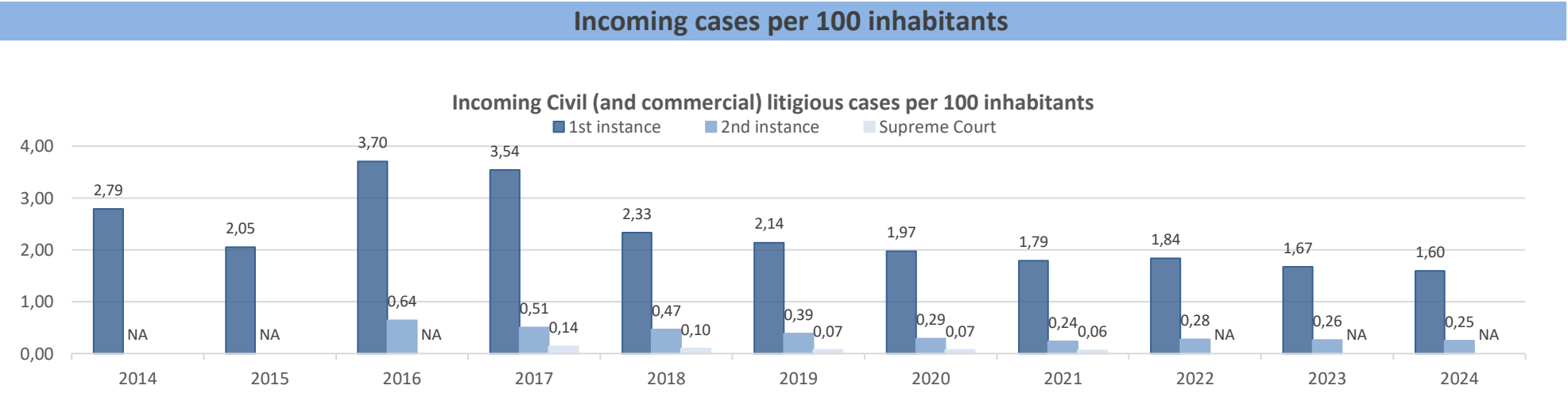
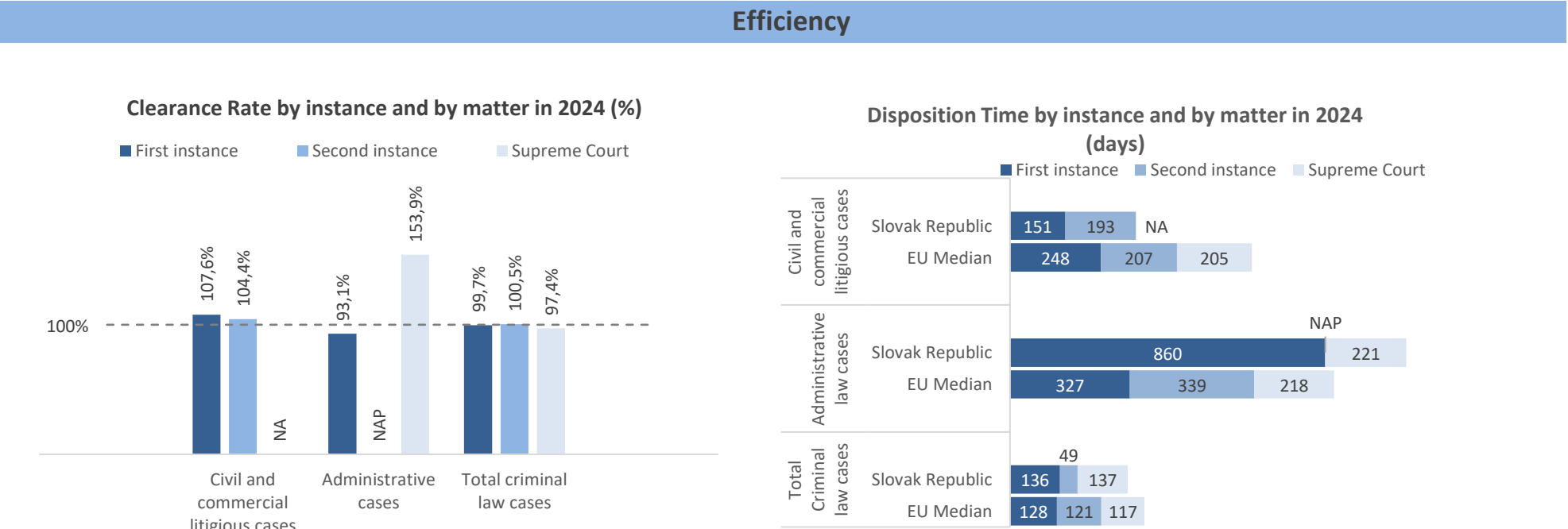
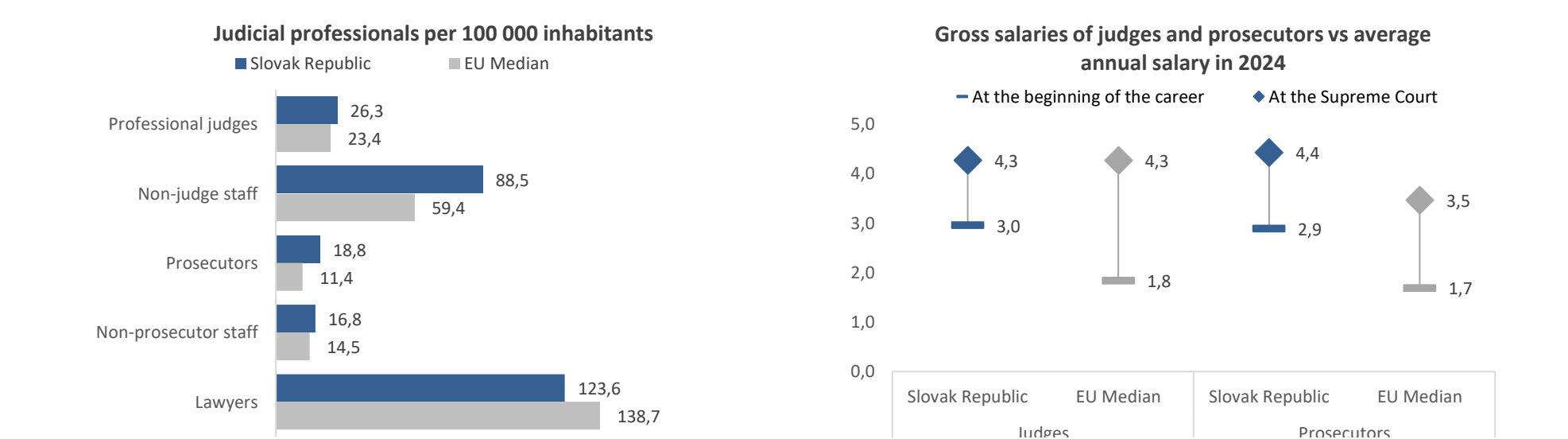

1. Judicial organisation in Slovak Republic (2024 data)

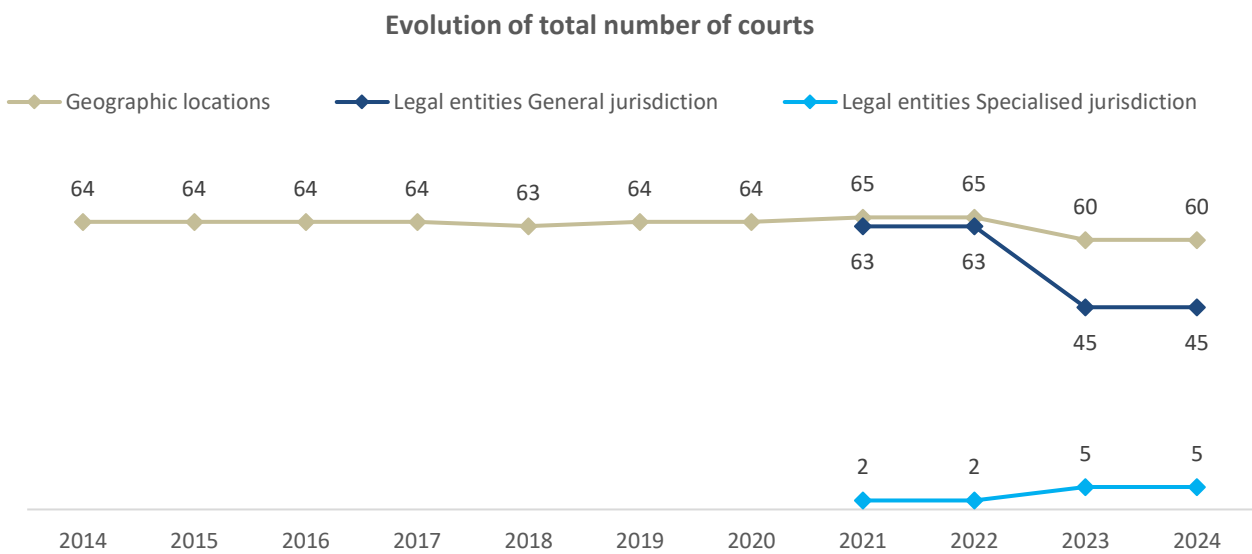
The legislative changes introduced by Act No. 150/2022 Coll., as amended by Act No. 398/2022 Coll., and Act No. 151/2022 Coll., restructured the judiciary through the implementation of a new court map. The restructuring came into effect on 1 June 2023 and resulted in several significant changes to the organisation and operation of courts.

In 2024 there are 50 courts, including general and specialised ones. Among these, courts of general jurisdiction account for 45. Within the courts of general jurisdiction, there are 36 first-instance courts, including municipal and district courts. There are 8 second-instance courts, and 1 highest-instance court.

Specialised courts totaling 5, include the Supreme Administrative Court and the 3 post-reform first-instance administrative courts. A focus area in specialised courts includes addressing terrorism, organised crime, and corruption, with one higher-instance court in this domain.

