

THE SDGs and Gender Equality TARGETS



The SDGs

- The Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs) are a collection of 17 global goals to be reached by the 2030. : 1) NO poverty 2) Zero Hunger, 3) Good Health and Wellbeing, 4) Quality education 5) Gender Equality, 6) Clean Water and Sanitation, 7) Affordable and Clean Energy, 8) Decent Work and Economic Growth, 9) Industry, Innovation, and Infrastructure, 10) Reducing Inequality, 11) Sustainable Cities and Communities, 12) Responsible Consumption and Production, 13) Climate Action, 14) Life below Water 15) Life on Land , 16) Peace, Justice and Strong Institutions 17) Partnerships for the Goals
- Each SDG has different targets and There are 169 targets
- Each target has between 1 and 3 indicators used to measure progress In total, there are 232 approved indicators that will measure compliance.

Gender Equality

- **Achieve gender equality and empower all women and girls is the standalone Sustainable Goal 5**
- **Several targets in the other SDGs address gender equality and the empowerment of women and girls. Therefore, it is important to take a holistic view of gender equality throughout the entire framework and ensure that concerns that are not addressed in SDG5 are addressed in other goals**

SDG 5 TARGETS 1

- **Target 5.1. End all forms of discrimination against women and girls everywhere**
- **Target 5.2. Eliminate all forms of violence against all women and girls in the public and private spheres, including trafficking and sexual and other types of exploitation**
- **Target 5.3. Eliminate all harmful practices, such as child, early and forced marriage and female genital mutilation**

SDG 5 TARGETS 2

- **Target 5.4. Recognize and value unpaid care and domestic work through the provision of public services, infrastructure and social protection policies and the promotion of shared responsibility within the household and the family as nationally appropriate**
- **Target 5.5. Ensure women's full and effective participation and equal opportunities for leadership at all levels of decision-making in political, economic and public life**
- **Target 5.6. Ensure universal access to sexual and reproductive health and reproductive rights as agreed in accordance with the Programme of Action of the International Conference on Population and Development and the Beijing Platform for Action and the outcome documents of their review conferences**

SDG TARGETS 3

- **Target 5.a. Undertake reforms to give women equal rights to economic resources, as well as access to ownership and control over land and other forms of property, financial services, inheritance and natural resources, in accordance with national laws**
- **Target 5.b. Enhance the use of enabling technology, in particular information and communications technology, to promote the empowerment of women**
- **Target 5.c. Adopt and strengthen sound policies and enforceable legislation for the promotion of gender equality and the empowerment of all women and girls at all levels**

GENDER RELATED TARGETS

- In addition to the targets in Goal 5 gender related targets are mainstreamed in the other SDGs
- The targets in the other goals cover a comprehensive set of issues, including the gender dimensions of poverty, hunger, health, education, water and sanitation, employment, safe cities and peace and security.
- These targets address key policy concerns identified in the Beijing Platform for Action and other more recent international commitments covering national norms and laws on gender equality

NO POVERTY

- **Target 1.2: By 2030, reduce at least by half the proportion of men, women and children of all ages living in poverty in all its dimensions according to national definitions**
- **Target 1.4: By 2030, ensure that all men and women, in particular the poor and the vulnerable, have equal rights to economic resources, as well as access to basic services, ownership and control over land and other forms of property, inheritance, natural resources, appropriate new technology and financial services, including microfinance**

NO Hunger

- **Target 2.1: By 2030, end hunger and ensure access by all people, in particular the poor and people in vulnerable situations, including infants, to safe, nutritious and sufficient food all year round**
- **Target 2.2: By 2030, end all forms of malnutrition, including achieving, by 2025, the internationally agreed targets on stunting and wasting in children under 5 years of age, and address the nutritional needs of adolescent girls, pregnant and lactating women and older persons**

GOOD HEALTH and WELLBEING

- **Target 3.1: By 2030, reduce the global maternal mortality ratio to less than 70 per 100,000 live births**
- **Target 3.7: By 2030, ensure universal access to sexual and reproductive health-care services, including for family planning, information and education, and the integration of reproductive health into national strategies and programmes**

QUALITY EDUCATION

Most of the education targets include references to gender equality by highlighting girls and boys (Targets 4.1 and 4.2) and women and men (Targets 4.3, 4.4 and 4.6).

Target 4.5 explicitly refers to gender equality and aims to: by 2030, eliminate gender disparities in education and ensure equal access to all levels of education and vocational training for the vulnerable, including persons with disabilities, indigenous peoples and children in vulnerable situations.

