



The Council of Europe

Pan-European intergovernmental organisation: 46 member states + 5 observers + other partners



3 pillars: democracy, human rights and the rule of law 224 legal treaties (hard core law) recommendations to member States (soft law) developed support system to member States

What is a Partial Agreement?

- A special programme of the Council of Europe
- Own budget, programme and working methods
- Choice of member States to join









The Board of Coordination

- 8 governmental representatives of member states
- 8 members of the European Youth Card Association



- 1 representative appointed by the Advisory Council on Youth
- Oversees the programme of activities, implemented in co-operation with EYCA





The Partial Agreement on Youth Mobility through the Youth Card

- Open Partial Agreement
- Member states: Andorra, Armenia, Austria, Azerbaijan, Bosnia and Herzegovina, Bulgaria, Croatia, Cyprus, Finland, Greece, Hungary, Ireland, Luxembourg, Malta, Moldova, Montenegro, The Netherlands, North Macedonia, Portugal, Romania, San Marino, Serbia, Slovakia, Slovenia, Switzerland







YOUTH MOBILITY

 Created in 1991, unanimously supported by the Conference of Ministers responsible for youth held in Lisbon in 1990



- Committee of Ministers' Resolution ResAP(1991) revised in 2003 as Resolution ResAP(2003)1
- The Statute: "The Partial Agreement shall be aimed at developing the Youth Card scheme, particularly at European level in the best interests of young people [...] with a view to facilitating their mobility as well as their access to the various goods and services necessary for their personal and cultural development."








YOUTH MOBILITY

Aims

- Development of the European Youth Card Scheme
- Development of inter-governmental co-operation in the field of youth mobility and related issues









First aim: European Youth Card Scheme

- Anyone under 35
- Access to advice, discounts and benefits
- In the fields of mobility, accommodation, culture, language courses, services and products
- Both on-line and off-line
- In one own's country and in Europe







Second aim: Better youth policies developed with & for Governments

- Cater to the interests and needs
- Generate and mobilise knowledge
- Share best practices
- Offer policy solutions









Added value of being a member of the PA

- PA membership provides the possibility of giving a European dimension to national youth policies;
- PA membership increases opportunities for young people to be part of the European community of 7 min card users;
- PA membership helps to **keep members updated with youth policy issues**. Public authorities can follow and be part of all relevant European initiatives beneficial to young people ("access to events, to expertise, to research in respect of youth mobility");
- Major benefits include networking, promotion and facilitation of mobility for all youth within Europe (particularly outside the EU but not only);
- The PA seminars increase the capacity-building of staff working on the youth card;
- Policymakers obtain real and direct feedback from young card-holders across Europe on various issues - this helps to be proactive in youth policy development;
- An inexpensive programme, good value for money.



Young people make informed decisions and challenge misinformation

Be Empowered

Young people are empowered to exercise their rights as system changers, influence decision-making, and share power both locally and nationally.

Young people have increased opportunities to express their views and participate in decision-making processes, locally and nationally.



Young people are more confident about being system changers, influencing decision-making and sharing power.

The Young Scot National Entitlement Card

Young people in Scotland are entitled to their free smart-enabled Young Scot National Entitlement Card (Young Scot NEC) that connects them to opportunities and services.

The Young Scot NEC is available to young people aged 11- 26 and can be used for:

- Free proof of age
- Free bus travel for under 22's
- Other transport concessions
- School lunch card
- In store discounts
- E-voting and participatory budgeting





Under 22s Bus Travel

Over 800,000 young people in Scotland have a Young Scot NEC

More than 100 million free bus journeys have been made since the introduction of free bus travel for under 22s

Young people have told us the impact this has on them:

"The free bus travel has significantly helped me get to college and back, saving me over £15 a week for bus travel and even lets me see my friends in other villages/towns for free!"