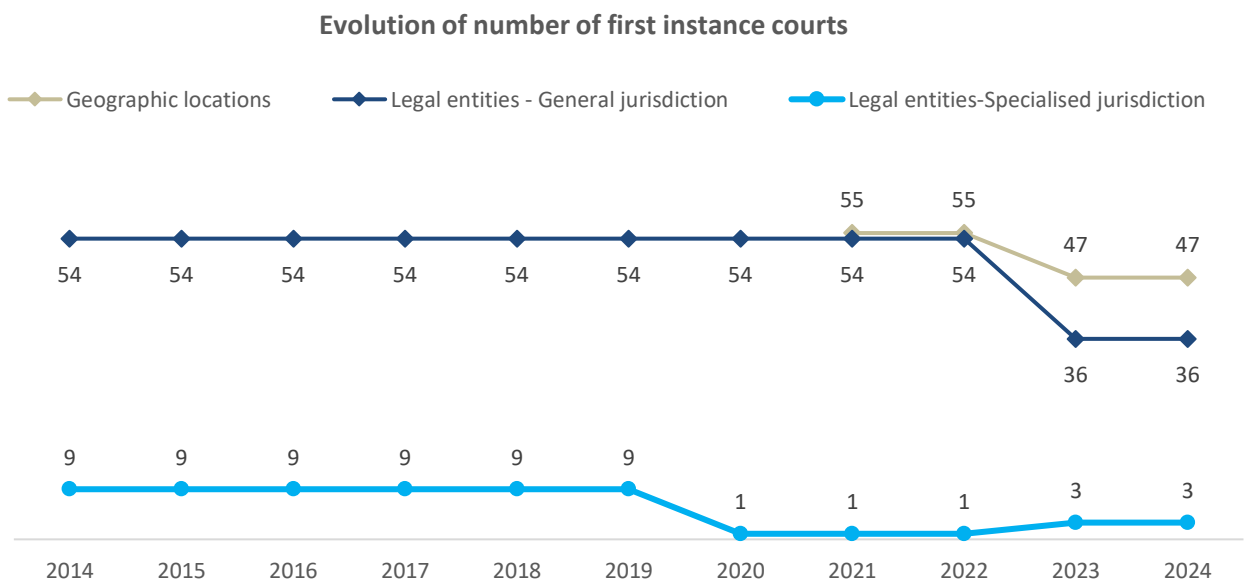
There are 36 courts operating at first instance, including municipal and district courts. 8 regional courts are operating at second instance and 1 Supreme Court at the highest instance.

The new Supreme Administrative Court - specialised court of higher instance was established in 2021 and started its full work in 2022.

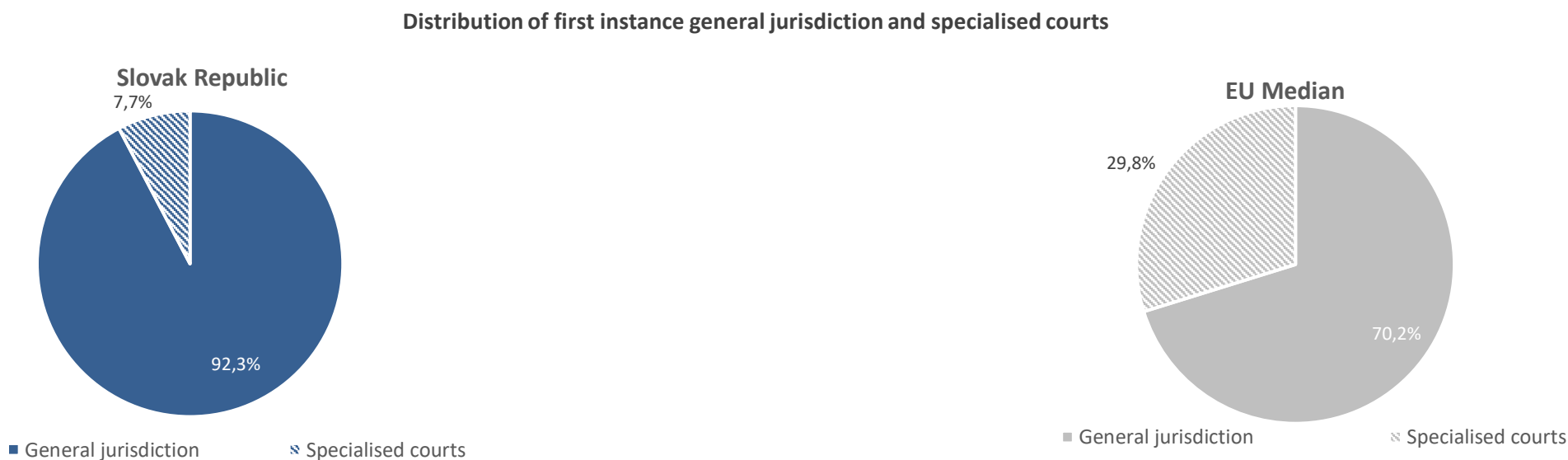
In the Slovak court system there are 8 Regional courts which have dual competence. Regional courts are the courts of appeal with general jurisdiction in civil, commercial and criminal cases. They also decide appeals lodged against the decisions of all 54 District courts within their local jurisdiction. At the same time the Regional courts have jurisdiction as courts of first instance in administrative matters.

There are 36 courts operating at first instance, including municipal and district courts. The new legislation significantly reorganised the judiciary by reducing the number of district courts from 54 to 36.



The distribution between first instance general jurisdiction courts and first instance specialised courts in Slovak Republic is 92,3% - 7,7% (distribution tendency in EU: 70,2% - 29,8%).

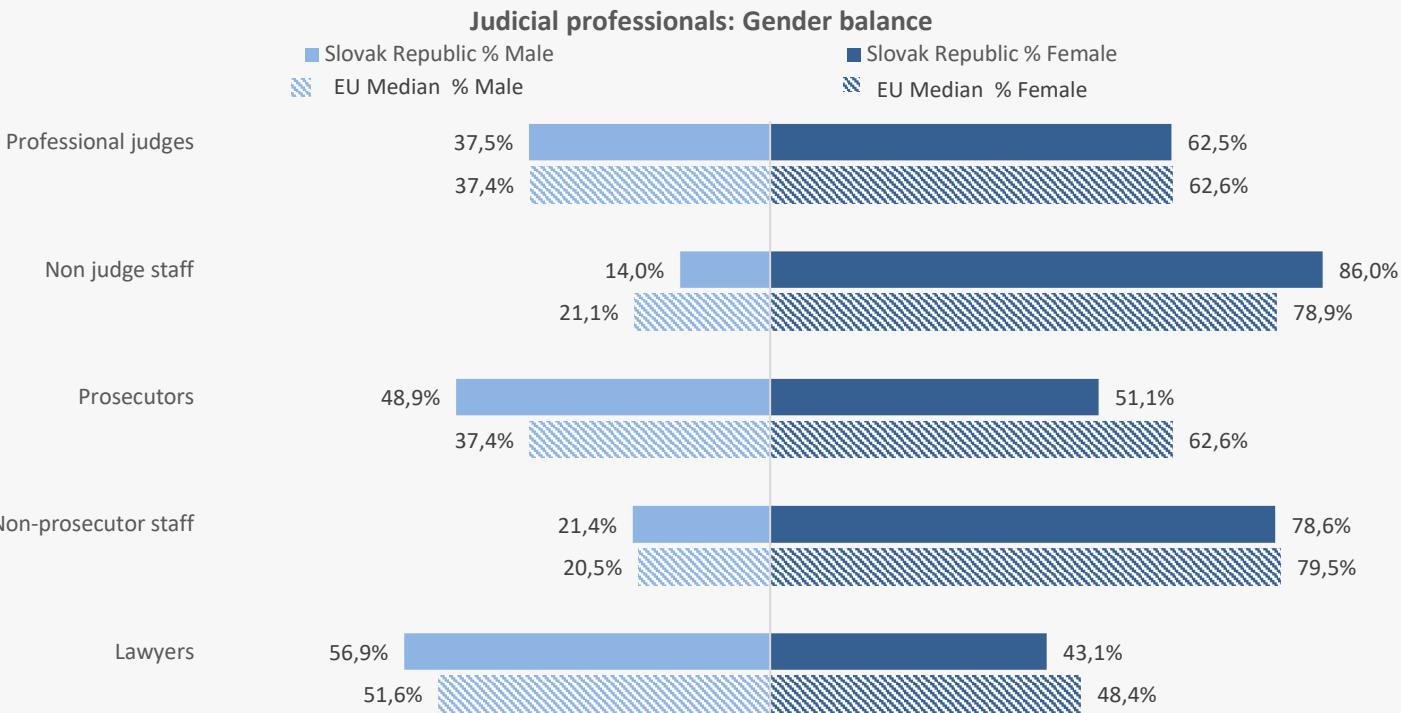

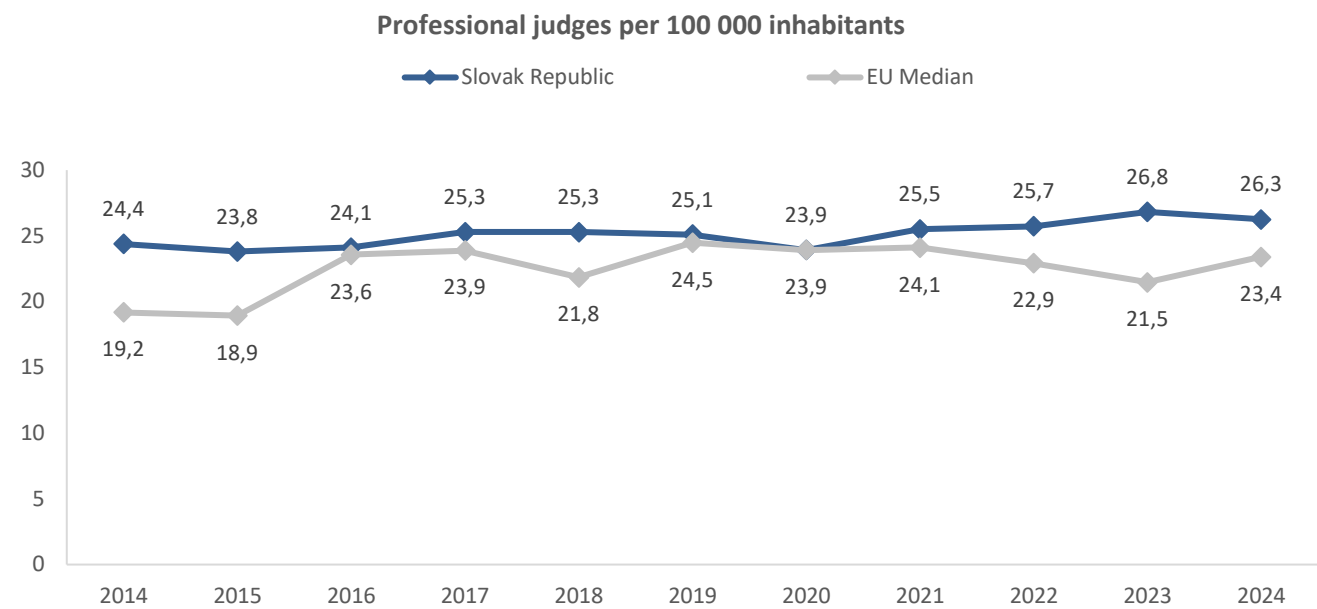

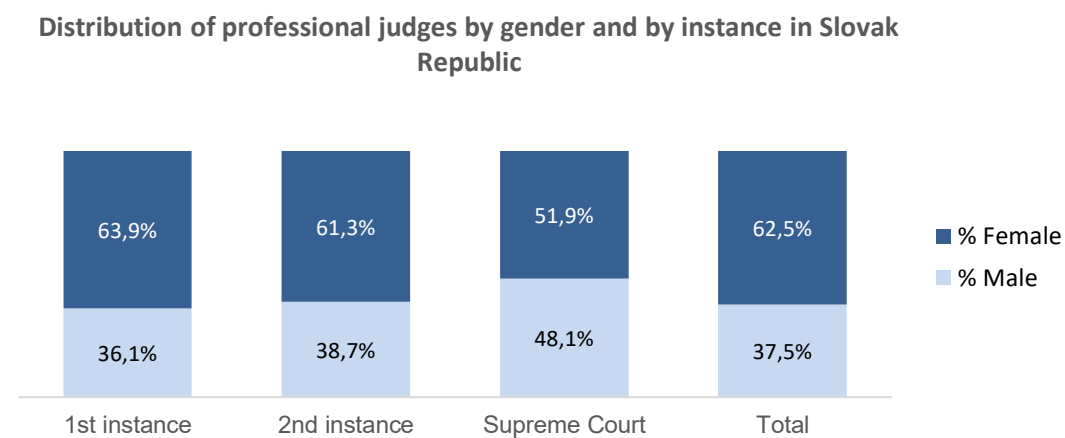
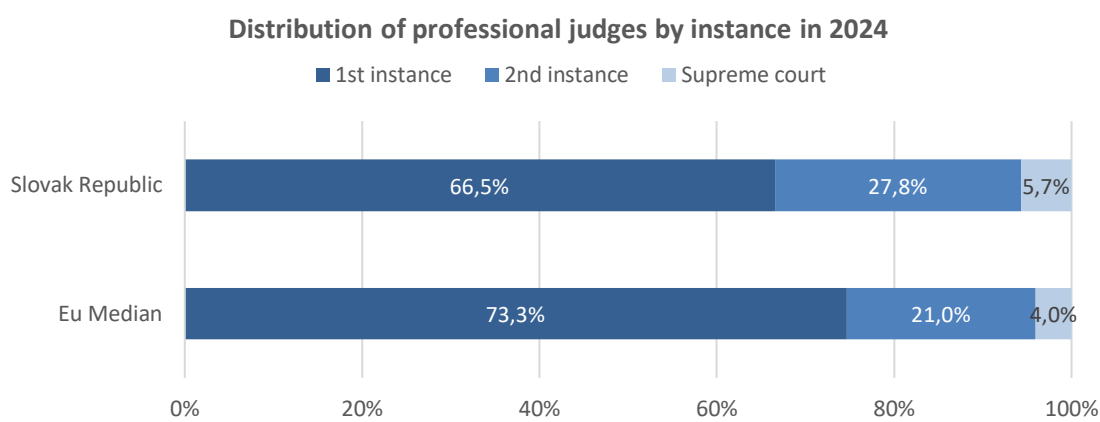


According to the 2024 data, the total number of professional judges sitting in courts (all instances) in Slovak Republic is 1 423, which is -2,2% less than in the previous cycle.

More precisely, in the Slovak Republic, there are 26,3 professional judges per 100 000 inhabitants (this figure is above the EU median of 23,4 judges per 100 000 inhabitants)

In this cycle, the total number of female professional judges (all instances) is 889, which represents 62,5% of the total number of judges.

The total number of judges is distributed among the different judicial instances in the following way: 947 are sitting in the first instance courts (of whom 605 are female); 395 are sitting in the second instance courts (of whom 242 are female) and 81 are sitting at the Supreme Court (of whom 42 are female).

Compared with the EU distribution of professional judges per instance, the distribution of judges per instance is quite similar in the Slovak Republic, with more significant discrepancies appearing in second and third instance. Namely, there is a higher percentage of judges at these instances, with 27,8% at second instance, against 21% on an EU level, and 5,7% at third instance, compared to 4% on an EU level.

As regards the methodology of presentation of data in respect of the number of judges, it should be specified that the judges from the Supreme Administrative Court are calculated in the total of Supreme Court judges.

As regards the distribution male/Female, it has to be specified that the majority of judges are female across all three instances, with the highest percentage of 63,9% at first instance.

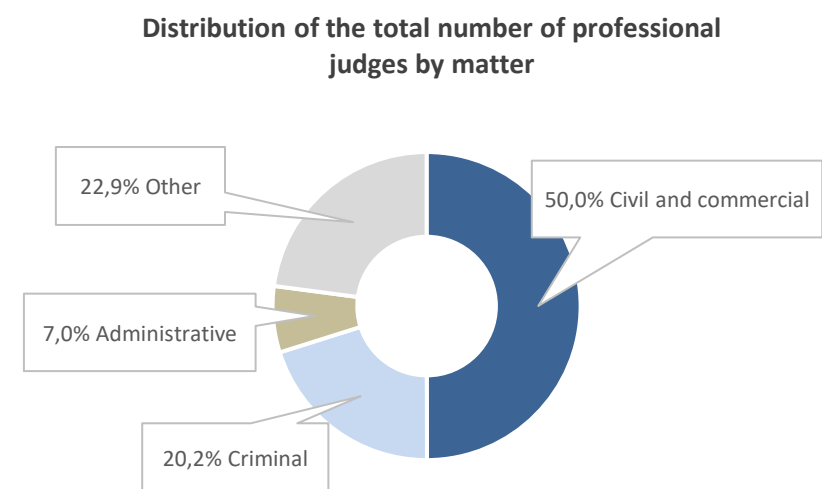

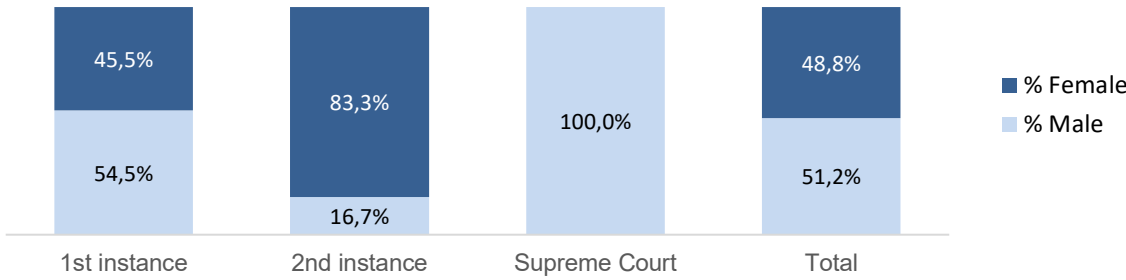

Distribution of court presidents by gender and by instance in Slovak Republic

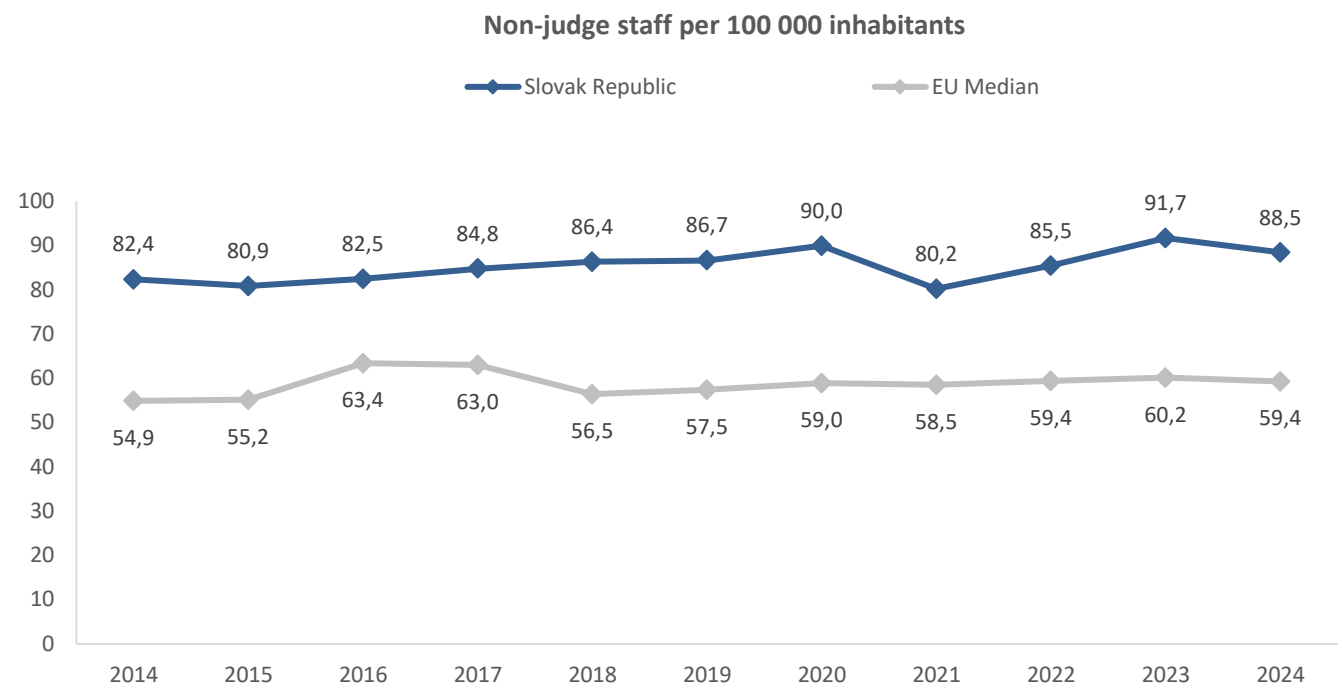


In this cycle, the total number of female court presidents (all instances) is 20, which represents 48,8% of the total number of court presidents.

The total number of court presidents is distributed among the different judicial instances in the following way: 33 are sitting in first instance courts (of whom 15 are female); 6 are sitting in second instance courts (of whom 5 are female) and 2 are sitting in Supreme Court (of whom none are female).

In 2024, the Slovak Republic has 4 794 non-judge staff (of whom 4 122 are Female). The total number of non-judge staff in comparison with the previous cycle reveals a decrease of -3,6%.

In 2024, the number of non-judge staff per 100 000 inhabitants has decreased (from 91,7 in 2023 to 88,5 in 2024).

During the same period, the number of judges per 100 000 inhabitants evolved from 26,8 judges per 100 000 inhabitants in 2023 to 26,3 in 2024.

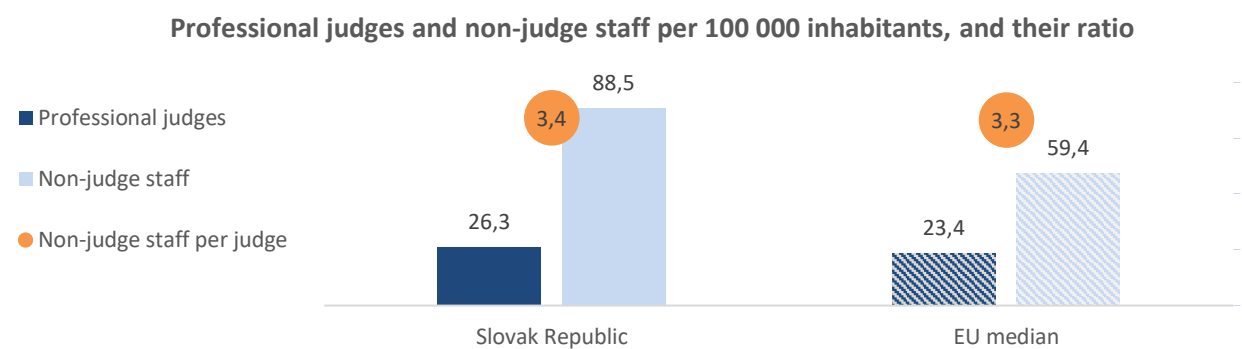

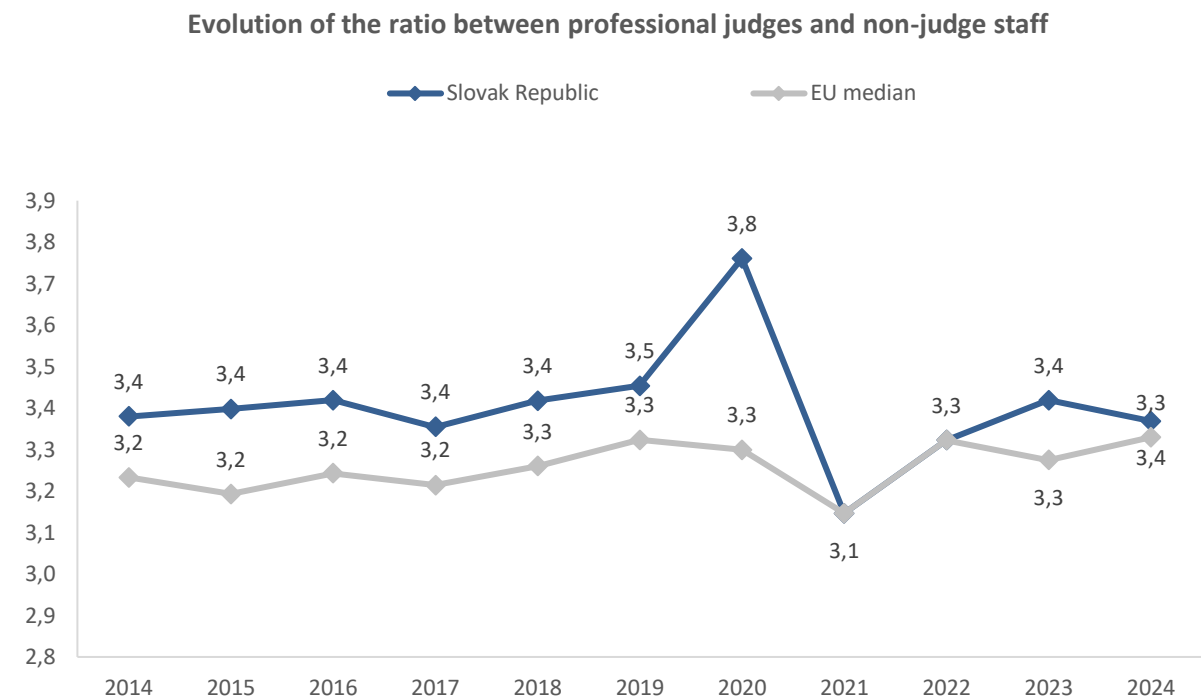


In the Slovak Republic, there are 26,3 professional judges per 100 000 inhabitants (this figure is above the EU median of 23,4 judges per 100 000 inhabitants) and about 3,4 non-judge staff per judge.

There is no significant difference compared with the previous cycle when this ratio was at 3,4 non-judge staff per judge.

Evolution of the ratio between professional judges and non-judge staff

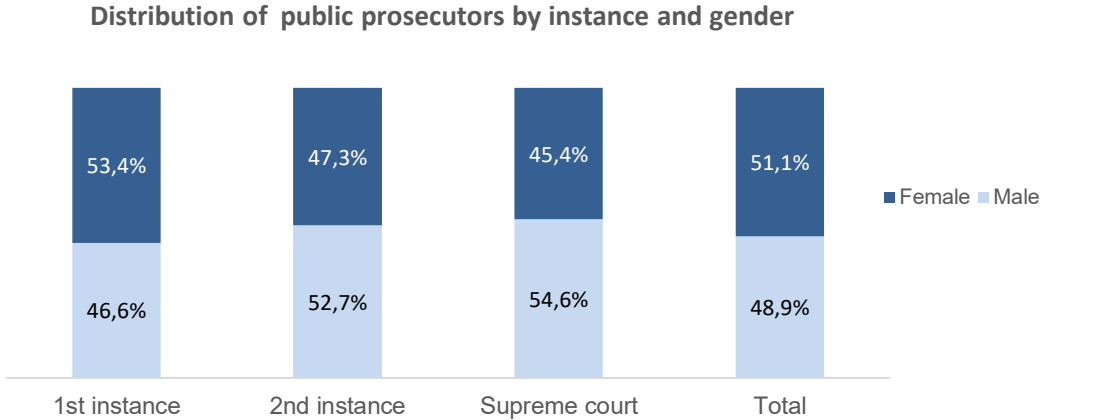
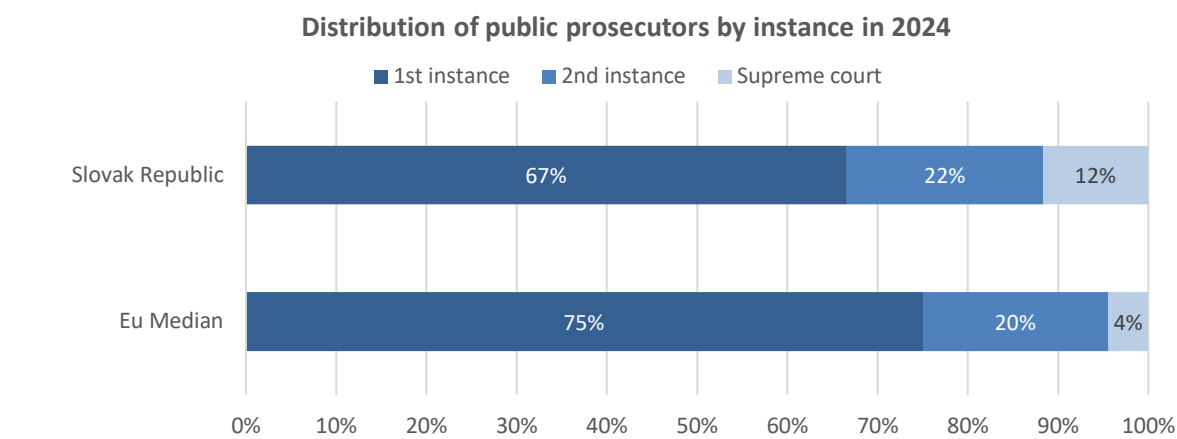

In this cycle, the total number of Female prosecutors (all instances) is 522, which represents 51,1% of the total number of prosecutors. The total number of prosecutors is distributed among the different judicial instances in the following way: 680 in first instance (of whom 363 are female); 222 are in second instance (of whom 105 are female) and 119 in final instance (of whom 54 are female).

As regards the methodology of presentation of data in respect of the number of public prosecutors, it should be noted that the number of prosecutors at the Supreme Court level also includes prosecutors of the Special Prosecution Bureau. The latter deals with crimes of corruption and the most severe offences including organised crime. It intervenes in first instance, but acts as an organisational part of the General Prosecutor’s Office.

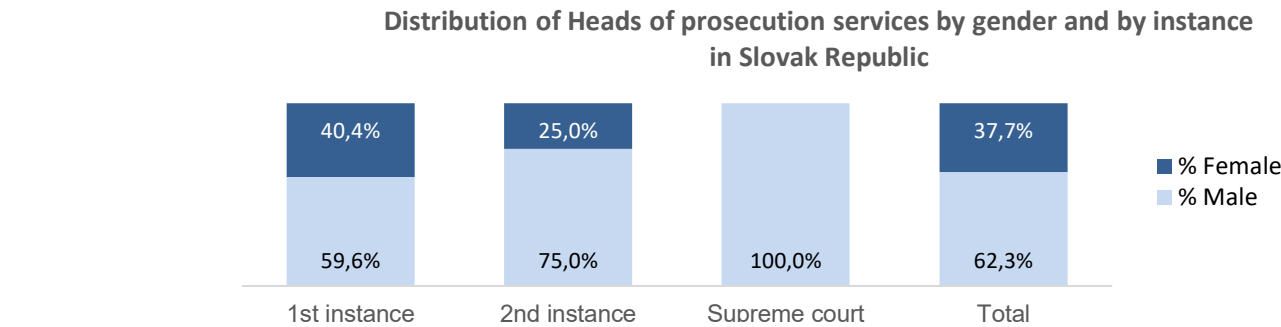
As regards the distribution of the number of prosecutors among the different judicial instances, the Slovak Republic has fewer prosecutors at the 1st instance and more at the Supreme Court level compared to the EU median.

As regards the distribution male/Female, it has to be specified that the majority of public prosecutors are female at first instance, while female public prosecutors are slightly below 50% at second and third instance.

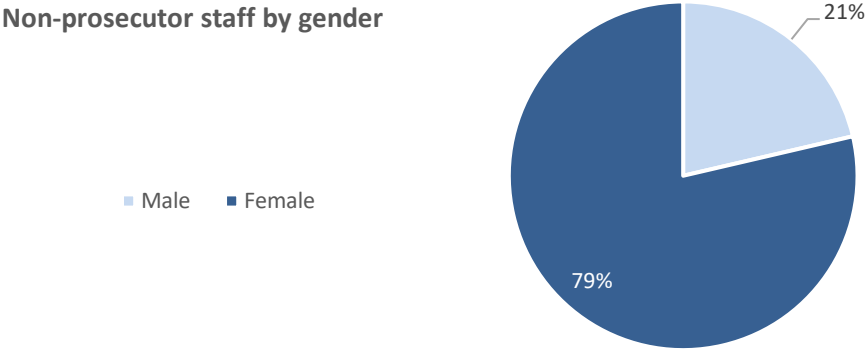
In this cycle, the total number of female Heads of prosecution (all instances) is 23, which represents 37,7% of the total number of Heads of prosecution.

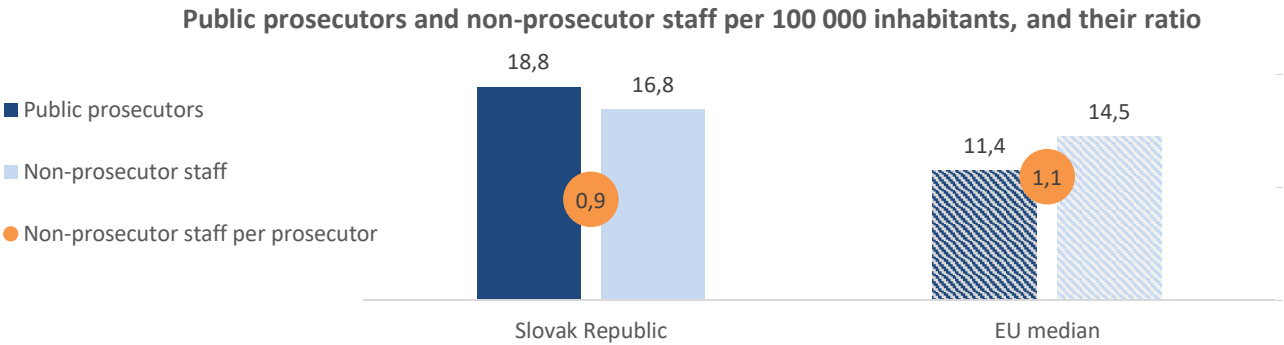

Ratio between non-prosecutor staff and public prosecutors

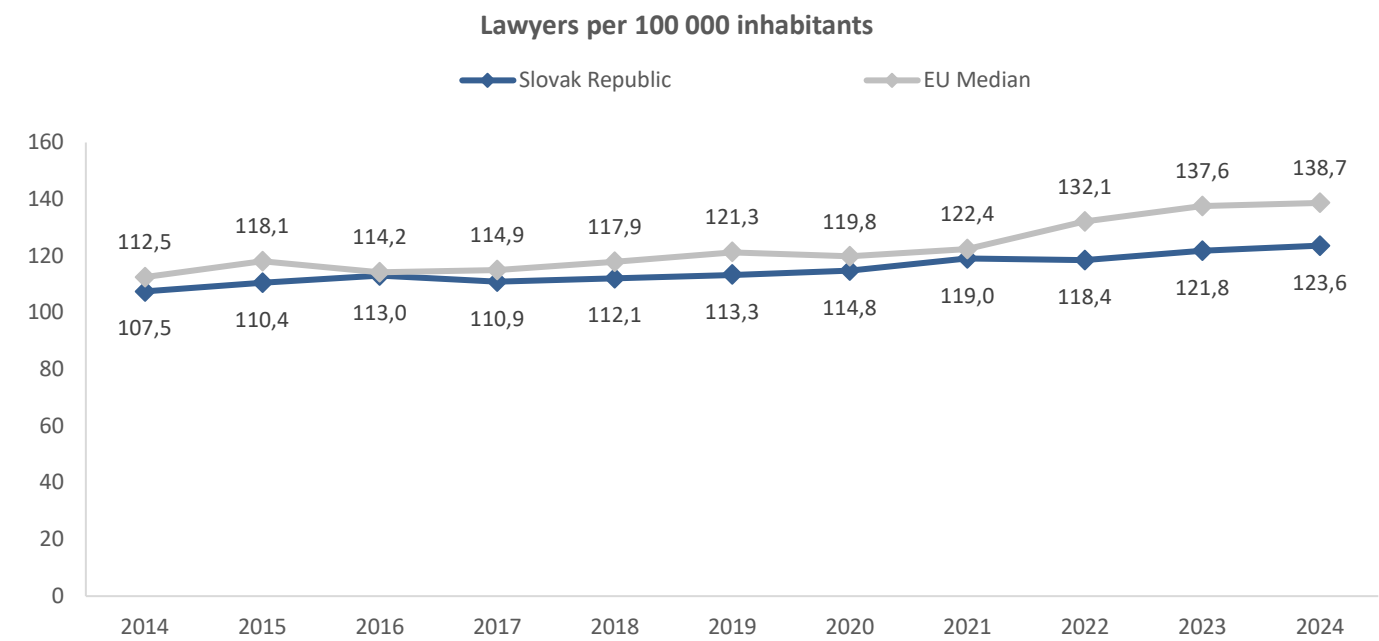

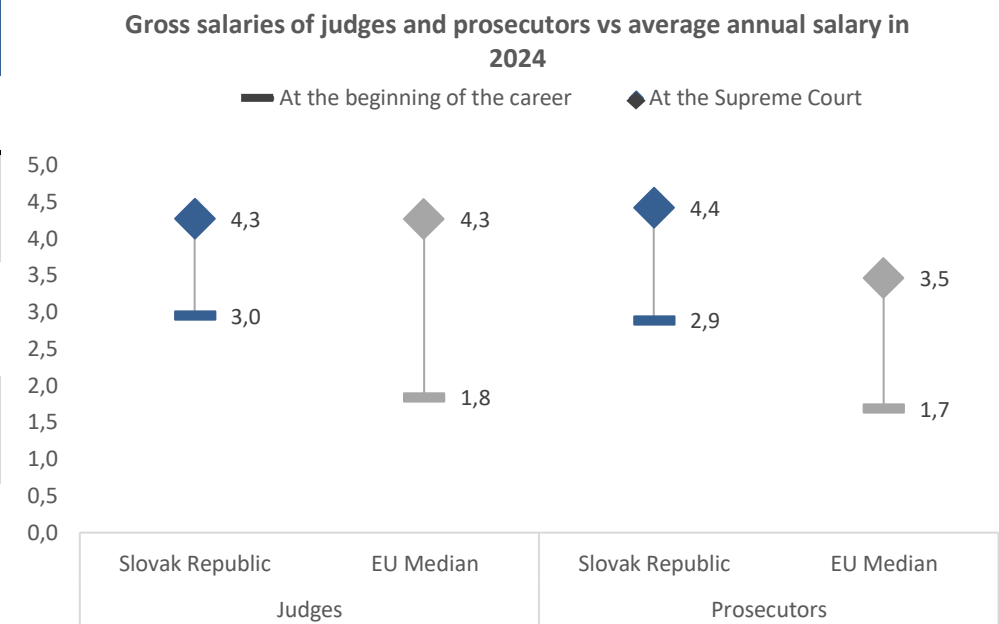


In 2024, there are 6 700 lawyers, which is 1,4% more than in 2023.
There are 2 885 female lawyers which is 43% of the total.

The Slovak Republic has 123,6 lawyers per 100 000 inhabitants, which is below the EU median of 138,7 lawyers per 100 000 inhabitants.

In the European Union, the absolute gross salary for a judge at the beginning of career ranges from a minimum of 24 043€ to a maximum of 153 676€.

According to the 2024 data, the absolute gross salary of a judge at the beginning of his/her career in Slovak Republic is 54 054€, which is slightly below the EU median of 61 347€ (-12% below).

Compared with the annual average salary in the country, the salary for a judge at the beginning of his/her career is 3,0 times higher (the EU median is 1,8).

At the highest level, the range of the EU absolute gross salary of a judge is from 54 719€ to 298 911€. The Slovak Republic's absolute gross salaries for judges at the highest level is -36%, below the EU median of 121 591€.

For public prosecutors, the range for the absolute gross salary at the beginning of career is from a minimum of 24 043€ to a maximum of 106 135€.

In 2024, the absolute gross salary of a public prosecutor at the beginning of his/her career in the Slovak Republic of 52 874€ is around the EU median of 52 969€.

Compared with the annual average salary in the country, the salary of a public prosecutor at the beginning of his/her career is 2,9 times higher (the EU median is 1,7).

At the highest level, the minimum absolute gross salary for prosecutors in the European Union is 51 013€ and the maximum is 254 088€. The Slovak Republic's absolute gross salaries for prosecutors at the highest level is -14% below the EU median of 94 385€.

The stated sums represent the basic gross salary of judges/prosecutors without bonuses and supplements. According to the Act on Judges (No. 385/2000 Coll.) the average monthly salary of the judge equals the monthly salary of the Member of Parliament. The monthly salary of the judge at the beginning of the career is 90% of this salary. The monthly salary of the judge of the Supreme Court is 130 % of the monthly salary of the Member of Parliament. The judge is entitled to have 2 additional monthly salaries (in May and in November) unless they do not meet the conditions stipulated in law. The sum of annual average salary stated in this questionnaire counts 14 months salaries.
All bonuses and supplements are stipulated by law. Specific supplement belongs to the judges of the Specialized Criminal court and to the judges of the Supreme court deciding on the remedies against the decisions of that court.

The value of the net salary depends on several individual criteria, e. g. the number of children, the voluntary pension security scheme etc. Similar rules govern the salaries of prosecutors (Act on Prosecutors and Trainee Prosecutors No.154/2001 Coll.).

The average salary of the prosecutor equals the average salary of the judge. The salary of the beginning prosecutor is 85% of this salary, the salary of the prosecutor at the General Prosecutors office is equal to the salary of the Supreme Court judge. Prosecutors are also entitled to 2 additional monthly salaries. Supplements for the heads of the prosecutor offices are similar to supplements of the court presidents at the same level. The prosecutors of the Special Prosecutor’s Office are entitled to same supplement as the judges of the Specialised Criminal Court.

Compensations for excessive length of proceedings can be awarded by the Constitutional court through a finding of violation of the right to trial within reasonable time.

Compensation for wrongful arrest or conviction or non-execution of court decisions can be awarded in civil proceedings.

Additionally, an aggrieved person can seek compensation against the state under the Act on State Liability for Damage in Exercise of the Public Power.

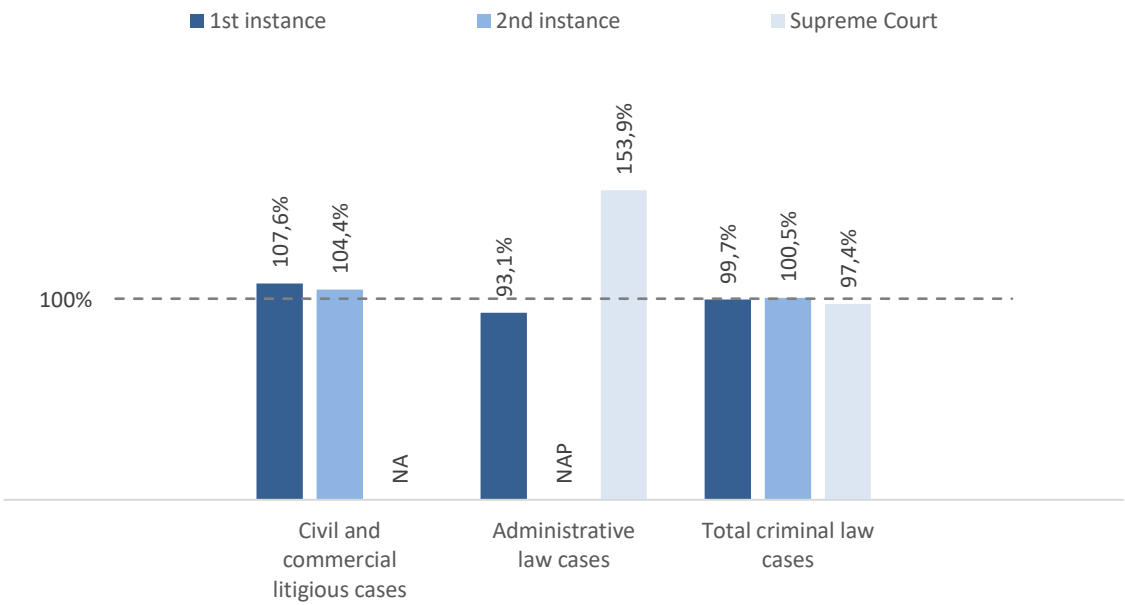
The Clearance Rate shows the capacity of a judicial system to deal with the incoming cases. A Clearance Rate of 100% and higher does not generate backlog.

The Disposition Time determines the estimated number of days necessary for a pending case to be solved in a court.

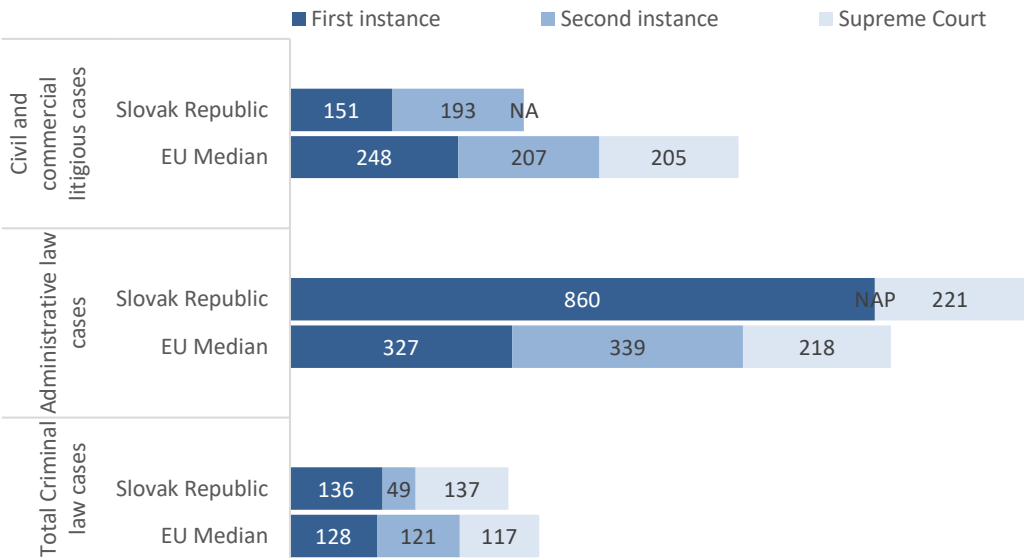

In civil and commercial litigation, clearance rates exceeds 100% at both first instance (107.6%) and second instance (104.4%), indicating a reduction of pending caseloads. Disposition times at first instance (151 days) are significantly shorter than the EU median (248 days), while second-instance proceedings (193 days) are slightly faster than the EU median (207 days). Data for the Supreme Court are not available as the Supreme Court does not distinguish between litigious and non-litigious cases. In civil and commercial matters, the Supreme court decides primarily on applications for appellate review of legal questions. In commercial cases it also decides in the appellate procedure against the decisions of the Regional courts as the courts of first instance.

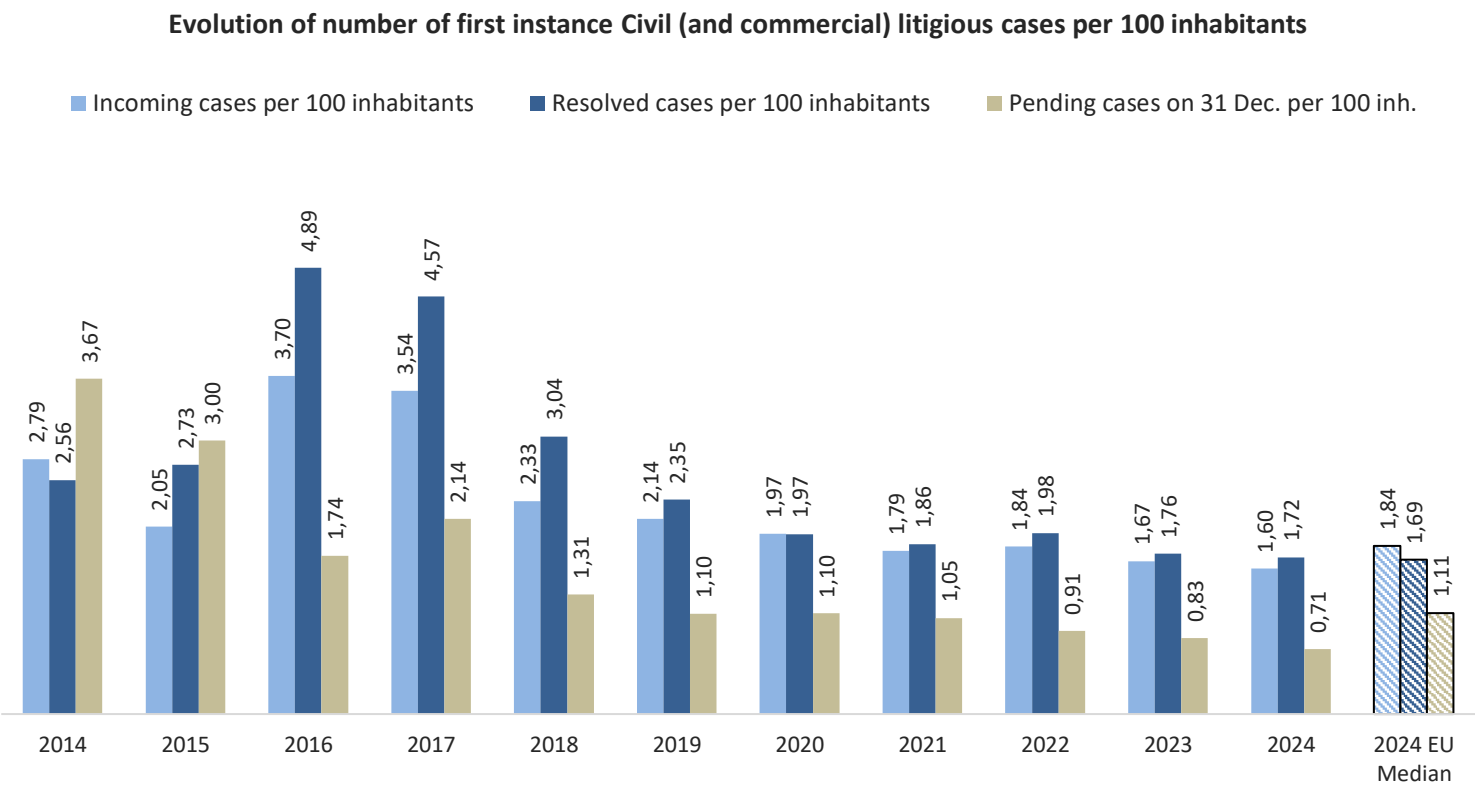
In administrative law cases, the clearance rate at first instance remains below the treshold (93.1%). By contrast, the Supreme Court records a very high clearance rate (133.9%), reflecting a strong capacity to resolve cases at that level. Disposition time at first instance is markedly longer than the EU median (860 days compared to 327 days). At Supreme Court level, disposition time (221 days) is broadly in line with the EU median (218 days). The fluctuation in the number of cases can be attributed to the judicial reform, as new administrative courts were established. Consequently, the judicial system is in the process of stabilization, which may have affected both the timing of the filing of applications to the courts and their processing.

In criminal law cases, clearance rates are close to or at treshold across all instances (99.7% at first instance, 100.5% at second instance, and 97.4% at the Supreme Court), indicating overall stability. Disposition time at first instance (136 days) is slightly longer than the EU median (128 days), while second-instance proceedings are considerably faster (49 days compared to 121 days). At Supreme Court level, disposition time (137 days) is moderately longer than the EU median (117 days).

