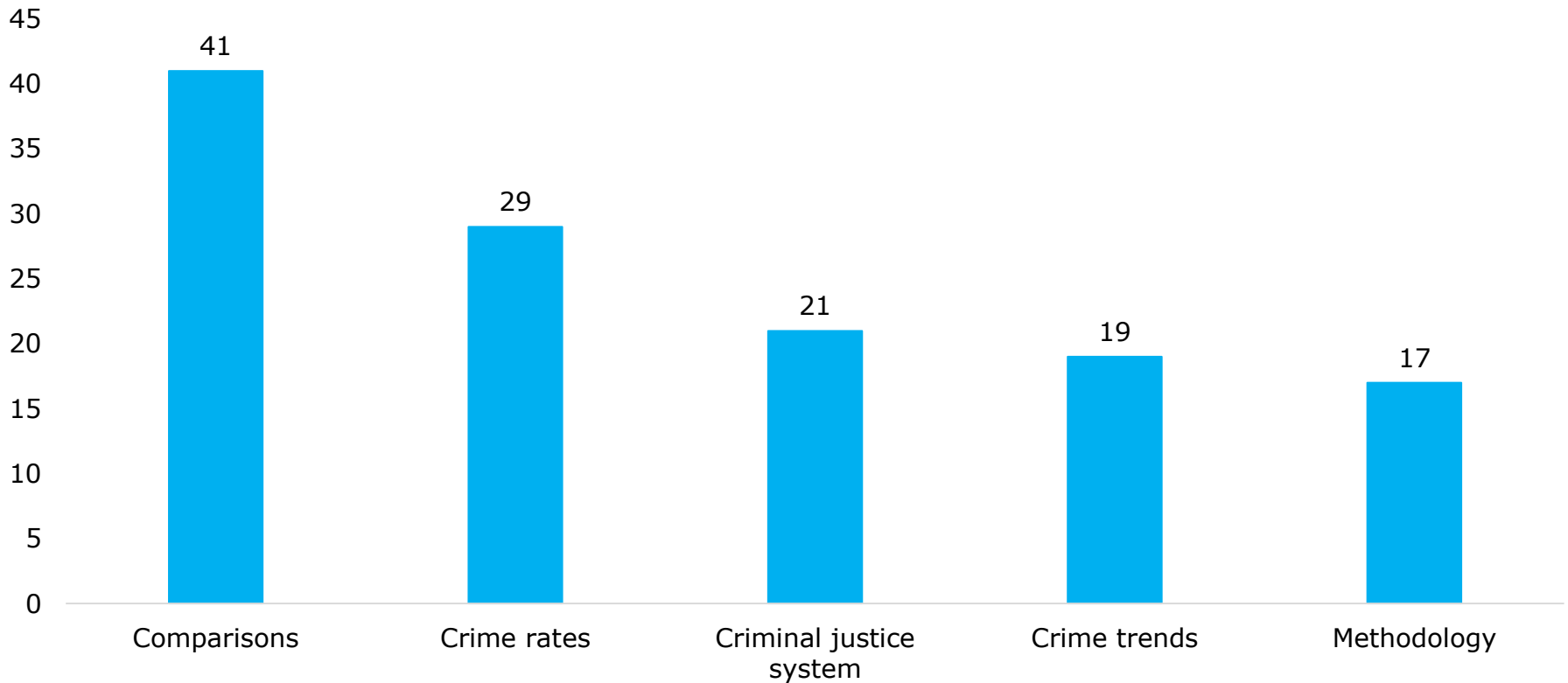
- Eleven key scholars.
- Topics:
  - The internal functioning of an international project
  - Methodological and logistic challenges
  - Views on the ESB
  - Impact on academia/policy

# Methodology

- *Sampling:*
  - Collection of the views of ESB's authors
  - Collection of publications (N=80) which used the data of the ESB for their analyses
- *Analysis:* Content analysis of the title and abstract of the publication and of the essay of each author