Participatory Budgeting

- PB voting allows young people to be involved in decisions around budgets that affect them
- Voting is based on a young person logging in to the Young Scot voting platform with their unique Young Scot NEC number
- Young Scot supports our partners in many different ways, including by:
 - Delivering workshops with young people and local staff
 - Using our website to showcase the vote
 - Running targeted information campaigns encouraging local young people to participate
 - Offer incentives for taking part with our Young Scot Rewards Programme



Participatory Budgeting - Case Study, Renfrewshire 2020

Aim: Empower young people of Renfrewshire to use Young Scot's PB platform to have their say on how a fund for youth projects should be spent

The Vote:

- All young people aged 12-25 in the area were eligible to vote
- Young people were targeted via their school platform and youth work organisations
- Young people accessed Young Scot's e-voting platform using their NEC number

Impact:

- Over 1,700 young people took part in the vote
- 68 projects received funding
- Young people were able to express their voice and influence decision making in their local area




Young Scot Membership

Young Scot Membership is our home for Rewards, online discounts and bespoke entitlements.

Our Young Scot Membership programme encourages young people to be active citizens by rewarding them for taking part in positive activities.

Young people aged 12 – 25 are invited to become a Young Scot Member, using their Young Scot National Entitlement Card to create and verify their account.

130,470 Members currently signed up

Young people can earn points for taking part and engaging with positive activities such as:





We offer three types of rewards:

Claim - exchange points for a small reward item or voucher

Win - use points to enter a competition to win a more valuable item

Apply - answer application questions for a chance to take part in a money-can't-buy opportunity or experience


Discounts


Young Scot discounts help young people make the most of their money, while increasing their awareness of local, national and European products and services.

Young people take advantage of discounts with nearly 400 partners in 919 in-store locations, 165 online and in-store and 80 online only discounts.

While using their Young Scot Discounts, young people have been able to:

- Save over half a million pounds every year at a national grocery store
- Over 10k have visited Historic Sites in Scotland
- Over £17k was saved by Young Scot Members at a local bakery business









Discounts

- Allow Young Scot Members to access local and relevant, opportunities that connect them to their communitites
- We work with Young Scot Members to acquire discounts they request in their local areas
- Young Scot Members can also access thousands of discounts in over 36 countries across Europe

Be Empowered Free Bikes Programme Panel 2022/23

Aim:

- Partnership with Transport Scotland, Scottish Government's national transport agency, to deliver the Free Bikes Programme Panel 2022/23
- The panel was made up of 16 young people who were asked to explore an Access to Bikes programme providing bike access for all school aged young people

The Project:

- The young people used our co-design and volunteer process, YSHive, to develop recommendations for how this programme could be improved and benefit a diverse range of young people
- In 2023 they presented their their final recommendations to the Transport Scotland Free Bikes Board and published their final report
- These recommendations include themes around: the bigger picture, bike types and sizes, bike accessories, maintenance and storage, and collection and delivery



Be Empowered Free Bikes Programme Panel 2022/23

Outcome:

- Transport Scotland commissioned national organisation, Cycling Scotland, to deliver the Access to Bikes programme in 2023 and they actioned many aspects of the Panel's recommendations, despite budgetary constraints
- Cycling Scotland wanted to thank the young people for their hard work and gave them free tickets to attend the Cycling World Championships BMX Racing Finals in summer 2023
- Young Scot has been able to continue championing the young people's recommendations through the Cycling Scotland Advisory Board which developed from the partnership work on this project
















Strategic Development Program of the EYCA Card in Montenegro (2022-2024)

A strategic document adopted in December 2022 at the session of the Government of Montenegro, with the aim of further developing and implementing policies focused on improving the living conditions and social status of youth in Montenegro.

The document consists of:

- The analysis of the current situation (employment, internships and volunteering, youth mobility and information, digitalization...);
- National, international, and legal framework for the development of the EYCA card in Montenegro;
- Financial framework;
- Action plan for the period 2022-2024 and implementation of over 50 annual activities.

Next step: Strategic Development Program of EYCA Card in Montenegro (2025-2028)