CLEAN WATER AND SANITATION

- **Target 6.1: By 2030, achieve universal and equitable access to safe and affordable drinking water for all . Average weekly time spent in water collection (including waiting time at public supply points), by sex, age and location.**

ECONOMIC GROWTH and DECENT WORK

Target 8.5: By 2030, achieve full and productive employment and decent work for all women and men, including for young people and persons with disabilities, and equal pay for equal work of equal value .

Target 8.8 Protect labour rights and promote safe and secure working environments of all workers, including migrant workers, particularly women migrants, and those in precarious employment

REDUCING INEQUALITY

Target 10.1: By 2030, progressively achieve and sustain income growth of the bottom 40 per cent of the population at a rate higher than the national average , by age, sex and persons with disabilities

Target 10.3 Ensure equal opportunity and reduce inequalities of outcome, including through eliminating discriminatory laws, policies and practices and promoting appropriate legislation, policies and actions in this regard

SUSTAINABLE CITIES AND COMMUNITIES

Target 11.7: By 2030, provide universal access to safe, inclusive and accessible, green and public spaces, in particular for women and children, older persons and persons with disabilities

CLIMATE ACTION

- **13.b. Promote mechanisms for raising capacities for effective climate change-related planning and management, including focusing on women, youth and local and marginalized communitie**

PEACE AND GOVERNANCE

- **Target 16.1: Significantly reduce all forms of violence and related death rates everywhere**
- **Target 16.2: End abuse, exploitation, trafficking and all forms of violence and torture against children**

GLOBAL PARTNERSHIP

- **Target 17.19: By 2030, build on existing initiatives to develop measurements of progress on sustainable development that complement gross domestic product, and support statistical capacity-building in developing countries.**

Indicator 5.2.1: Proportion of ever partnered women and girls aged 15 years and older subjected to physical, sexual, or psychological violence by a current or former intimate partner in the previous 12 months by form of violence and age

Indicator 5.2.2: Proportion of women and girls aged 15 years and older subjected to sexual violence by persons other than an intimate partner in the previous 12 months, by age and place of occurrence

Indicator 5.3.1: Proportion of women aged 20-24 years who were married or in a union before age 15 and before age 18

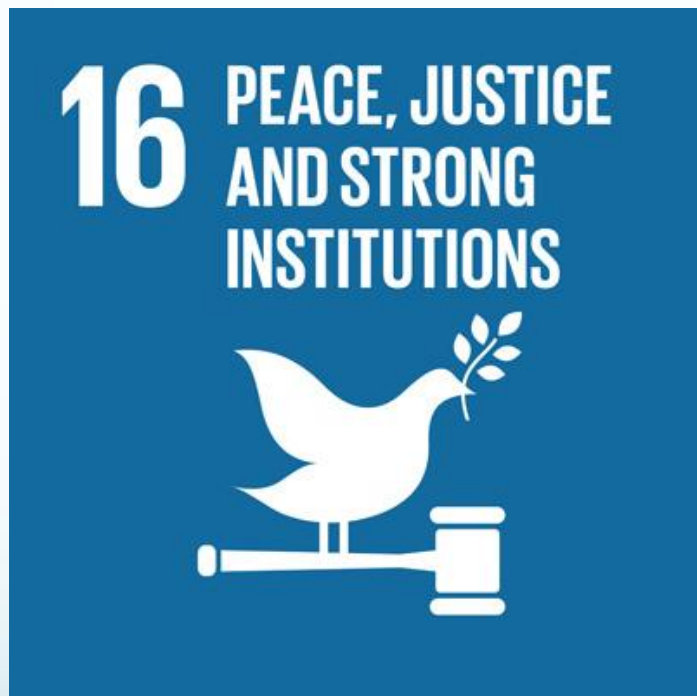
Indicator 5.3.2: Proportion of girls and women aged 15-49 years who have undergone female genital mutilation/cutting, by age - not relevant to all countries

Global indicators- SDG INDICATOR 11



Indicator 11.7.2: Proportion of persons victims of physical or sexual harassment by sex, age, disability status and place of occurrence, in the previous 12 months

Global indicators- The SDG indicators 16



- **Indicator 16.1.1:** Number of victims of intentional homicides per 100,000 population, by sex and age
- **Indicator 16.1.3:** Proportion of population subjected to physical, psychological, or sexual violence in the previous 12 months
- **Indicator 16.2.2:** Number of victims of human trafficking per 100,000 population by sex, age, and forms of exploitation
- **Indicator 16.2.3:** Proportion of young women and men age 18-29 years who experienced sexual violence by age 18 years
- **Indicator 16.3.1:** Proportion of victims of violence in the previous 12 months who reported their victimization to competent authorities or other officially recognized conflict resolution mechanisms
