Regional plans are harmonized with the spatial development plans, adopted at the local level, because the investments in regional development must be harmonized with the goals of spatial development, set out in spatial planning documents. Regional development programs also contain elements of the landscape, mainly in relation to the tourist orientation, rural development, or as part of the objectives of quality of life.

The Law on Nature Protection regulates the protection and conservation of nature, biological, geological and landscape diversity as parts of the environment.

Description

The Law on Nature Protection ("Official Gazette of the Republic of Serbia" No. 36/2009, 88/2010 and 91/2010) defines the terms: landscape, landscape diversity, landscape types, cultural landscape and landscape element. The protection of the landscape diversity is ensured by the defined principles of protection, as well as by Article 9 concerning the issuance of the Nature Protection Requirements.Penal provisions (Article 125) predicts the fine for economic offense of permanent violation of landscape diversity.

Protection of the area is dedicated to Article 26 of the Law, that determining the identification of the area by defining the landscape types as basis for the protection, management and planning of the area.

Landscape protection is realizing on two ways: the formation of protected areas or the protection of certain (visual, structural) characteristics of the area.

According to Article 33, the area of exceptional features is a protected area of recognizable appearance with significant natural, biological, ecological, aesthetic and cultural-historical values, which evolved over the time as a result of the interaction of nature, the natural potential of the area and the traditional way of life of the local population.

The cultural landscape of exceptional features is also distinguished, making cultural and historical values particularly valued and emphasized from the aspect of nature protection.

Assistant Minister for International Cooperation and the national focal point for the ELC, held the presentation of the European Landscape Convention at the official ceremony, also a multimedia presentation by Dr. Milorad Glusica, was held :"Horizons of Sumadija and Pomoravlvlje''showing the great diversity and value of landscapes of Central Serbia.

The National Ceremony of the Republic of Serbia for the Third International Landscape Day of the Council of Europe on the topic "Landscape and Water", was held on 19-20 October 2019, and organized by the Ministry of Environmental Protection, the Natural History Centre of Serbia, and the Municipality of Svilajnac.

The large auditorium was presented at this exhibition organized for the celebration of the Third Landscape Day: Representative of the Council of Europe, Ms. Maguelonne DEJEANT PONS, representatives of the Ministry of Environmental Protection, the Mayor and Members of the City Council of Public Authorities of Svilajnac and Kraljevo, Senior Officers of the Ministry of the Environment and of the Natural History Centre, the Director and Representative of the Zasavica Special Nature Reserve, the eminent Professors of Landscape Architecture and Geology of Serbia, the Citizens Association for Ecotourism Development "Podunav" Bački Monoštar and the Students of the Belgrade University Faculty of Forestry, NGO and media representatives.

After the opening ceremony and speeches of the responsible officials, the exhibition of the best photos concerning landscape and water was officially opened.

The photos from the 3 projects that were participating at the Council of Europe's Award, since 2011, were presented to the public, also the draft project proposal for the First environmental park of Serbia, that is planned to be created in Svilajnac. The Director of the Natural History Center of Serbia presented its part of the exhibition, entitled "Moravian Landscapes". The exhibition "Moravian Landscapes" included a presentation of three types of landscape characters of the river Morava and Resava region, identified in the first phase of the project that was realized in Serbia in 2015: "Developing the Capacities of Sumadija and Pomoravlje for the implementation of the European Landscape Convention", I phase: Classification and characterization of landscapes of Sumadija and Pomoravlje districts.

Presented photos cover locations of six municipalities: Svilajnac, Cuprija, Batocina, Jagodina, Paracin and Despotovac.

Professors of the Belgrade University-Faculty of Forestry, Department of Planning and Design in Landscape Architecture with students of the study program Landscape Architecture (Prof. Dr. Boris Radić and Prof. Dr. Nevena Vasiljevic) organized the exhibition of student projects: "Landscape and Water". The dynamics of the landscape element of water have been an inspiration in the planning and design approach applied in the landscape architects education process. The second day of the program organized for the ceremony of marking the Third Landscape Day, was organized in the Special Nature Reserve "Zasavica", which participated at the Landscape Award Ceremony in 2015 presenting its exemplary achievements and practical examples showing that it is possible to promote the territorial dimension of human rights and democracy improving sustainable environment.

Project developed in 5 countries: Austria, Slovenia, Croatia, Hungary and Serbia, the riverine landscape of the lower courses of the Drava and Mura and related Danube sections forms one of Europe's most important bio-corridors. Since 1993, NGOs and public authorities have cooperated to work towards the protection of this unique landscape as a UNESCO Transboundary Biosphere Reserve "Mura-Drava-Danube" (TBR MDD) - the "Amazon of Europe". However, the lack of operational cooperation for harmonising management practices between 12 single protected areas in the 5 TBR countries threatens the ecological integrity of the planned TBR MDD. Coop MDD aims to overcome these obstacles by establishing a strategic and operational framework for transboundary nature protection, restoration and management of the Mura-Drava-Danube river corridor in Austria, Slovenia, Hungary, Croatia and Serbia as the basis of a well-managed TBR MDD. Through workshops, study visits, capacity building, awareness-raising activities and pilot implementation of concrete actions in the field of restoration, stakeholder participation and environmental education, the cooperation of PA authorities and cross-sectoral stakeholders for management of TBR MDD will be established, and a wider acceptance by local stakeholders, inhabitants and visitors for establishment of TBR MDD will be achieved. The main project output - the Transboundary Management Programme for River-Dynamic Corridor Development - will be taken up by the 5-country ministerial Coordination Board as their baseline strategic and operational work programme towards establishment of the TBR MDD. This will set a solid foundation for-long term functional implementation of the 1 million-hectare, 700 km long TBR MDD in the context of transboundary nature conservation, making it Europes largest protected river corridor and worlds first penta-lateral UNESCO Biosphere Reserve.
