Background

The Council of Europe has placed sport within its agenda of reinforcing human rights, democracy and social inclusion for a long time. Thanks to its Revised European Sports Charter (2021), "governments have committed themselves to providing their citizens with opportunities to practice sport under well-defined conditions".

The Council of Europe Sport Division promotes the "Sport for All" philosophy: every person, regardless of their background, has the right to engage in sport. The Sport For All project builds on ongoing efforts to create a more inclusive sports culture by addressing the barriers to the participation of persons with disabilities in sport and by fostering a safe and welcoming sport environments for all.

The webinar is part of the Sport For All project's Pillar 2 "Exchange of best practices", which complements Pillar 1 on "Capacity building", and focuses on strengthening the capacity of Para sport coaches, referees and managers to create inclusive environments. Training and development of these professionals is central to ensuring that sport is not only accessible to but also empowering for persons with disabilities.

Objectives

This webinar aims to:

- 1) increase awareness on key competences, attitudes and challenges in educating Para sport coaches, referees and managers;
- 2) learn from research and good practice: discover innovative training pathways and models from different contexts;
- 3) facilitate dialogue across levels: link grassroots realities with policy, European standards and international frameworks;
- 4) ensure that Para sport coaches and referees are leading the discussion.

Based on the webinar discussions, a short set of practical recommendations on the development of Para sport coaches, referees and managers will be identified and published on the Sport For All website.

Structure and practical arrangements

The online webinar is scheduled to last 2 hours and 20 minutes. Participants will be invited to pose questions through the chat function of the Zoom platform to be asked to the speakers during the panel discussion (session 2), and to share their own insights, challenges and recommendations.
