The Council of Europe Convention for the Protection of the Profession of Lawyer is the first international legally binding instrument to place the protection of the profession of lawyer at the heart of respect for the rule of law. Lawyers play an instrumental role in ensuring effective access to justice for all. The action of professional associations is also crucial to protect the individual and collective rights and interests of the lawyers so that they can practise free from hinderance. The convention is here to respond to increasing reports of attacks on lawyers that prevent them from fulfilling their necessary role in fully functioning justice systems that constitute an essential feature of any democracy.

For more than two years, the Committee of Experts on the Protection of Lawyers (CJ-AV), under the responsibility and guidance of the European Committee on Legal Co-operation (CDCJ), worked on a balanced and forward-looking text. This was made possible by the constructive contributions of representatives of ministries of justice, the legal profession, international professional associations, and international organisations.

The convention was adopted by the Committee of Ministers on 12 March 2025 and opened for signature on 13 May 2025 during the Committee of Ministers' session that closed the Presidency of Luxembourg. The convention can not only be signed and ratified by the member states of the Council of Europe but also be acceded to by non-member states, giving it a global reach.

To mark this significant step forward in the protection of the rights and safety of lawyers, and thus in the protection of the very foundation of the rule of law, the CDCJ is organising a conference that will bring together distinguished speakers and stakeholders who have played a role in the elaboration of the convention.