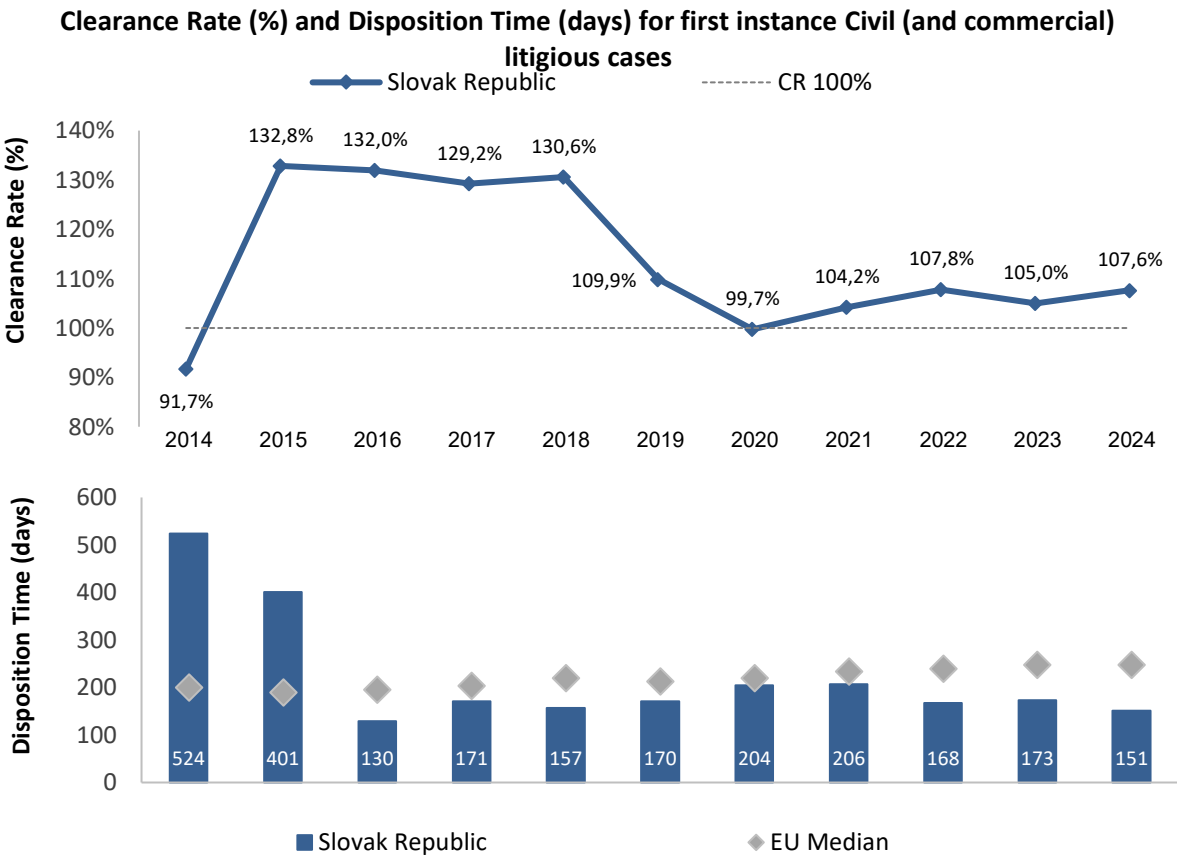

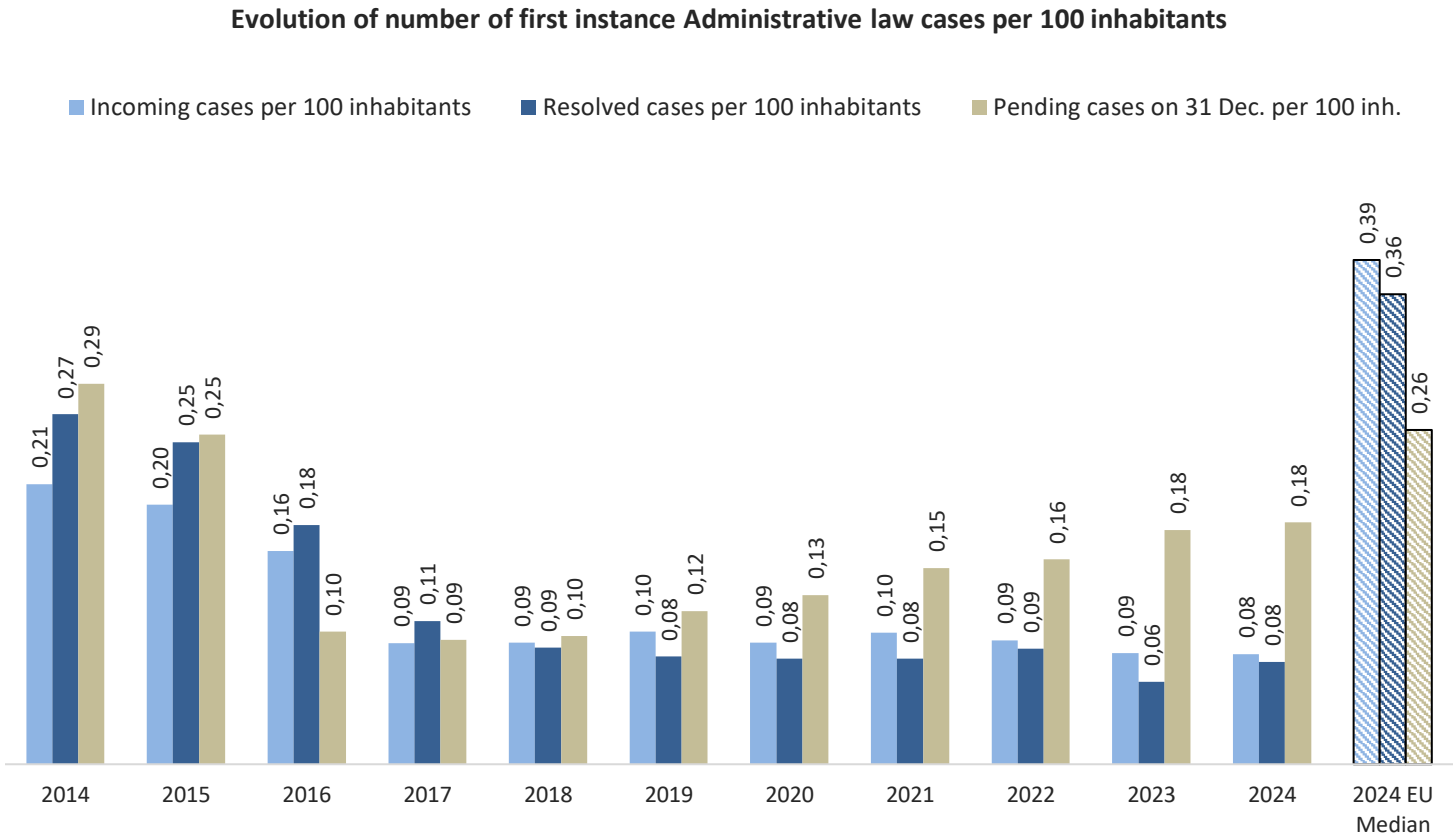

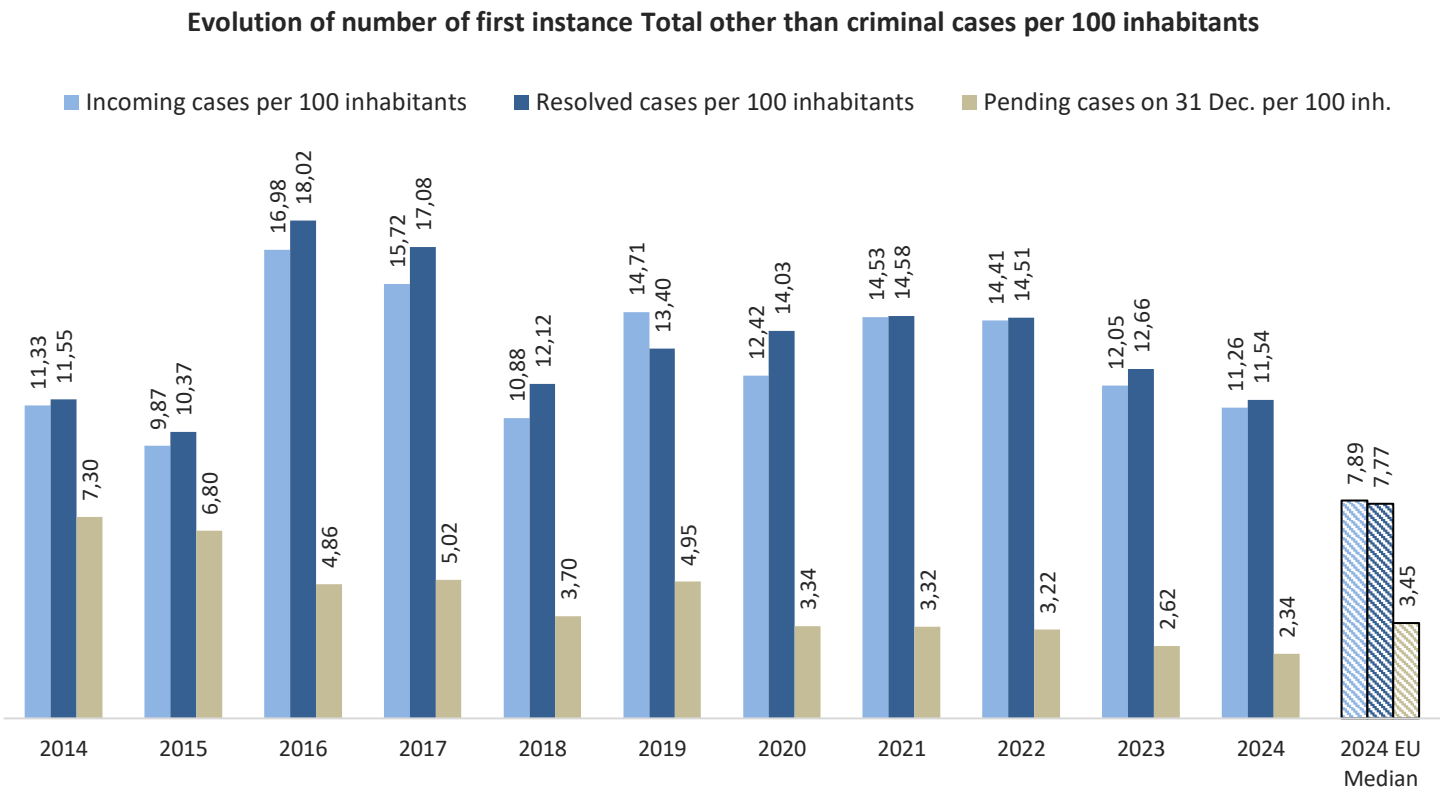

When interpreting trends in other than criminal cases, it should be noted that registry cases and other non-litigious business register matters are increasingly handled by notaries. The growing use of notaries for registering changes in commercial companies has led to a reduced inflow of such cases to courts. At the same time, courts continue to address legacy and irregular cases within the Business Register, including cases related to the non-fulfilment of statutory obligations in previous periods.

In addition, the decrease in the number of new non-litigious cases can be attributed to an improved ability to resolve matters already at first instance, as several procedural steps exist to facilitate reaching a solution before a case proceeds to the second instance. These structural factors should be taken into account when assessing developments in overall other than criminal court caseloads.

