### Background

The European Commission for the Efficiency of Justice (CEPEJ) was set up in 2002 to improve the quality and the efficiency of judicial systems in Europe and strengthen the confidence of court users in the judiciary. The CEPEJ develops measures and tools aimed at policy-makers and judicial practitioners.

The CEPEJ analyses the functioning of judicial systems and orientates public policies of justice. Every two years, it publishes the Evaluation report on judicial systems in Europe. The CEPEJ develops tools to promote the quality of the public service of justice, effective judicial time management and use of artificial intelligence and deployment of cyberjustice in the judiciary. The CEPEJ supports member States in their reforms on court organisation and provides a forum for discussion and exchanges of judicial practices across Europe.

### About the course

The online course was developed in 2023 and aims to present the CEPEJ's main tools and working methods to both judicial practitioners and the public at large. Through practical exercises, it shows how the tools can be applied in judicial systems to strengthen their quality and efficiency. The online course has been developed with contributions from several CEPEJ members and is the result of cooperation between the CEPEJ and <u>Human Rights Education for Legal Professionals (HELP)</u> Secretariats of the Council of Europe.
