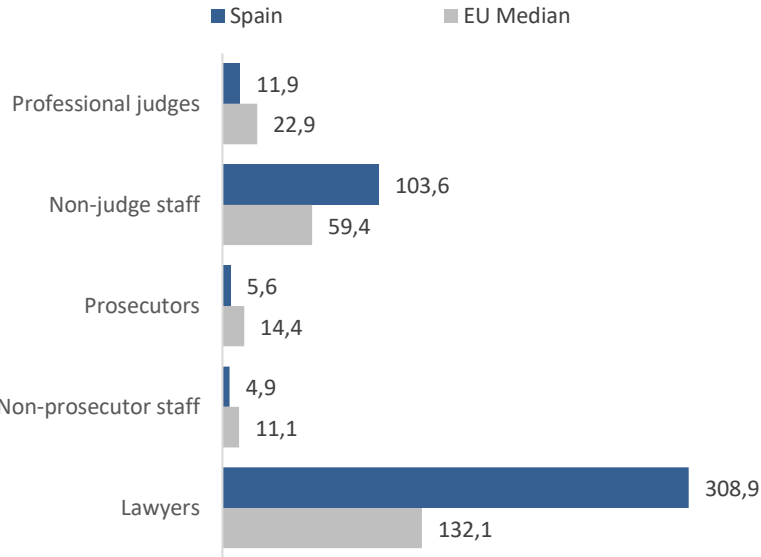

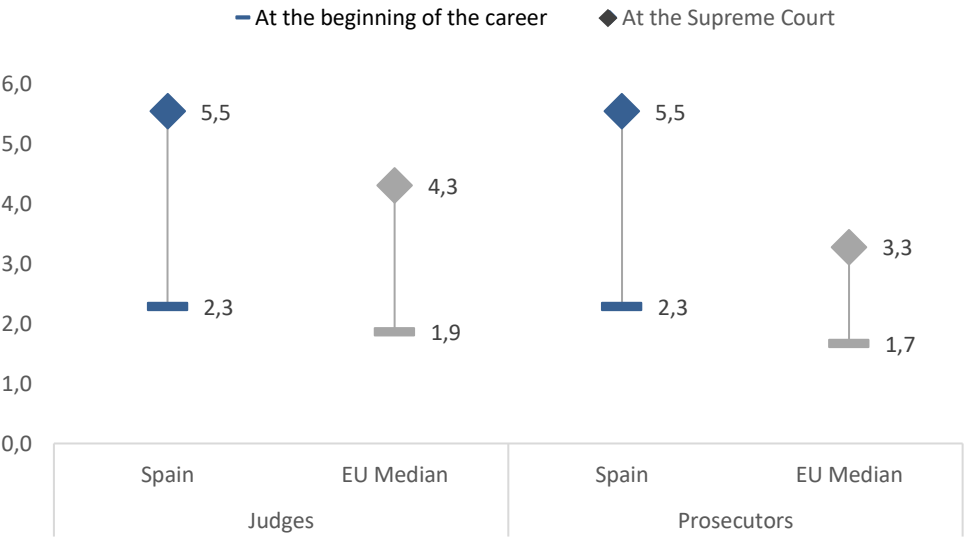

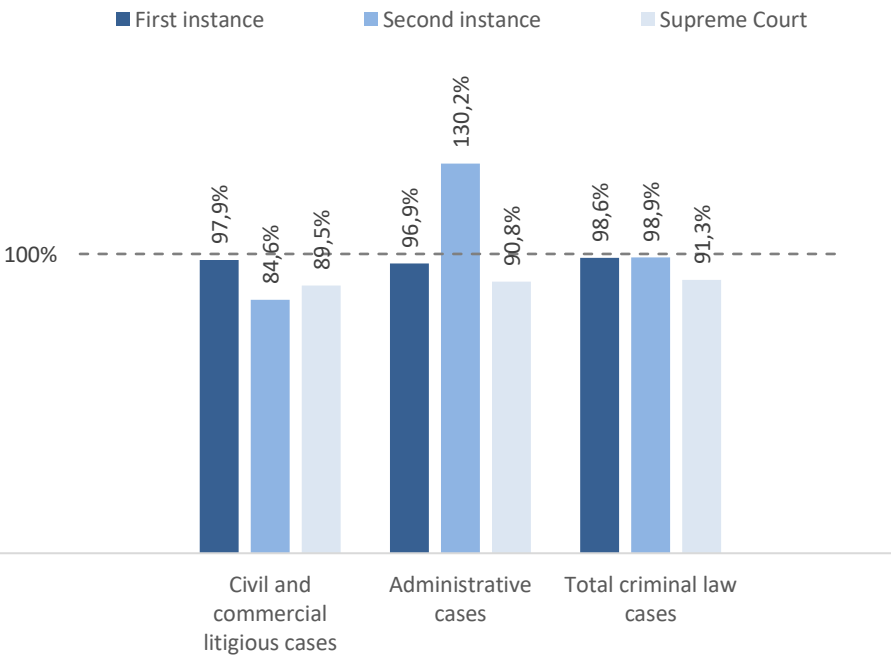


Gross salaries of judges and prosecutors vs average annual salary in 2022

