






#### Clearance Rate by instance and by matter in 2022 (%)


#### Disposition Time by instance and by matter in 2022 (days)



#### 1. Judicial organisation in Romania (2022 data)

In Romania there are 4-court levels: first instance courts (judecatorii), tribunals (tribunale), courts of appeal (curti de apel) and the High Court of Cassation and Justice (HCCJ). First instance courts (judecatorii) have a general jurisdiction and most of the cases start at this level. The appeals against the decisions of the first instance courts in civil matters are decided at the tribunals. The appeals in criminal matters against the decisions of the first instance courts are decided at the courts of appeal. More important cases may start at tribunals or at the courts of appeal and the appeals against the decisions of these courts are decided by higher courts. It is noteworthy that, according to the law, in Romania there are two types of appeal: first appeal which is an appeal on the merits and second appeal which is an appeal on the law ("recurs").




In Romania there are 175 judecatorii, first instance courts of general jurisdiction.


The number of "judecatorii" has decreased by one between 2019-2020 because the activity of Judecătoria Insuratei was suspended so it no longer appears in the statistics. The number 175 represents the first instance courts with general jurisdiction, even if tribunals, courts of appeal and the High Court may also judge first instance cases.

Starting from 2020, the methodology of presentation of data changed and only "judecatorii" are counted as first instance courts of general jurisdiction.

It should also be mentioned that some of the first instance specialised courts share the location with "judecatorii".

The distribution between first instance general jurisdiction courts and first instance specialised courts in Romania is 95,6% - 4,4% (distribution tendency in EU: 72,8% - 27,2%).









According to 2022 data, the total number of professional judges sitting in courts (all instances) in Romania is 4 367, which is -4,9% less than in previous cycle.

More precisely, in Romania, there are 22,92 professional judges per 100 000 inhabitants (this figure is the same as the EU median of 22,92 judges per 100 000 inhabitants).

In this cycle, the total number of female professional judges (all instances) is 3 146, which represents 72,0% of the total number of judges.

The total number of judges is distributed among the different judicial instances in the following way: 1 996 are sitting in first instance courts (of which 1 421 are female); 2 271 are sitting in second instance courts (of which 1 648 are female) and 100 are sitting in Supreme Court (of which 77 are female).

Compared with the EU distribution of professional judges per instance, Romania has different distribution of judges among instances. While the percentage of first instance judges is well below the EU median, the percentage of second instance judges is more than twice the EU Median. Moreover, the percentage of Supreme court judges is below the EU median.

In Romania, there are four levels of courts (first instance courts, tribunals, courts of appeal and the High Court of Cassation and Justice). Only judges of the first instance court "judecatorii" are counted as first instance judges. Judges from tribunals and courts of appeal are included in the category "second instance professional judges", even if according to the procedural provisions in terms of competences tribunals may judge both as first and second instance court and for certain procedural circumstances (material and personal) even the courts of appeal may judge in first instance. Moreover, even the High Court can judge in first instance for example in criminal cases according to the personal competence rules of procedure.

As regards the distribution male/Female judges, it should be noticed that in Romania there is a very high percentage of female judges in all instances (71,2 % in first instance courts, 72,6% in second instance courts and 77,0% in Supreme courts).


In Romania, the distribution of judges per categories of cases is not possible since its statistical system does not collect information regarding a breakdown in the number of judges based on the different legal matters.

Distribution of court presidents by gender and by instance in Romania




In this cycle, the total number of female court presidents (all instances) is 132, which represents 58,9% of the total number of court presidents.

The total number of court presidents is distributed among the different judicial instances in the following way: 161 are sitting in first instance courts (of which 94 are female); 62 are sitting in second instance courts (of which 37 are female) and 1 female judge is sitting in the Supreme Court.

Against the background of the data provided for the last three evaluations, it is possible to define a constant trend of increase of the number of female court presidents. As the appointment in these positions is made following a competition where only judges can participate, the trend reflects the trend of the ratio between male judges and female judges in Romania.

In 2022, Romania has 11 071 non-judge staff. The total number of non-judge staff in comparison with the previous cycle reveals a decrease of -0,7%.

In 2022, the number of non-judge staff per 100 000 inhabitants has decreased (from 58,5 in 2021 to 58,1 in 2022).

During the same period, the number of judges per 100 000 inhabitants evolved from 24,1 judges per 100 000 inhabitants in 2021 to 22,9 in 2022.

In this cycle, the non-judge staff is broken down as follows:

- $\circ$  6 691 non-judge staff whose task is to assist the judges such as registrars;
- $\,{\scriptstyle \circ}\,$  1 666 staff in charge of different administrative tasks and of the court management;
- ∘ 1 664 technical staff;
- $\circ$  1 050 other;

The number indicated for the category "non-judge staff assisting judges" encompasses clerks with judicial tasks; the number indicated for "staff in charge of administrative tasks" concerns registering clerks, documentary clerks, statistician clerks, archivist clerks and public servants; the number indicated for "technical staff" includes IT staff, contractual personnel and other personnel (drivers, ushers, procedural agents etc.). The category "other" subsumes assistance magistrates, judicial assistants and probation counselors.

