Report of the 13th meeting

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Agenda item 1. Opening of the meeting and adoption of the agenda

The Committee of the Parties to the Council of Europe Convention on Preventing and Combating Violence against Women and Domestic Violence (hereinafter referred to respectively as "the Committee" and "the convention") held its 13th meeting on 5 and 6 December 2022 in Strasbourg, in hybrid format. It adopted the draft agenda of the meeting as it appears in document IC-CP(2021)OJ13prov and which is set out in Appendix I.

Agenda item 2. Administrative and budgetary information

The Executive Secretary informed the Committee about the special funds for the monitoring mechanisms that have allowed the Committee of the Parties to adopt nine recommendations this year. These funds have also allowed to fund two additional members of staff in the violence against women division. The Executive Secretary also updated the Committee on the changes in the secretariat staff.

Furthermore, voluntary contributions have allowed the secretariat to carry out other activities in addition to GREVIO baseline evaluations, including, for example, round tables to follow up on findings issued by GREVIO to states that have already been evaluated. The Executive Secretary informed the Committee that such round-tables can be carried out in any state party that has undergone the evaluation procedure and made a call for interest to carry out similar initiatives.

Agenda item 3. State of signatures and ratifications of the Istanbul Convention

a) Action taken by member States of the Council of Europe towards ratification of the Istanbul Convention: tour de table

The Chair invited signatory states to share information on progress towards ratification. The representative of the Czech Republic informed the Committee about the unchanged situation since the last Committee meeting due to the lack of consensus at the political level. The representative of Latvia informed the Committee that there has been no progress towards ratification as a government has not yet been formed since the last elections.

b) Action taken by non-member States of the Council of Europe invited to accede to the Istanbul Convention: tour de table

Representatives of Kazakhstan and Israel took the floor to share information with the Committee regarding steps taken toward ratification. Israel informed the Committee that it hoped to be able to ratify the convention with the support of the new national government, while Kazakhstan informed the Committee about measures taken in the area of violence against women at the national level and asked the Committee to support their work aimed at countering disinformation on the Convention in the country.

c) Action taken by the European Union towards ratification of the Istanbul Convention: legislative developments

It was decided to address this item of the agenda at the next Committee meeting.

d) Declarations and reservations

The Executive Secretary informed the Committee that since its last meeting one state party, Germany, has withdrawn its reservations. Another state party, Switzerland, has decided to maintain them.

Agenda item 4. Exchange of views with Iris Luarasi, President of GREVIO

The President of GREVIO, Iris Luarasi, presented the work of GREVIO to the Committee, including the publication of GREVIO General Recommendation No. 1 on the digital dimension of violence against women. She informed the Committee about the elections of new GREVIO members to the Committee and the recent publication of nine baseline evaluation reports. She also explained that the evaluation procedures in respect of Ukraine and the United Kingdom have been launched and that the questionnaire for GREVIO's 1st thematic evaluation will be sent to the first group of state parties in early 2023.

Several delegations took the floor to thank Iris Luarasi and GREVIO for the invaluable work. In response to questions from delegations, Iris Luarasi provided further information about GREVIO's General Recommendation No. 1 on the digital dimension of violence against women and the selection process of GREVIO members.

Agenda item 5. Recommendations on the implementation of the Istanbul Convention

The Executive Secretary presented to the Committee statistics on the new recommendations on the implementation of the Istanbul Convention to be adopted by the Committee, and the existing trends.

The Chair introduced the draft recommendations of the Committee of the Parties on the implementation of the Istanbul Convention issued in respect of Germany, Bosnia and Herzegovina, Cyprus, Estonia, Georgia, Iceland, Norway, Romania and Switzerland. Representatives of each of the nine states parties thanked GREVIO for the findings and the analysis contained in the respective baseline evaluation reports, expressed the intention of their countries to implement the recommendations and gave examples of current efforts to implement the Istanbul Convention in their national contexts. Further to a request from the representative of Georgia, one recommendation issued in respect of Georgia was slightly reworded. The recommendations to Germany, Bosnia and Herzegovina, Cyprus, Estonia, Georgia, Iceland, Norway, Romania, and Switzerland were adopted by the Committee.

Agenda item 6. Exchange of views with Zita Gurmai, General Rapporteur on Violence against Women of the Parliamentary Assembly of the Council of Europe

Zita Gurmai shared the relevance of implementing the convention, as well as the use of technology to raise awareness. She also updated the Committee on the actions and initiatives of the Parliamentary Assembly of the Council of Europe and the role of the parliamentarians to incentivise the signature and ratification of the Convention.

Several delegations took the floor to thank Zita Gurmai. In response to questions from the delegations, Zita Gurmai spoke about the general backlash on gender equality and misinformation around the convention. She stressed the relevance of the convention in saving women's lives. Furthermore, several members of the Committee shared examples of how their respective Parliaments have contributed to the implementation of the convention at the national level.

Finally, the representatives of the state parties discussed developments in criminal legislations on sexual violence and rape and their alignment with Article 36 of the convention.

Agenda item 7. Election of Bureau members

The President proposed that the mandate of the Bureau be extended for one more year. No objection was raised.

Agenda item 8. Date of next meeting

The Committee decided to hold its next meeting on 1 June 2023.

Agenda item 9. Other business

No other business was raised.

Agenda item 10. Adoption of the list of decisions taken

The Committee adopted the list of decisions as set out in document IC-CP/Inf(2022)LD13.
