

Project objective: Project aimed at contributing to harmonise national legislation and practices in the field of biomedicine and healthcare with the European human rights' and ethical standards in the field of biomedicine preparing Armenia to join the Council of Europe Oviedo Convention.

The Achievements of the Project

Armenia signed the Council of Europe Oviedo Convention on Human Rights and Biomedicine on 16 May 2024.

Harmonisation of national legislation with the European standards enshrined in the Oviedo Convention.



Contribution to the Development and Improvement of the Legal Framework

- Draft laws on "Comprehensive health insurance system" and "Individual licensing of healthcare professionals"
- By-laws, including draft of the Government decree on "Professional compliance and qualification requirements of the General Director of the Comprehensive Health Insurance Fund and qualification procedure for candidates for the General Director" and Draft of the Government decree on "The form of the request for the release of medical equipment, the procedure for its completion and release" developed for the RA Law on "Comprehensive health insurance system"
- Recommendations on the law on "Reproductive health rights"
- Order N 262-N of the Minister from 19 August 2024 on approving the procedure of "The implementation" of providing information to the population about the meaning of organ and tissue transplantation, donation prerequisites and other issues related to transplantation, as well as the right to disagree to act as a cadaver donor, the right of cadaver donor family members to give consent"
- By-laws for the law on "Medical Care and Assistance to the Population"

Contribution to the implementation of National Human Rights Action Plan 2023-2025

- Manual on Medical Secret and Confidentiality has been developed in line with the European Standards in accordance with the 5.5 Activity of the Action Plan.
- Report on the European best practices with regard to regulation of non-consensual treatment with a specific focus on the right to access to justice, as well as package of draft laws on "Amendments and Additions to the Civil Procedure Code"; on "Additions to the Law on Mental Health Services and Servicing"; on "Amendments and Additions to the Law on State Duty" have been developed in accordance with the 3.12 Activity of the Action Plan.

Contribution to the execution of the judgments of European Court of Human Rights

An extensive report on the "Analysis of domestic legal framework and practice on the restriction of legal capacity of persons with mental health issues: Execution of the European Court of Human Rights judgement Nikolyan vs. Armenia" was published, providing recommendations for national authorities on proper assessment of legal capacity, establishment of tailor-made restrictions of legal capacity, review of restrictions of legal capacity, improvement of quardianship and trusteeship system in Armenia, and contributing to execution of the European Court of Human Rights judgment "Nikolvan vs. Armenia".

Supporting to the Establishment and Functioning of the **Ethics Committee for Healthcare Professionals**

- Ethics committee successfully examines the cases of possible violations of code of conduct of healthcare
- Regulatory and operational framework of the Ethics Committee has been developed and approved by the Minister of Health of the Republic of Armenia.
- Members of the Ethics Committee enhanced their capacity and exchanged the international best practices of France, Sweden, Malta and Italy.
- Members of the Ethics Committee took part in the 31st, 32st and 33st NEC Forums discussing ethical issues and sharing best practices of other European countries. Website of the Ethics Committee for healthcare professionals has been developed (www.mec.am)

Capacity-Building Activities for Healthcare and Legal Professionals

Improved capacities on the Oviedo Convention and its Additional Protocols;

Strengthened capacities and skills on public debate and health issues;

Gained knowledge on ethical rules for healthcare professionals and functioning of the Ethics Committee for healthcare professionals.



Public Dialogue on Health Issues Increased

The Guide to Public Debate in Human Rights and Biomedicine translated, adapted, and disseminated.

The Guide to Health Literacy for Equitable Access to Health Care translated and disseminated.

Expert discussion on the human rights issues in mental health services promoted the discussion within different stakeholders.

Expert-discussion on "Human Rights-based approaches to healthcare" marked the 75th anniversary of the adoption of the Universal Declaration of Human Rights and outlined the international human rights standards applicable to health care.

> Public debate around the principles of the Oviedo Convention advancing discussions and dialogue about the Convention among stakeholders and the broader public.

Discussion on the protection of rights of persons with mental health issues considered legally incapable, and contributing to the execution of the judgment of the European Court of Human Rights in the case "Nikolyan vs. Armenia"

> Pivotal discussion as a platform for exchange of ideas between the NA and MOH of the RA on reproductive health rights, as well as ethical and human rights aspects of early marriages

Joint discussions on the significance of full protection of the right to health in the framework of the reform agenda of the Government of Armenia in the field of healthcare system.

> Joint discussion on the importance of involving children in decision-making processes concerning their health

Around 150 refugee healthcare professionals Provision of essential mental health support and fostering overall recovery programmes.