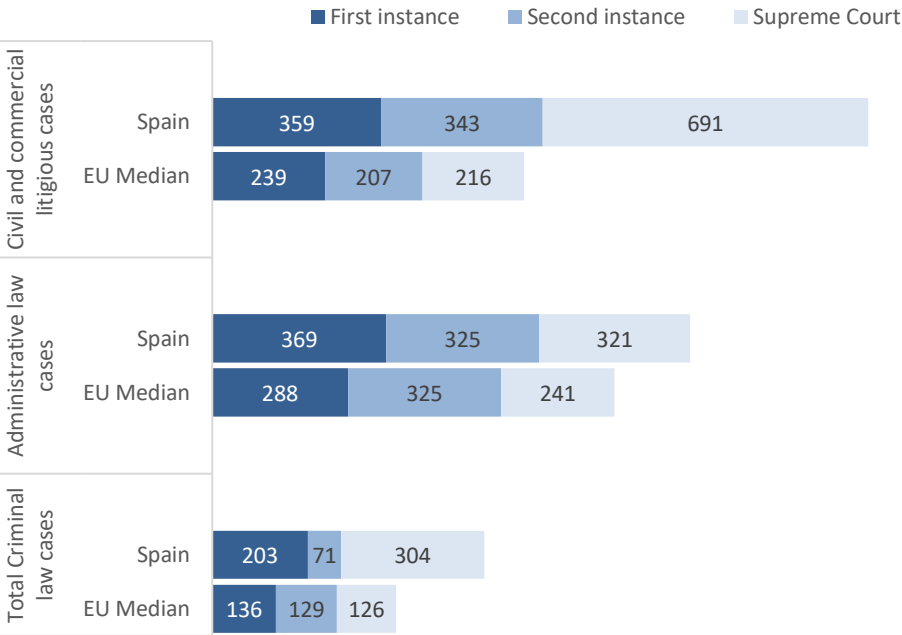

Clearance Rate by instance and by matter in 2022 (%)

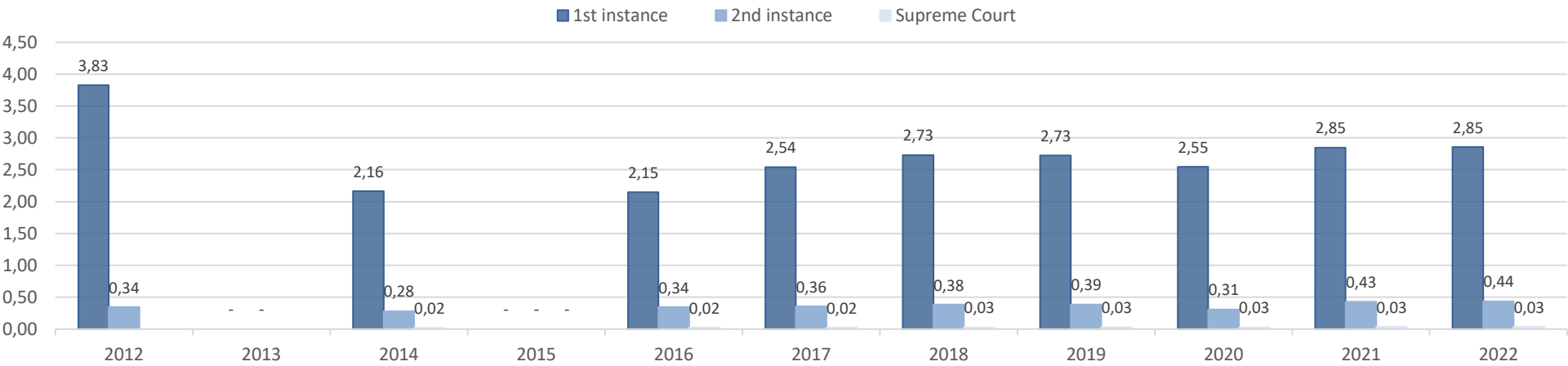


Disposition Time by instance and by matter in 2022 (days)

1. Judicial organisation in Spain (2022 data)

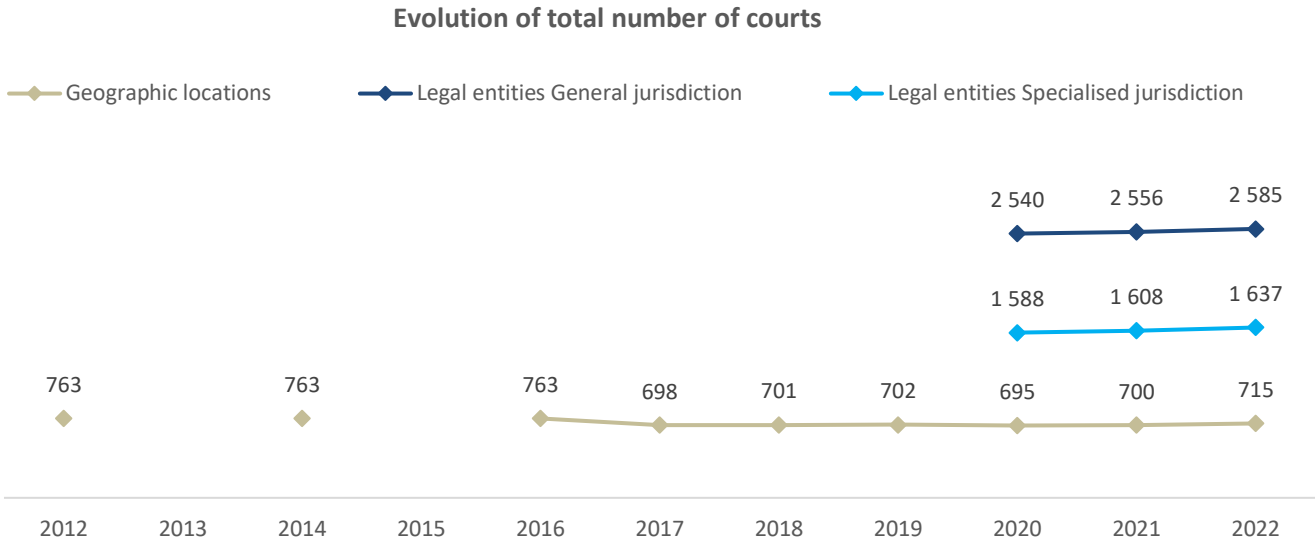
In Spain, there are 2585 courts of general jurisdiction and 1637 courts of specialised jurisdiction.

As a general rule, the first instance are unipersonal courts (one judge-courts). Courts counted as first Instance are Courts of first instance (civil), Courts of First Instance and Instruction (civil and criminal), Family Courts (Civil) and Courts of Mortgage Enforcement.

Courts counted as second instance general jurisdiction are Sections of the Provincial Courts (except special sections) and Civil and Criminal Chambers of the Superior Courts of Justice of the Autonomous Regions.

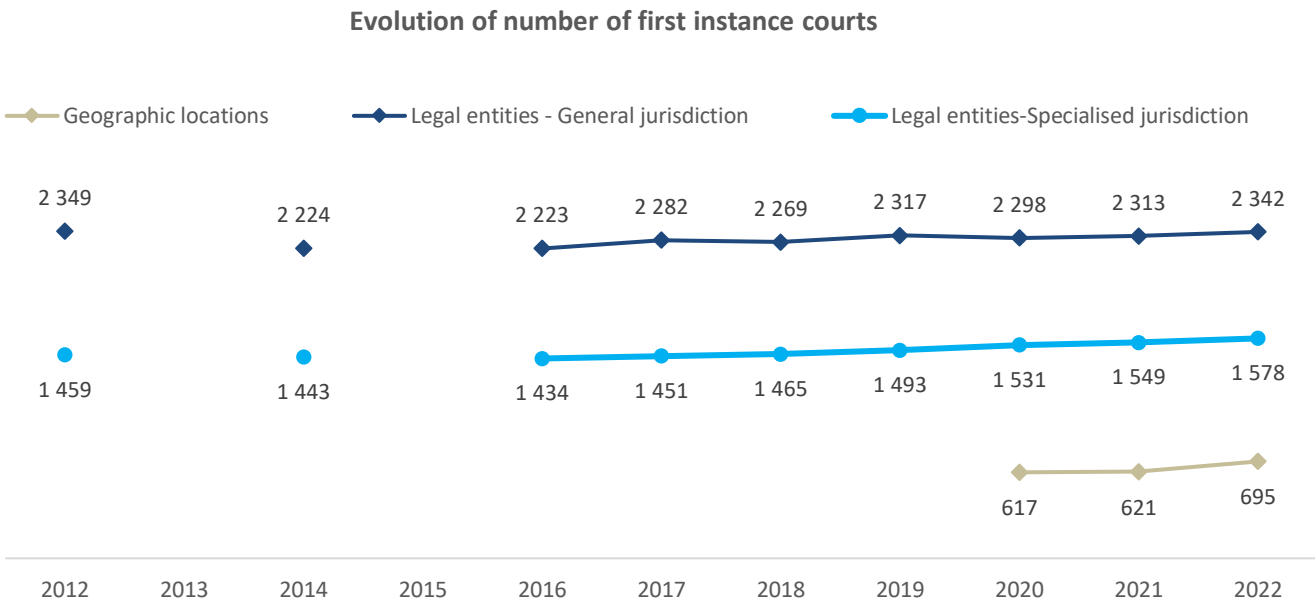

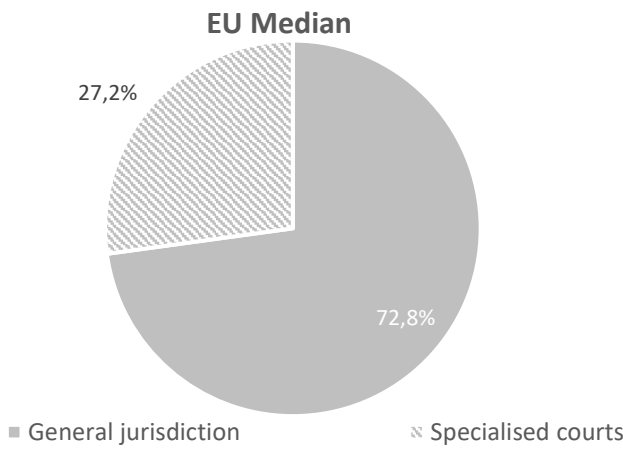
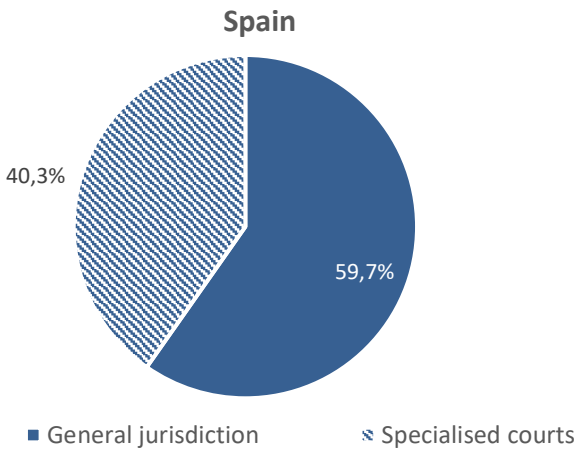

The Arbitration Court was created by decision of the General Council of the Judiciary of 25 November 2010 which assigns exclusive jurisdiction over arbitration matters to the Court of First Instance No. 101 of Madrid. This measure seeks to foster the development of uniform criteria in court proceedings for the assistance and control of arbitration in Madrid. In Spain, there are two types of specialization: Special Jurisdictions established by Organic Law (Violence against women, Commercial, for example), and the possibility for GCJ to determine that in some places, a general jurisdiction Court (Civil) is focused in some kind of cases.

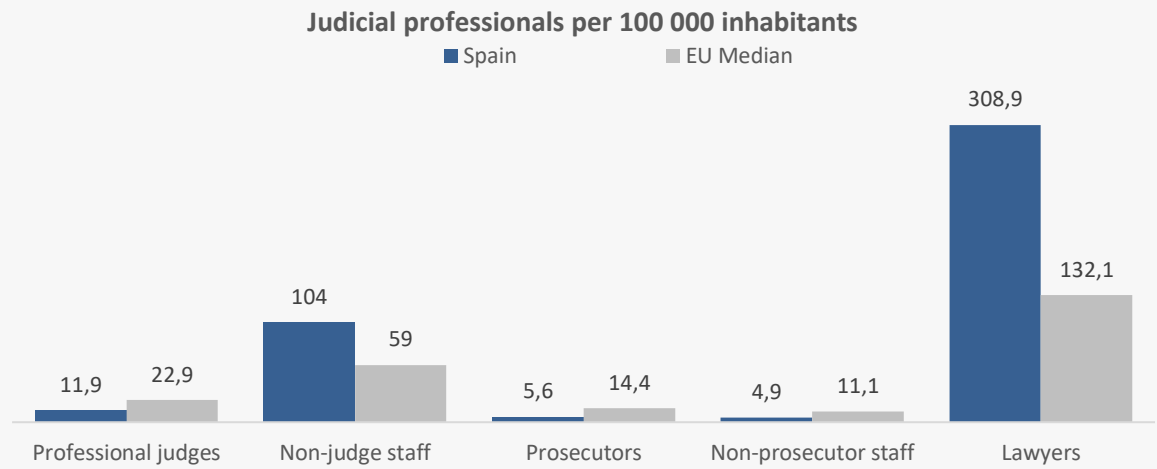
Other specialised courts include: Courts Labour specialised in enforcement, Courts on enforcement of Arbitration, Civil Registry, Courts on Penitentiary Surveillance, Courts for mortgage enforcement, Courts on capacity of persons, Criminal Courts of Violence against Women, other courts.

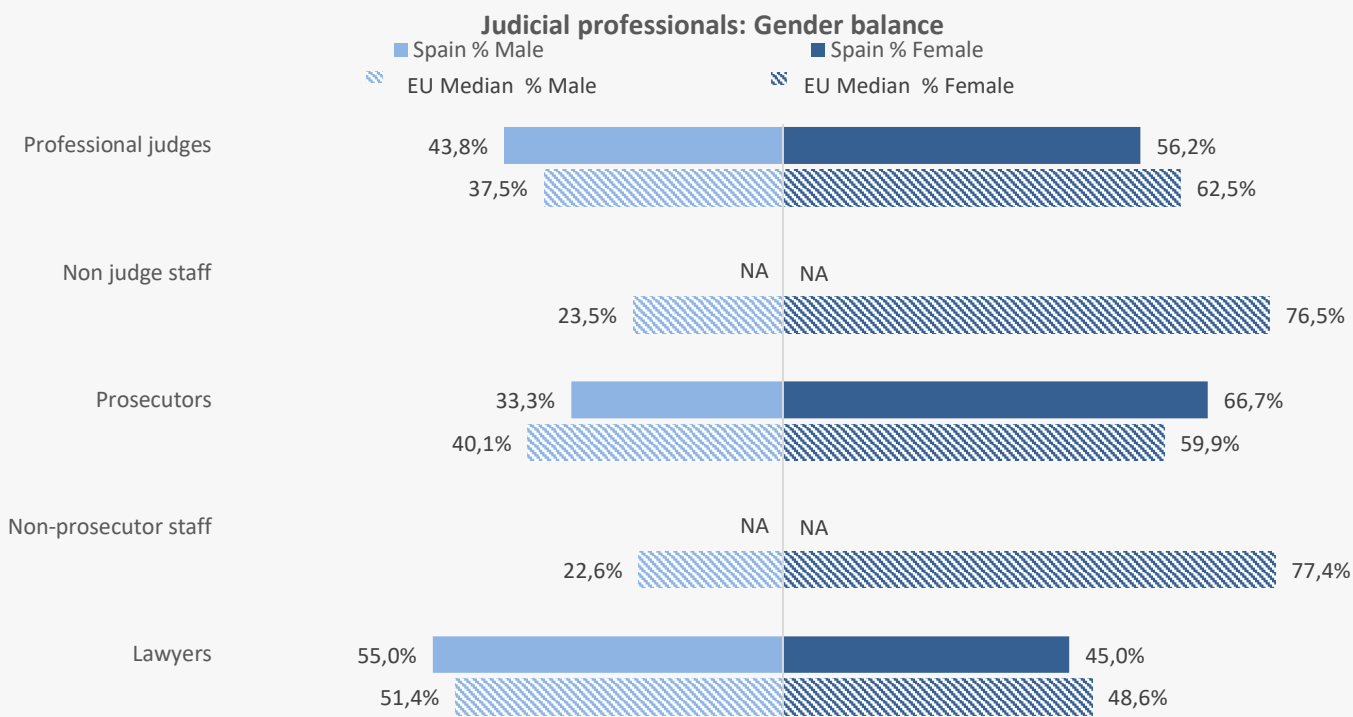

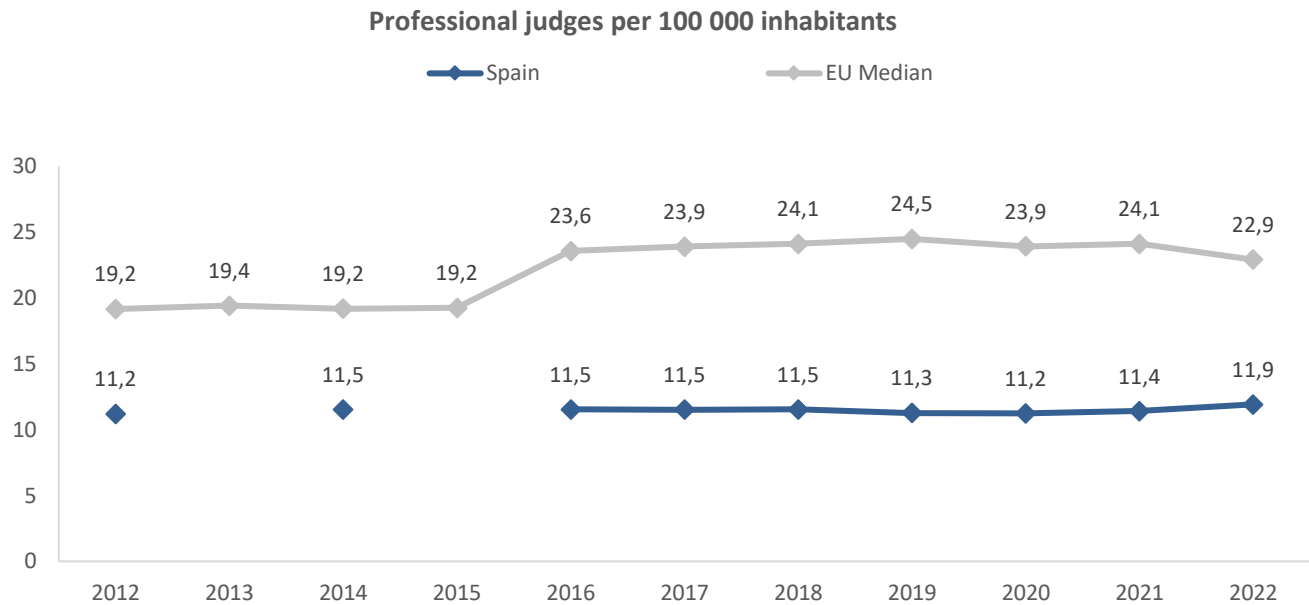

According to 2022 data, the total number of professional judges sitting in courts (all instances) in Spain is 5 728, which is 5,9% more than in previous cycle.

More precisely, in Spain, there are 11,92 professional judges per 100 000 inhabitants (this figure is below the EU median of 22,92 judges per 100 000 inhabitants).

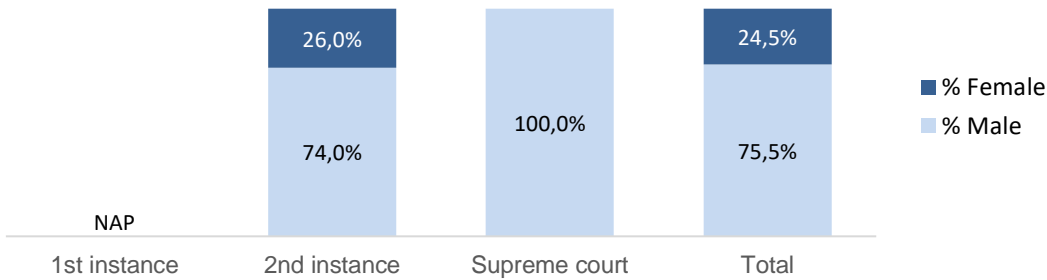

Distribution of court presidents by gender and by instance in Spain



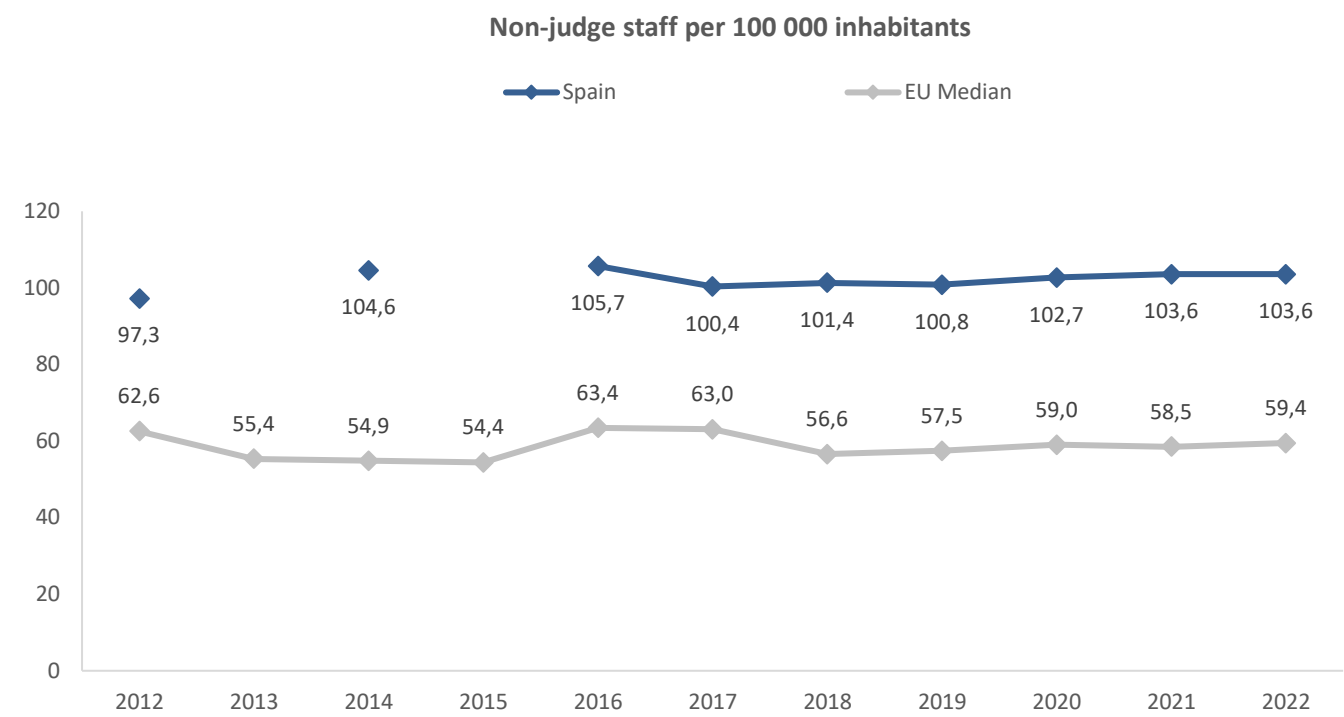
In this cycle, the total number of female court presidents (all instances) is 25, which represents 25,0% of the total number of court presidents.

The total number of court presidents is distributed among the different judicial instances in the following way: there are no court presidents in first instance courts (NAP); 96 are sitting in second instance courts (of which 25 are female) and 6 are sitting in Supreme Court (none of them are female).

It should be noted that in the Spanish justice system, there are no presidents of first instance courts because they are composed of a single judge.

In 2022, Spain has 49 802 non-judge staff (of which number of Female is not available). The total number of non-judge staff in comparison with the previous cycle reveals an increase of 1,4%.

In 2022, the number of non-judge staff per 100 000 inhabitants has remained the same (103,6).

During the same period, the number of judges per 100 000 inhabitants evolved from 11,4 judges per 100 000 inhabitants in 2021 to 11,9 in 2022.

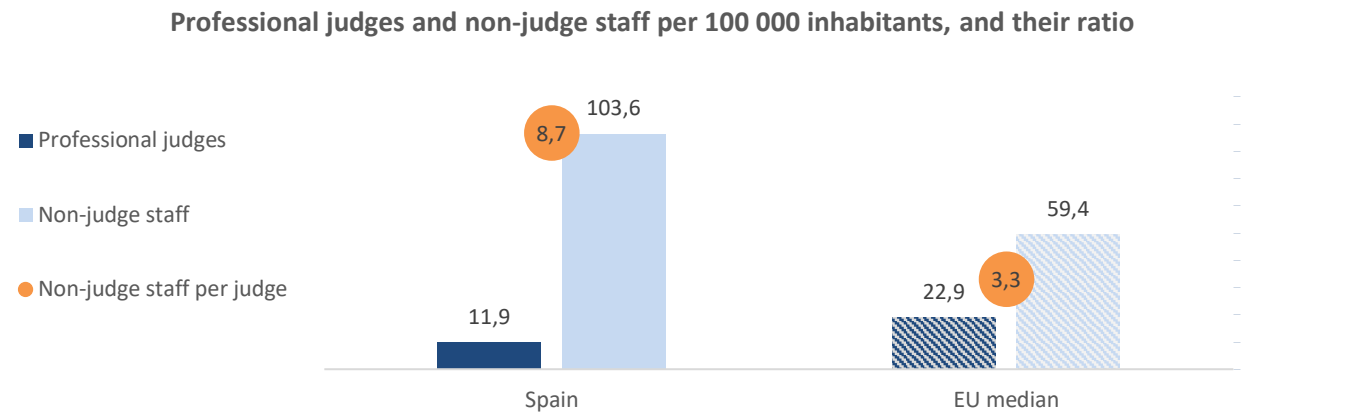
- In this cycle, the non-judge staff is broken down as follows:
- 4 470 Rechtspfleger (or similar bodies) with judicial or quasi-judicial tasks having autonomous competence and whose decisions could be subject to appeal (among which 3 123 are Female);
 - 45 332 other (of which none are Female).

The Spanish judicial system distinguishes between three categories of non-judicial staff: Gestor Procesal, Tramitador Procesal and Auxilio Judicial. It is very difficult to distribute them in the categories in the table because the three groups have functions to assist Judges, make administrative tasks and have technical tasks. The sum of this staff designated to courts is provided in the category 'Other non-judge staff.

In addition to this staff, there are 1155 Forensic Doctors.