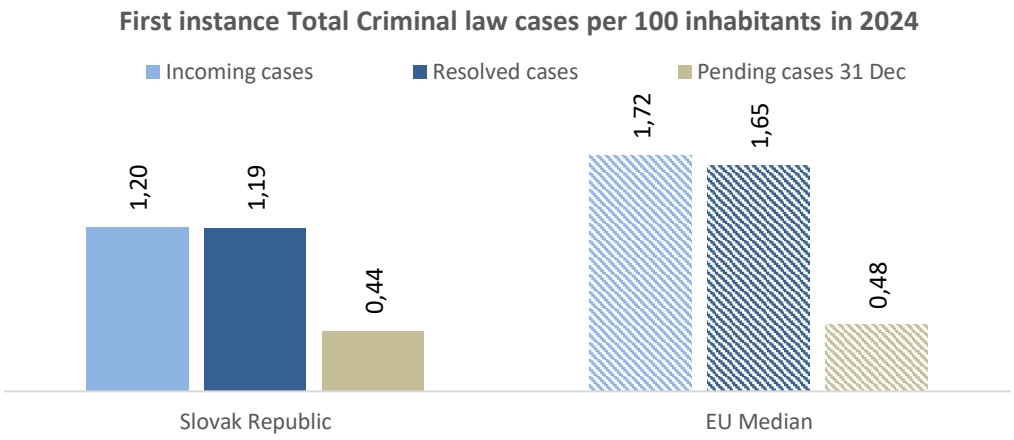

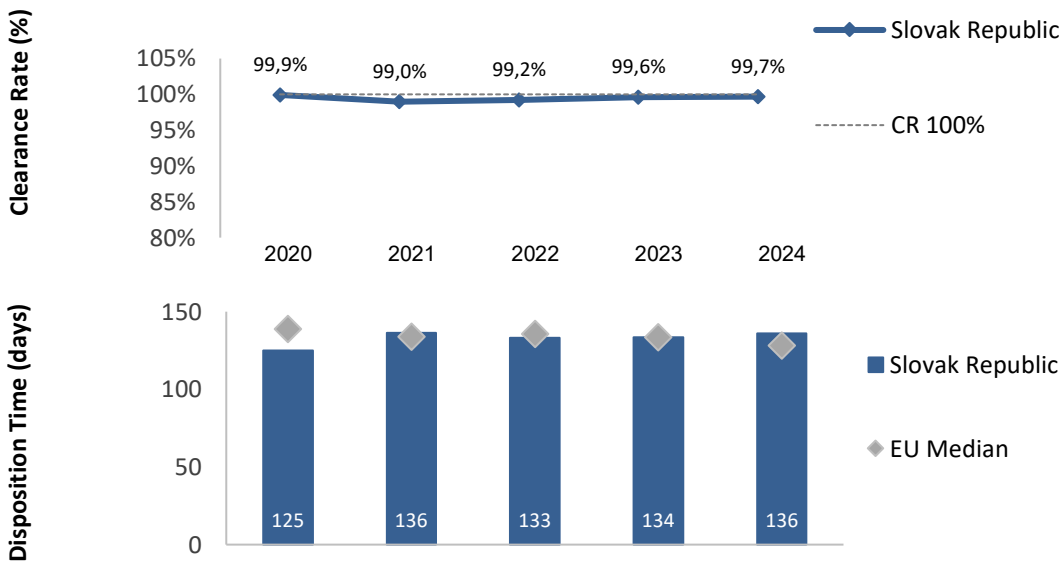

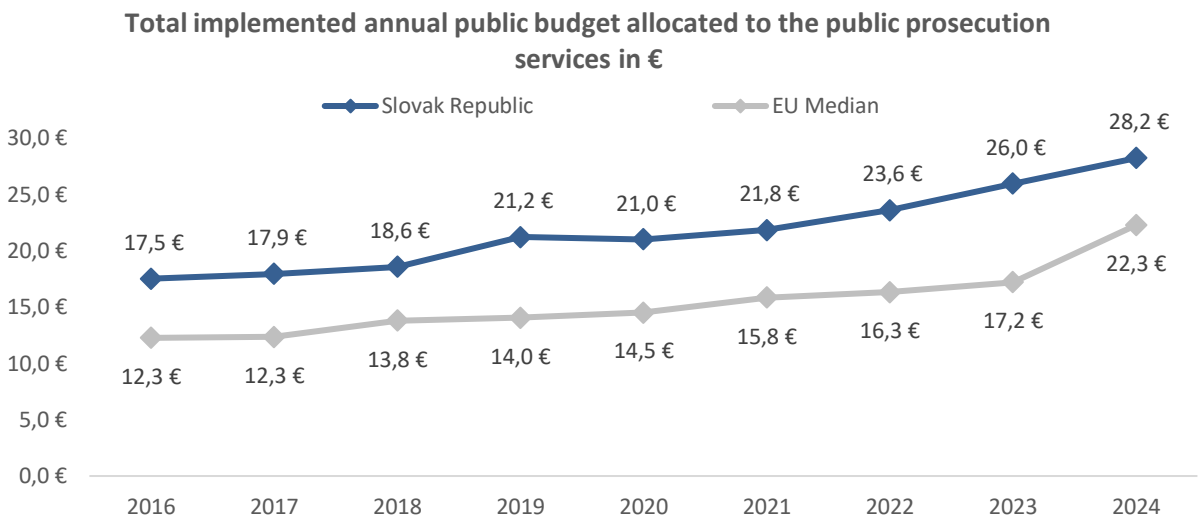

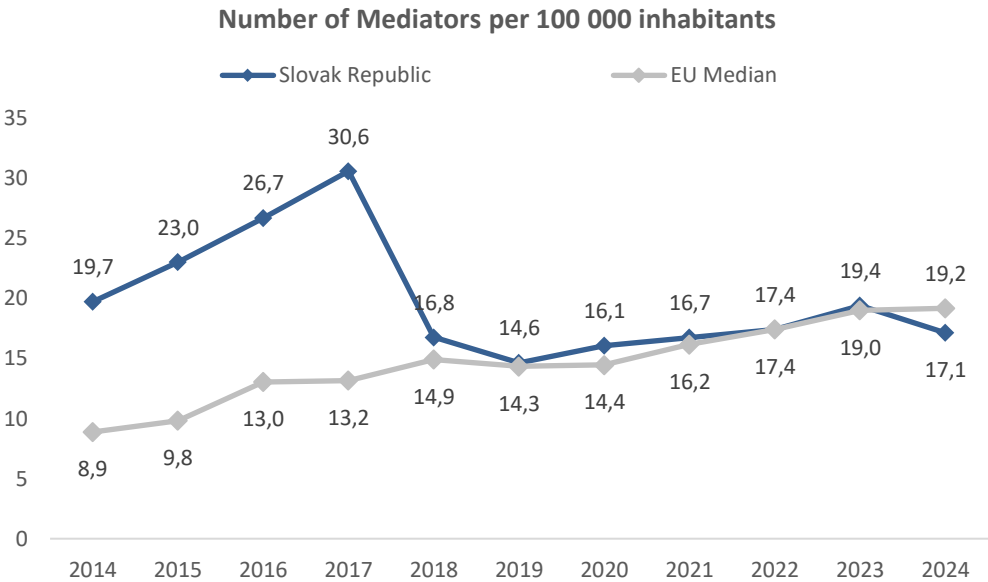

In 2024, there are 928 accredited or registered mediators who practise court related mediation which represents 17,1 accredited or registered mediators per 100 000 inhabitants.

The variation of the number of mediators between 2023 and 2024 is about -11,8%.

The decrease in the number of mediators in 2024 results from administrative proceedings conducted by the Ministry of Justice of the Slovak Republic, in which a significant number of mediators were removed from the official register pursuant to Section 5(f) of Act No. 420/2004 Coll. on Mediation and on the Amendment of Certain Acts. The removals concerned mediators who either failed to pass the repeated professional examination or did not take the examination within the statutory time limit.

The repeated professional examination is imposed pursuant to Section 10a(3) of the Mediation Act, due to the mediator's failure to participate in at least one professional seminar during the relevant year, which constitutes a mandatory element of continuing professional education for mediators.

Conditions for registration of natural persons in the register of mediators

The Ministry will register in the register of mediators any individual who:

- a. has full legal capacity,
- b. obtained a second-level university education at a university in the Slovak Republic, or has a recognized document of second-level university education issued by a foreign university,
- c. has a clean criminal record,
- d. has a certificate of successful completion of mediator training and completion of the mediator's professional exam, no older than six months after the exam was taken,
- e. was not removed from the register of mediators in accordance with the Act on Mediation other than at their own request.

Applicants seeking registration in the register of mediators are required to undergo professional training in accordance with Section 9 of the Act on Mediation. This training, lasting 200 hours, is designed to provide the necessary qualifications for performing mediation activities. Upon completing the professional training, applicants must take a professional exam within three months. The exam assesses their professional knowledge, abilities, and skills. If an applicant fails the exam, they may retake it within one month without repeating the training. However, if they fail the re-examination or an examination conducted by the Ministry, they must repeat the training before reapplying, with the earliest opportunity being one year after the failed re-examination.

The Ministry does not charge a fee for registration; however, a fee may be applied if the application is submitted through a single point of contact. If all conditions for registration are met, the Ministry completes the registration within 30 days and issues a written certificate of registration. If the Ministry fails to make an entry or rejects the request within this period, the registration is considered complete unless the enrolment conditions have not been met. In such cases, the confirmation of receipt of the application serves as a temporary certificate of registration until the official certificate is issued.

Act No. 323/1993 Coll. on Notaries and Notarial Activities regulates the legal status and functions of notaries. Notaries are appointed by the Minister of Justice through a selection procedure to perform public office within the territorial jurisdiction of a court of first instance, generally until the age of 67. Although notaries exercise public authority, they are not part of the state administration; they act independently and impartially, are bound only by the Constitution and applicable laws, and are subject to state supervision by the Minister of Justice. The State regulates notarial activities, self-governance, and the number of notarial offices. The notarial office is incompatible with entrepreneurial or other gainful activities, except for limited permitted activities, and notaries may not act as experts in cases where they serve as court commissioners.

Comments on recording of court hearings

In 2015, courtrooms were equipped with recording technology. These recordings are part of the electronic court file. The application "Audiorecording" is used to process multimedia recordings created during hearings in individual courtrooms. The Audio Recordings Client application (formerly MonoReCourt) is used for processing multimedia recordings produced during hearings in individual courtrooms.
