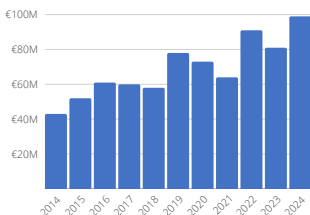

From 2014 to 2024, voluntary contributions more than **doubled**.



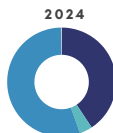
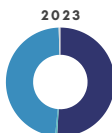
FUNDING SOURCES

The **European Union** remained our largest donor in 2024 while **Germany** was the largest bilateral donor. **39** of the 46 **member states** contributed in 2024.

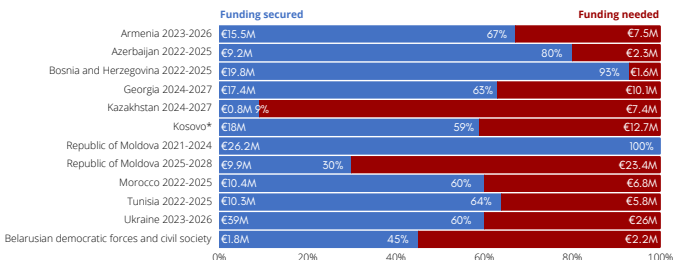
SPOTLIGHT 2024

Germany was the top bilateral donor in 2024 with a contribution of over €12 million.

As the **lead donor to the Council of Europe Action Plan for Ukraine 2023-2026** (€7 million), Germany plays a key role in supporting Ukraine's reform agenda and its path to a European future. In addition to their financial contribution, Germany has seconded **gender mainstreaming advisors**, strengthening the gender mainstreaming dimension of country-specific action plans. Germany is also a member of the **Human Rights Trust Fund (HRTF)**.