Assistance magistrates work only within the High Court of Cassation and Justice. They participate in the trial sessions, have a consultative vote in deliberations and write the minutes of the sessions, as well as the decisions.


Judicial assistants work only within tribunals and are part, together with the judges, of the panels which judge, in first instance, cases regarding labor and social insurances litigations (the panel is composed of 1 judge and 2 judicial assistants; the latter participate in the deliberations with a consultative vote and sign the decisions).

The probation counselors have, in principle, the following attributions: support the activity of judges by elaborating certain evaluation documents in criminal cases with juvenile offenders; support the activity of the judge delegated with enforcing decisions in criminal matters; cooperate with public institutions in order to execute the measure to force a minor to carry out an unpaid activity in an institution of public interest; initiate and carry on special programs of social reinsertion for persons convicted to prison and for minors who committed offences provided by the criminal law; carry out, at request, activities of individual counseling of offenders, with regard to the social, group and individual behavior; initiate and carry out special programmes of protection, social and judicial assistance of minors and youngsters who committed offences.

Professional judges and non-judge staff per 100 000 inhabitants, and their ratio




In Romania, there are 22,92 professional judges per 100 000 inhabitants (this figure is the same than the EU median of 22,92 judges per 100 000 inhabitants) and about 2,54 non-judge staff per judge.

There has been a small increase compared with previous cycle when this ratio was at 2,43 non-judge staff per judge.





In this cycle, the total number of Female prosecutors (all instances) is 1 139, which represents 51,5% of the total number of prosecutors.

The total number of prosecutors is distributed among the different judicial instances in the following way: 1 089 in first instance (of which 556 are female); 668 are in second instance (of which 366 are female) and 456 in final instance (of which 217 are female).

Since there is a four-level court system in Romania, the prosecution office services reflect this organisation (first instance courts, tribunals, courts of appeal and the High Court of Cassation and Justice). Prosecutors from prosecution offices of the tribunals and of the courts of appeal are included in the category "second instance professional prosecutors".

As a result, the distribution of the number of public prosecutors among the different judicial instances diverges from the EU median. Indeed, the first instance public prosecutors are well below the EU median and the percentage of second instance public prosecutors might be considered close to the EU median, although slightly higher. Finally, the number of Supreme court prosecutors is significantly higher than the EU median.


As regards the distribution Male/Female, it has to be specified that female public prosecutors prevail in the first and second instances (51,1% and 54,8%, respectively) and represent 47,6% of public prosecutors in Supreme court.





# Ratio between non-prosecutor staff and public prosecutors


Public prosecutors and non-prosecutor staff per 100 000 inhabitants, and their ratio




In 2022, there are 23 123 lawyers, which is -0,8% less than in 2021.

Romania has 121,4 lawyers per 100 000 inhabitants, which is lower than the EU median of 132,1 lawyers per 100 000 inhabitants.

In the European Union, the absolute gross salary for a judge at the beginning of career ranges from a minimum of 26 931€ to a maximum of 140 244€.

According to 2022 data, the absolute gross salary of a judge at the beginning of his/her career in Romania is 42 541€, which is rather below the EU median of 54 224€ (-22% below).

Compared with the annual average salary in the country, the salary for a judge at the beginning of his/her career is 2,9 times higher (the EU median is 1,9).

At the highest level, the range of the EU absolute gross salary for a judge is from 53 144€ to 261 648€. Romania's absolute gross salaries for judges at the highest level is -19% below the EU median of 106 533€.

For the public prosecutors, the range for the absolute gross salary at the beginning of career is from a minimum of 24 609€ to a maximum of 96 084€.

In 2022, the absolute gross salary of a public prosecutor at the beginning of his/her career in Romania of 42 541€ is slightly below the EU median of 48 728€ (-13% below ).

Compared with the annual average salary in the country, the salary for a public prosecutors at the beginning of his/her career is 2,9 times higher (the EU median is 1,7).

At the highest level, the minimum absolute gross salary for prosecutors in the European Union is 44 880€ and the maximum is 194 005€. Romania's absolute gross salaries for prosecutors at the highest level is -24% below the EU median of 87 247€.

There is no mechanism for calculating the compensation in Romania. The courts take into consideration the national case-law and the jurisprudence of the European Court of Human Rights in similar cases.

Even if the civil regulations of material and procedural law do not provide special mechanisms for the compensation of individuals in case of excessive duration of procedures and non-enforcement of judgments, there are norms guaranteeing the right to a fair trial and at case settlement within a reasonable time-limit. In such circumstances, there is a possibility to pay certain sums of money as fines or even as a compensation.

In criminal matters, the only possibility to obtain damages in case of procedural delays is the civil claim for damages, based on the provisions of the Civil Code. The Civil Procedure Code (the Law 134/2010) provides for a much more efficient mechanism to this effect, respectively the contestation concerning the protraction of the case settlement. Thus, according to Article 522 para. (1) of the CPC, any party, as well as the prosecutor attending the trial, may make contestation by which, invoking the infringement of the right to the settlement of the trial within an optimal and reasonable time-limit, he/she solicits the adoption of legal measures remedying to this situation.

