

• 1137 responses in English


137 responses in French

#### **English usage by residence**























#### 2012 (above):

2015 functionally similar, 10% increase in smart phone use




2015 functionally similar, from home (78%z down) Everywhere, anywhere (53.1% *Up*)









# Have you ever felt personally threatened or offended by online hate speech?