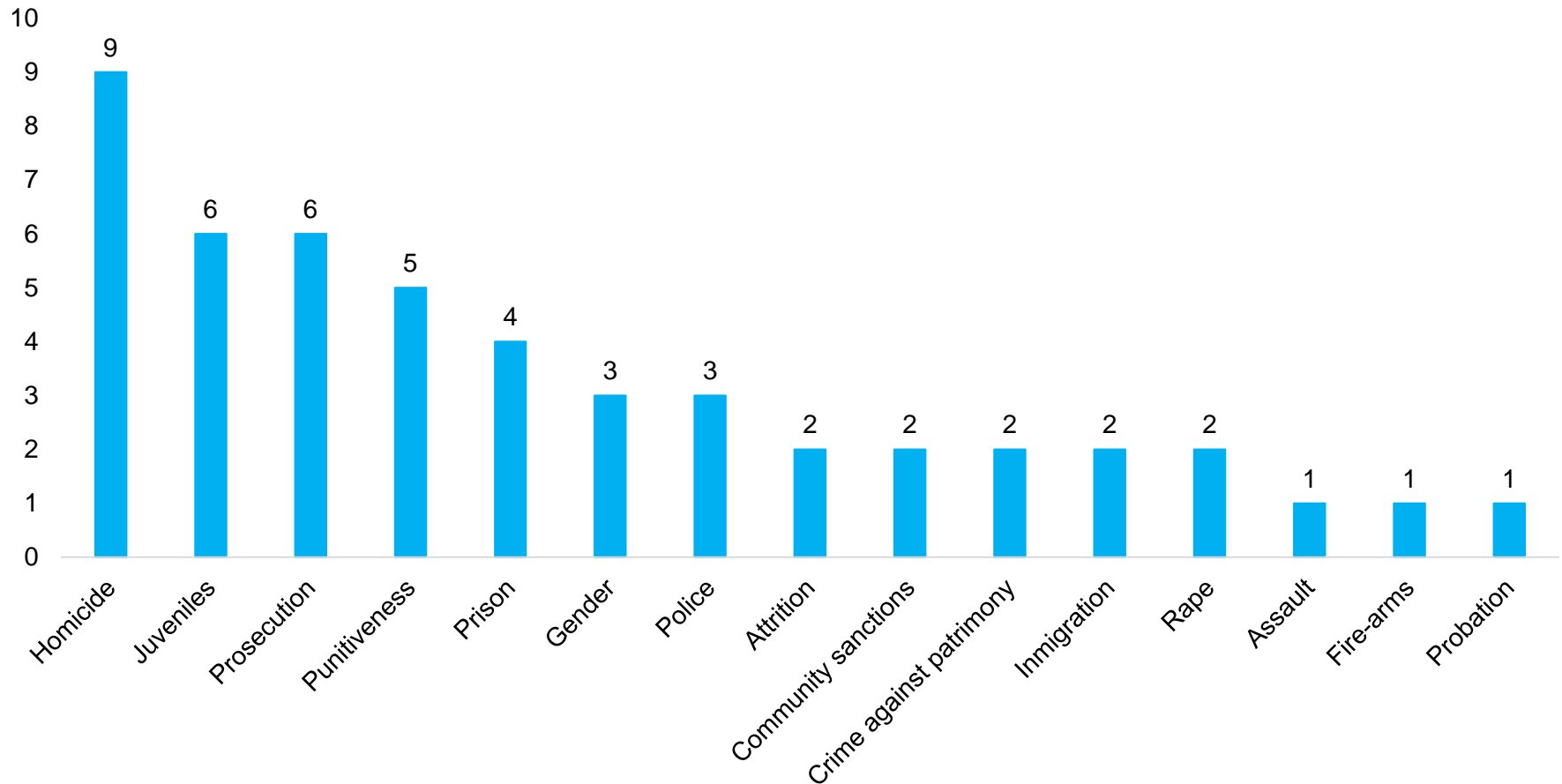
# Results: Most recurrent topics (1)

European	49
Sub-European	11
European countries	17

# Results: Impact

- ESB 2014 cited 205 times.
- Overall, all 80 articles were cited approx. 2,500 times.

## Contributions

- Overview of the criminal justice system
- Methodological guideline
- Data source
- Development of other projects
- Teaching
- Trend analysis

## Challenges

- Late publication
- Needs expert knowledge
- Complicated to change institutional practices



# Conclusion

- **ESB has had a positive impact in research.**
  - ✓ **Influential in comparative research, crime trends analyses, and methodological standardisation.**
  - Unclear influence in the methodology of national statistics institutes.
- Potential for further exploration on understudied topics:
  - Sex differences, specific offences, immigration, cybercrime, national victimisation surveys.
  - Rates/trends unexplored at a country-level.
  - Trends on a longer time series.
