2.1.B. Register comprises of three interconnected parts than contain basic, protection and presentation data on immovable, movable and intangible heritage. Registered data are public, except data on heritage owners, data on the location of archaeological sites, where there is a risk of prohibited search for archaeological remains, and other data, which would in case of disclosure endanger the existence of heritage.

2.1.C. Procedural implication of the Register: the entry of an individual heritage unit in the Register does not have any legal consequences, since registered heritage (which does not have a monument status) is only indirectly protected. The protection of registered heritage is implemented through directing interventions in heritage, when a spatial act determines the obligation to acquire culture-protection consensus for an intervention in heritage.

2.1.D. The Ministry of Culture, The Cultural Heritage Directorate is responsible for managing the central Register (inventory) of cultural heritage. The Institute for the Protection of Cultural Heritage of Slovenia is in charge of entering the data in the register in accordance with all regulations.

2.1.F. The Register was expanded by other levels in the GIS database and is connected with other database (documentation database, database on legal protection of monuments, etc.). Since 2008, the on line GIS register version has been upgraded with data on legal regimes of protection, the so called eVRD.

2.3.A. Registered immovable heritage can due to its exceptional significance for the state, landscape or municipality be listed as cultural monument. Immovable monument can be listed as individual monument or historic site. Cultural monuments of local interest are proclaimed based on the proposition of the Institute for the Protection of Cultural Heritage of Slovenia by the municipal council, while cultural monuments of state interest are proclaimed by the Government.

When certain registered heritage has monument value and there is a risk that the value will be derogated or destroyed, the Ministry of Culture adopts a decision on temporary listing as a monument. At the same time, time-limited listing is accompanied by a procedure for the preparation of a proposition for the permanent listing of the cultural monument.

Heritage protection area is the area with uniform features of cultural heritage, which is an important part of spatial planning due to its value and developmental potentials. These areas are determined with the purpose to conserve heritage, prevent its destruction and derogation of its values in the environment. The Institute for the Protection of Cultural Heritage of Slovenia prepares propositions for determining the areas, the Ministry of Culture implements the procedure of determination of these areas with the aim to protect and determine detailed protection guidelines.

Professionally identified and registered archaeological remain becomes cultural heritage.