The non-observance of judgments is incriminated as an offence by Art. 287 of the Criminal Code. Within the criminal trial, there may be also formulated the civil claim for damages for the non-enforcement of the judgment. The civil action may be also introduced separately, at the civil court. Both actions shall be judged according to the provisions of the Civil Code, regulating the delictual civil responsibility.

Illegal arrest and illegal conviction are situations circumscribed to judicial errors for which the Romanian state is responsible according to Art. 538-539 and the following of the Criminal Procedure Code (the Law 135/2010). For the appreciation in substance of the civil responsibility, common law rules laid down by the Civil Code apply. According to the provisions of the art. 538 of the Criminal Procedure Code, any person who suffered a wrongful condemnation or was, during a criminal trial, illegally deprived of his/her liberty is entitled to receive a compensation. The compensation should cover both the material and moral prejudices caused to that person. The amount of the compensation is to be determined by the court (the tribunal) in whose district the entitled person has its domicile. The entitled person should introduce a civil action against the state (which is represented by the Ministry of Public Finances), action which is exempted of any judicial fees.

Regarding the excessive duration of the criminal procedures, there is a remedy, but it is not compensatory (art. 488 (index1) and the following of the Criminal Procedure Code. Law no. 201/2023).

Article 359/1 was introduced in the Criminal Procedure Code (the Law 135/2010), stating the right to compensation for damage in the case of technical surveillance measures or activities specific to the collection of information illegally arranged (1). The person against whom he was ordered, confirmed, extended or illegally enforced a technical surveillance measure is entitled to compensation for the damage caused by this measure.



In 2022, criminal law cases appear to be the fastest in Romania, which is similar to the trend observed in the EU for the reference year. At the same time, first instance administrative law cases are the longest in Romania, as it appears also in the EU, but somewhat above the EU median. It is worth mentioning that, in all matters, the total length of proceedings in Romania is below or equal to the EU median, especially for civil cases and criminal cases.

At first instance, the Clearance rate indicator is satisfactory for all matters, with a Clearance Rate close to the 100% threshold for civil litigious, administrative law and criminal law cases. The Disposition Time is below the EU median for civil and criminal cases, but somewhat above the EU median for administrative cases.


In the second instance, courts seem to be slightly less efficient in civil litigious cases with a Clearance Rate somewhat below the 100% threshold (92,7%). The Disposition Time is the same as the EU median for civil litigious cases, and slightly lower for criminal law cases.

At third instance, courts seem to be able to efficiently deal with cases, especially for criminal law cases, but also civil and administrative law cases. The Disposition Time remains the same as the EU median for civil litigious cases, while being lower for administrative law and criminal law cases.









In 2022, there are 4 357 accredited or registered mediators who practise court related mediation which represents 22,9 accredited or registered mediators per 100 000 inhabitants.

The variation between 2021 and 2022 is about 41,7%.

The data reflect the pace of the authorization process as a mediator by the Mediation Council (which may register fluctuations from year to year), of the persons who meet the conditions provided by law.

According to Law no. 192/2006 on mediation and the organisation of the profession of mediator, a person may become a mediator if he/she meets the following conditions:

- a) has full legal capacity;
- b) has higher education;
- c) has at least three years' service;
- d) is medically fit for this activity;
- e) is of good repute and has not been convicted of a criminal offence prejudicial to the prestige of the profession;
- f) has completed the courses for the training of mediators, in accordance with the law, or a postgraduate programme at master level in the field, accredited by law and approved by the Mediation Council;
- g) has been authorized as a mediator, under the terms of this law.

The persons who meet the said conditions will be authorised as mediators by the Mediation Council after payment of the authorisation fee. The authorisation shall be issued to the applicant no later than 30 calendar days from the date on which it is established that the applicant fulfils all the conditions laid down by law and the regulation issued in accordance with the law. If the applicant does not meet the conditions laid down in the law or if his application is not accompanied by supporting documents, the Mediation Council shall notify the person concerned of the reasoned refusal of authorisation or, where appropriate, of the need to complete the evidence required by law. The decision refusing or withdrawing the mediator's authorisation may be appealed to the competent court, in accordance with the procedure laid down in the Administrative Litigation Act.

# 8. Systems for measuring and evaluating the performance of courts and public prosecution services in Romania (2022 data)

In Romania, quality standards are not determined for the judicial system at the national level.

However, informal standards are being used (such as training, quality of the reasoning, assessment of the activity of the judges, assessment of the good reputation of the judges etc.).

More precisely, the activity of courts is evaluated and monitored periodically, on the basis of certain statistical data/performance indicators. The evaluation is achieved by verifications carried out by inspectors of the Judicial Inspection of the SCM, by elaborating periodical reports. The schedule and thematic of those verifications are approved every year by the SCM.

At organizational level, there are no quality standards established for courts. It may be considered that such standards exist at individual level, for each judge, by the indicators for the evaluation of professional activity.
