



Policy & Governance

- Sound policy and effective governance need each other
- SDGs 1-15 are mainly policy,
 SDGs 16+17 are mainly governance
- Policy gives the direction but to get things done, "ultimately, it's all about governance"









- In times of polycrisis, maybe even permacrisis, PA and Governance (PAG) must combine 'fast' crisis management and 'slow' complexity governance.
- That is difficult now, because the crisis-focus pulls away many resources from complexity governance, and partially undermines it: crisis management works:
 - without stakeholders
 - without parliaments
 - without the best available evidence
 - with neglect of the long-term
 - with limitless funding



I hope that the work of the Committee/Working group on Green PA can stimulate a PA which:

- Actively supports environmental/climate sustainability through just transitions and respecting planetary boundaries, against the background of the wider SDG Agenda of the UN.
- 2. Has a balanced set of tools and mechanisms, to mix what is needed: capacity for collaboration is important, but capacity for maintaining rule of law (and for making laws...) also, etc.
