- Privacy concerns, data protection, online sexual exploitation and abuse

Online Child Sexual Exploitation and Abuse

- Child sexual abuse materials
 (sexually explicit images, videos or other materials)
- Corruption of a child
 (sending a child a sexually explicit image)
- Soliciting a child for sexual purposes (grooming)







INHOPE 2018 Statistics report

- 337,588 alleged Child Sexual Abuse Material (CSAM) related images and videos were processed via ICCAM platform = An increase of 30% on 2017
- 223,999 images and videos were assessed as illegal
- 58% were removed from the internet in less than 3 days
- 91% involved children under 13 years of age
- 80% of victims were girls
- 84% of the content was hosted on image hosting services
