Main objective and objectives	<p>The population of the Republic of Moldova benefits from improved human rights protection through increased capacity for the Supreme Court of Justice (SCJ) to deliver justice in line with European standards.</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none">1. The role and the capacity of the SCJ in ensuring uniform application of the law is enhanced through increased quality and coherence of its judicial decisions.2. The institutional capacity of the SCJ is increased through enhanced effectiveness.
Expected results	1.1. Judges and judicial assistants of the Supreme Court of Justice have the skills and capacity to address inconsistencies and ensure uniform application of the law through unification of the judicial practice.

	<p>1.2. The Registry of the Supreme Court of Justice has the capacity to assist the judges in the exercise of their functions in the harmonisation of judicial practice.</p> <p>1.3. Transparency and accessibility to the jurisprudence of the Supreme Court of Justice for legal professionals and general public is increased.</p> <p>2.1. The strategic institutional development priorities are set, regulation and working procedures are developed, assessed, and unified; clear working procedures and tools are introduced and implemented to increase the Court's effectiveness and quality of its work.</p> <p>2.2. The work of the Supreme Court of Justice is more transparent and visible to the legal professionals and general public.</p>
