Context

The European Union-Council of Europe Joint Project <u>"Strengthening child friendly justice through effective cooperation and coordination among different Barnahus-type services in the regions of Spain" is implemented by the Council of Europe in close collaboration with the Ministry of Youth and Childhood during the period of 06/07/2022-31/10/2024. It is co-financed by the EU Structural Support Reform Programme. Barnahus is a leading European model for a child-friendly multidisciplinary and interagency response to child sexual exploitation and abuse.</u>

The project is divided into two main components:

- Improving the legislative and policy framework to introduce the Barnahus model in Spanish regions;
- Strengthening capacities of relevant professionals.

In November 2023, an assessment of the existing legal and policy framework at national and regional level ("mapping study") was published, with the aim to define existing practices and identify current challenges in Spain. As a result, a report containing recommendations on how to introduce the Barnahus model in Spain and its regions was published and disseminated among key stakeholders.

Besides, a <u>training needs analysis</u> was developed in the three pilot regions (Extremadura, Cantabria and Comunidad Foral de Navarra) to ensure that the capacities of professionals working with and for children can be strengthened in line with the Barnahus model's standards. A training for 90 frontline professionals working for and with children on "how to manage the suspicion of violence that comes from the testimonies of children" was launched on 17 October. In addition, the HELP course on child-friendly justice has been adapted for justice operators and forensic staff and has trained more than 70 professionals.

The project is currently developing a national and regional Roadmaps to implement Barnahus in Spain and its autonomies and a Communication Guide to enhance communication amongst national and regional authorities regarding the Barnahus model, as well as communication with children, children's access to child-friendly information, and roles and responsibilities of stakeholders in providing such information. A child consultation process took place in September 2024 with the National Council for Child Participation (CEPIA) to incorporate children's views into these two key deliverables and an illustrator has drawn a concept map with children's views. Child-friendly materials have been designed to this end. Children from the CEPIA will participate in the Conference.

The event will be an excellent opportunity to present these two key deliverables, to celebrate the achievements of the project and to present its concrete results along with the next steps for their implementation, in the presence of representatives of the Ministry of Youth and Childhood, the European Union, Council of Europe, regional high-level representatives, other national stakeholders, members of the academia, as well as national and international experts. It will also create the necessary momentum to reconfirm the commitment of the country and the project partners to continue implementing the results through project Phase II.
