## 1. BACKGROUND AND PRIOR COOPERATION

## 1.1 Brief history of cooperation

Cooperation between the CoE and Morocco in the field of combating corruption and economic crime commenced in 2011 in the framework of the South Neighbourhood Anti-Corruption Project (Phase 1). Under SNAC 1 and the subsequent SNAC 2 Project, the ECCD accompanied and provided assistance to Moroccan authorities in strengthening the capacities of the anti-corruption authorities through assessments, legislative reviews and institutional capacity building. In 2014-2015 a comprehensive assessment of the Moroccan anti-corruption framework was carried out by SNAC, modelled on the methodology of the Group of States against Corruption (GRECO). The implementation of the recommendations stemming from the Assessment has been the objective of SNAC 2 and the current SNAC 3 Project.

On 21 March 2018 the Council of Europe's Committee of Ministers adopted the Neighbourhood Partnership with Morocco for 2018-2021, establishing the overarching framework of bilateral cooperation between the CoE and Morocco. In the field of anti-corruption, the partnership establishes the following priorities:

**Overall objective:** to promote good governance and the prevention of corruption, money laundering and terrorism

#### **Expected outcomes**

- **Expected outcome 1:** Morocco pursues implementation of the recommendations resulting from the diagnostic report on the anti-corruption framework;
- **Expected outcome 2:** Additional anti-corruption legislation is brought into line with the recommendations of the diagnostic report and European and international standards in this sphere;
- Expected outcome 3: The stakeholders in efforts to prevent and combat corruption receive support and have their capacities built, notably the future INPPLC and its main partners; these stakeholders participate actively in the Council of Europe networks linked with preventing and combating corruption;

- **Expected outcome 4:** Specific players, including in the areas of the environment and sport, benefit from modules to build their knowledge and capacities in anti-corruption efforts, on the basis of tools developed by the Council of Europe (manual for administrative anti-corruption investigations for example).

# 1.2 South Programme 3: "Towards Strengthened Democratic Governance in the Southern Mediterranean

In order to implement the above mentioned objectives the Council of Europe has commenced the implementation of the South Neighbourhood Anti-Corruption Project (SNAC 3 - Morocco)" building on the outcomes and achievements of the first and second phase of the South Programme implemented respectively in 2012-2014 and 2015-2018.

# 2. PROJECT ON PROMOTION OF GOOD GOVERNANCE: FIGHT AGAINST CORRUPTION AND MONEY-LAUNDERING (SNAC 3 - Morocco)

Under the SNAC 3 Project, the CoE will continue to support the authorities in promoting good governance and measures against corruption and money-laundering, improving the policy framework, operational capacities and the co-ordination of the relevant stakeholders in these fields.

Support to national authorities will be provided through specialist training in methods and special means of investigation for the judicial system and the law enforcement agencies.

The project will also help in strengthening institutional capacities to cooperate in the field of AML/CFT. Finally, the awareness and participation of media and private sector on how to counter corruption, including the tools available for citizens to report acts of corruption, will be disseminated, in order to promote a more active role of civil society in the fight against corruption and economic crimes.

The Expected results of SNAC 3 – Morocco have been adopted as part of the CoE - Morocco Neighbourhood Cooperation Objectives and are listed in the table below:
