






Gross salaries of judges and prosecutors vs average annual salary in 2022






Disposition Time by instance and by matter in 2022 (days)


According to 2022 data, there are 63 courts of general jurisdiction and 2 specialised courts (legal entities).

The total number of courts as geographic locations is 65.

It's worth noting that Slovak Republic, which has a system with first, second, and third instances for most cases, adopts a two-tier system for administrative cases. The new Supreme Administrative Court, introduced in 2021, has been positioned as an appellate court for administrative cases, handling appeals from lower administrative courts.




A new Supreme Administrative Court of the Slovak Republic, was established from January 1, 2021 by Constitutional Act No. 422/2020. It is counted amongst the specialised jurisdiction legal entities.

According to the methodology explained in the Explanatory Note, the Constitutional Court is not counted in the legal entities. In Slovak Republic, the Constitutional Court can deal with some rare individual cases.




In 2020 the provided number of specialised courts changed from 9 to 1 because of a better understanding of the question. In Slovak Republic there are 8 administrative courts in fact, but they cannot be considered as legal entities as they are part of the regional courts, and they are already counted in the number of general jurisdiction courts.

Distribution of first instance general jurisdiction and specialised courts



The distribution between first instance general jurisdiction courts and first instance specialised courts in Slovak Republic is 98,2% - 1,8% (distribution tendency in EU: 72,8% - 27,2%).

Slovak Republic has the highest number of general jurisdiction courts in relation to specialised courts.

In the Slovak court system, there are 8 Regional courts that possess dual jurisdiction. These Regional courts function as appellate courts with comprehensive authority in civil, commercial, and criminal cases. In the realm of appellate procedures, they adjudicate on appeals lodged against the rulings of all 54 District courts situated within their respective local jurisdictions. Concurrently, the Regional courts exercise jurisdiction as the primary courts in administrative matters, effectively serving as administrative courts.

The Specialised Criminal Court holds competence in adjudicating grave criminal cases explicitly delineated in § 14 of the Criminal Procedure Code. These cases encompass offenses such as premeditated murder, corruption, terrorism, organised crime, severe economic crimes, and actions detrimental to the financial interests of the European Union, among others.


The highest instances within the Slovak judiciary are the Supreme Court, the Supreme Administrative Court, and the Constitutional Court.






According to 2022 data, the total number of professional judges sitting in courts (all instances) in Slovak Republic is 1 397, which is 0,8% more than in previous cycle.

More precisely, in Slovak Republic, there are 25,7 professional judges per 100 000 inhabitants (this figure is above the EU median of 22,9 judges per 100 000 inhabitants).



In this cycle, the total number of female professional judges (all instances) is 889, which represents 63,6% of the total number of judges.

The total number of judges is distributed among the different judicial instances in the following way: 917 are sitting in the first instance courts (of which 599 are female); 400 are sitting in the second instance courts (of which 245 are female) and 80 are sitting at the Supreme Court (of which 45 are female).


Compared with the EU, the distribution of professional judges presents a relatively higher percentage in second and third instances.

It should be specified that, in this particular year following the introduction of the new Supreme Administrative Court, the distribution of administrative judges per instance is made based on the instance level of the court where they work and not based on the instance of the cases for which they are responsible of, which impacts the proportions.

In Slovak Republic, the distribution of judges by categories of cases is possible as presented in the graph on the right.

When comparing the data presented in the table right above with the previous one, a discrepancy of 11 judges in the overall count comes to light. It is imperative to clarify that the Slovak Republic used a different methodology for these two questions. In the second, it involved calculating an annual average for the number of judges per matter, instead of the critical moment of 31st of December.



Distribution of court presidents by gender and by instance in Slovak Republic




In this cycle, the total number of female court presidents (all instances) is 23, which represents 37,7% of the total number of court presidents.

The total number of court presidents is distributed among the different judicial instances in the following way: 51 are sitting in first instance courts (of which 19 are female); 8 are sitting in second instance courts (of which 4 are female) and 2 are sitting in Supreme Court (none of them are female).

In 2022, Slovak Republic has 4 642 non-judge staff (of which 3 909 are Female). The total number of non-judge staff in comparison with the previous cycle reveals an increase of 6,4%.

In 2022, the number of non-judge staff per 100 000 inhabitants has increased (from 80,2 in 2021 to 85,5 in 2022).

During the same period, the number of judges per 100 000 inhabitants evolved from 25,5 judges per 100 000 inhabitants in 2021 to 25,7 in 2022.

In this cycle, the non-judge staff is broken down as follows:


- 1 061 Rechtspfleger (or similar bodies) with judicial or quasi-judicial tasks having autonomous competence and whose decisions could be subject to appeal (among which 755 are Female);
- 2 167 non-judge staff whose task is to assist the judges such as registrars (of which 2 108 are Female);
- 1 398 staff in charge of different administrative tasks and of the court management (of which 1 045 are Female);
- 16 technical staff (of which 1 is Female);

It can be observed that there is a very high proportion of females in these positions.

Professional judges and non-judge staff per 100 000 inhabitants, and their ratio




In Slovak Republic, there are 25,7 professional judges per 100 000 inhabitants (this figure is above the EU median of 22,9 judges per 100 000 inhabitants) and about 3,3 non-judge staff per judge. There has been a significant increase compared with previous cycle when this ratio was at 3,1 non-judge staff per judge.



Evolution of the ratio between professional judges and non-judge staff

In this cycle, the total number of female prosecutors (all instances) is 516, which represents 50,9% of the total number of prosecutors.

The total number of prosecutors is distributed among the different judicial instances in the following way: 684 in first instance (of which 370 are female); 213 are in second instance (of which 96 are female) and 117 in final instance (of which 50 are female).


As regards the methodology of presentation of data in respect of the number of public prosecutors, it should be noticed that the number of prosecutors at the Supreme Court level also includes prosecutors of the Special Prosecution Bureau. The latter deals with crimes of corruption and the most severe offences including organised crime. It intervenes in first instance, but acts as an organisational part of the General Prosecutor's Office

As regards the distribution of the number of prosecutors among the different judicial instances, Slovak Republic has a relatively lower percentage of prosecutors in first instance and a relatively higher percentage of prosecutors at the Supreme Court.


In this cycle, the total number of female Heads of prosecution (all instances) is 27, which represents 42,9% of the total number of Heads of prosecution.


Non-prosecutor staff by gender






In 2022, there are 6 430 lawyers, which is -0,6% less than in 2021.
There are 2 737 female lawyers which is 43% of the total.

Slovak Republic has 118,4 lawyers per 100 000 inhabitants, which is below the EU median of 132,1 lawyers per 100 000 inhabitants.

In the European Union, the absolute gross salary for a judge at the beginning of career ranges from a minimum of 26 931€ to a maximum of 140 244€.

According to 2022 data, the absolute gross salary of a judge at the beginning of his/her career in Slovak Republic is 45 775€, which is slightly below the EU median of 54 224€ (-16% below).

Compared with the annual average salary in the country, the salary for a judge at the beginning of his/her career is 2,9 times higher (the EU median is 1,9).

At the highest level, the range of the EU absolute gross salary for a judge is from 53 144€ to 261 648€. Slovak Republic's absolute gross salaries for judges at the highest level is -38% below the EU median of 106 533€.

For the public prosecutors, the range for the absolute gross salary at the beginning of career is from a minimum of 24 609€ to a maximum of 96 084€.

In 2022, the absolute gross salary of a public prosecutor at the beginning of his/her career in Slovak Republic of 42 249€ is slightly below the EU median of 48 728€ (-13% below).

Compared with the annual average salary in the country, the salary for a public prosecutors at the beginning of his/her career is 2,7 times higher (the EU median is 1,7).

At the highest level, the minimum absolute gross salary for prosecutors in the European Union is 44 880€ and the maximum is 194 005€. Slovak Republic's absolute gross salaries for prosecutors at the highest level is -29% below the EU median of 87 247€.

The figures mentioned represent the fundamental gross salaries of judges and prosecutors, exclusive of any bonuses and supplements. According to the Act on Judges (No. 385/2000 Coll.), a judge's average monthly salary is equivalent to that of a Member of Parliament. At the outset of their careers, judges receive 90% of this salary. Judges serving in the Supreme Court receive a monthly salary equal to 130% of a Member of Parliament's salary. Judges are entitled to two additional monthly salaries, provided they meet the conditions specified by law. The annual average salary total mentioned in this questionnaire considers 14 months of salaries.

All bonuses and supplements are defined by law. Specific supplements are allocated to judges of the Specialised Criminal Court and judges of the Supreme Court who adjudicate on appeals against the decisions of the Specialised Criminal Court. The actual net salary depends on various individual factors such as the number of children and participation in voluntary pension security schemes, among others.

Similar regulations apply to the salaries of prosecutors (Act on Prosecutors and Trainee Prosecutors No. 154/2001 Coll.). The average salary of a prosecutor is on par with that of a judge. Newly appointed prosecutors receive 85% of this salary, while prosecutors at the General Prosecutor's Office earn a salary equivalent to that of a Supreme Court judge. Prosecutors are also entitled to two additional monthly salaries. Supplements for heads of prosecutor offices mirror those for court presidents at the corresponding level. Prosecutors at the Special Prosecutor's Office are entitled to the same supplement as judges at the Specialised Criminal Court.

Nevertheless, it can be expounded here that compensations for excessive length of proceedings may be granted by the Constitutional Court when it determines a violation of the right to a trial within a reasonable time. On the other hand, compensation for wrongful arrest or conviction, as well as the non-enforcement of court decisions, can be sought through civil proceedings. Individuals who have suffered harm can pursue compensation from the state under the provisions of the Act on State Liability for Damage Resulting from the Exercise of Public Power.





In Slovak Republic, in first instance, civil and commercial litigious cases are resolved faster than the EU median while the DT in second instance coincides with the median. As regards administrative cases, the disposition time is significantly higher than the median. Criminal law cases are resolved faster than the EU median. In 2022, Slovak judges resolved less cases than received (Clearance rate is below 100%) for civil and commercial litigious cases second instance and administrative cases.



















In Slovak Republic, there is a system of internal review of courts. Internal review of the court is a type of control of the court and judges, which aims to verify the current state of the judiciary, to identify the causes of shortcomings in the performance of the judiciary and to propose measures to eliminate them. The internal review is carried out by designated departments, which are made up of judges.