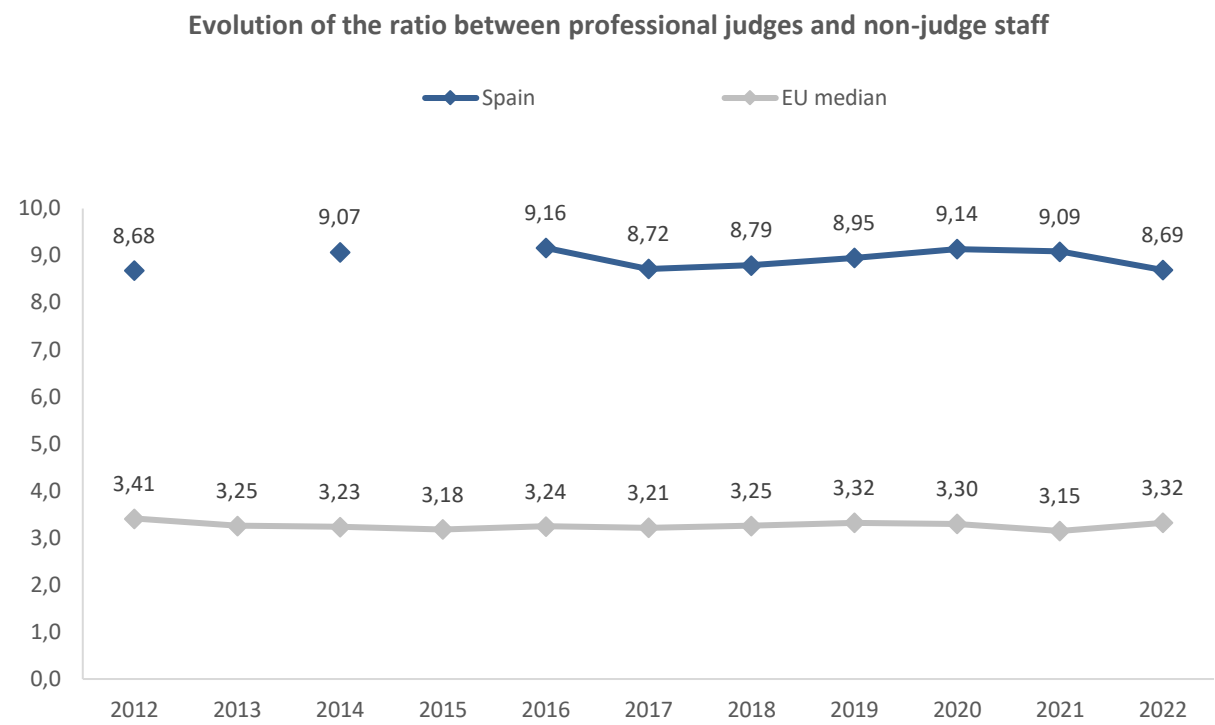

In Spain, there are 11,92 professional judges per 100 000 inhabitants (this figure is below the EU median of 22,92 judges per 100 000 inhabitants) and about 8,69 non-judge staff per judge. There is no significant difference compared with previous cycle when this ratio was at 9,09 non-judge staff per judge.

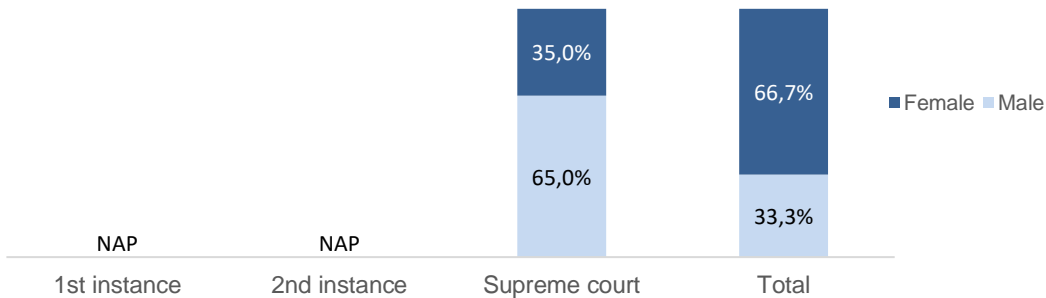

In this cycle, the total number of female prosecutors (all instances) is 1 788, which represents 66,7% of the total number of prosecutors.

As regards the distribution of the number of prosecutors among the different judicial instances, Spain presents some peculiarities which should be mentioned. The structure of the Prosecution services does not distinguish prosecutors by 'instance level'. However, it distinguishes three categories in Article 34 of Law 50/1981, (Organic Statute of the Public Prosecutor's Office) :
1st Chamber Prosecutors of the Supreme Court, equal to Magistrates of the High Court. The Deputy Prosecutor of the Supreme Court will be considered the President of the Chamber.
2nd Prosecutors, equated to Magistrates.
3rd Lawyers-Prosecutors, equated to Judges.

As regards the gender distribution among these three categories of prosecutors, the following numbers should be noted: The first category ("Fiscales de Sala") Chamber Prosecutors: Total 40, Males 26, Females 14 (this category includes the Prosecutors of chamber of Supreme Court).
Second. "Fiscal": Total 1908, Males 704, Females 1204
Third: "Abogado-Fiscal": Total 771, Males 187, Females 584.
Furthermore, it has to be specified that females represent majority in the total number of prosecutors (66,7% female prosecutors compared to 33,3% of male prosecutors). However, it is noteworthy that in the final instance there are only 35% of females (14 out 40 prosecutors).

In this cycle, the total number of female Heads of prosecution (all instances) is 42, which represents 48,3% of the total number of Heads of prosecution.

As regards the distribution of the number of heads of prosecution among the different judicial instances, Spain presents some peculiarities which should be mentioned. The structure of the Prosecutor's body is adapted to the territorial division of Spain in Autonomous Regions and Provinces, so the categories in the CEPEJ questionnaire are note applicable to this national system. The Spanish structure distinguishes Heads of offices of the Autonomous Region, Heads of offices of Province, Heads of offices of area.

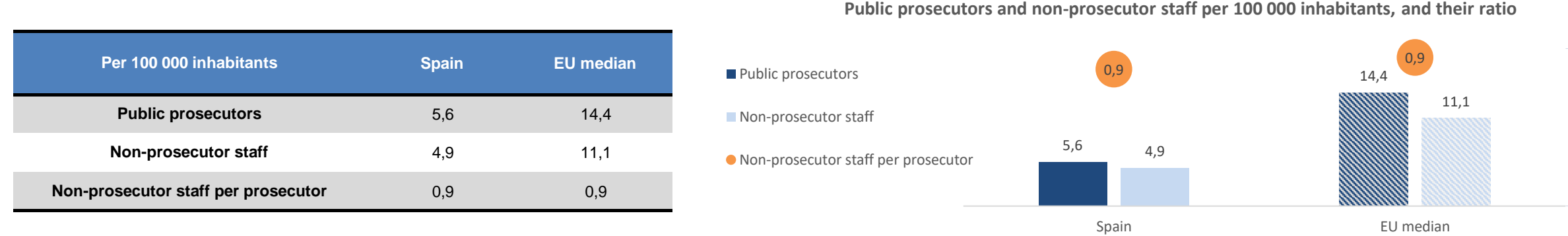

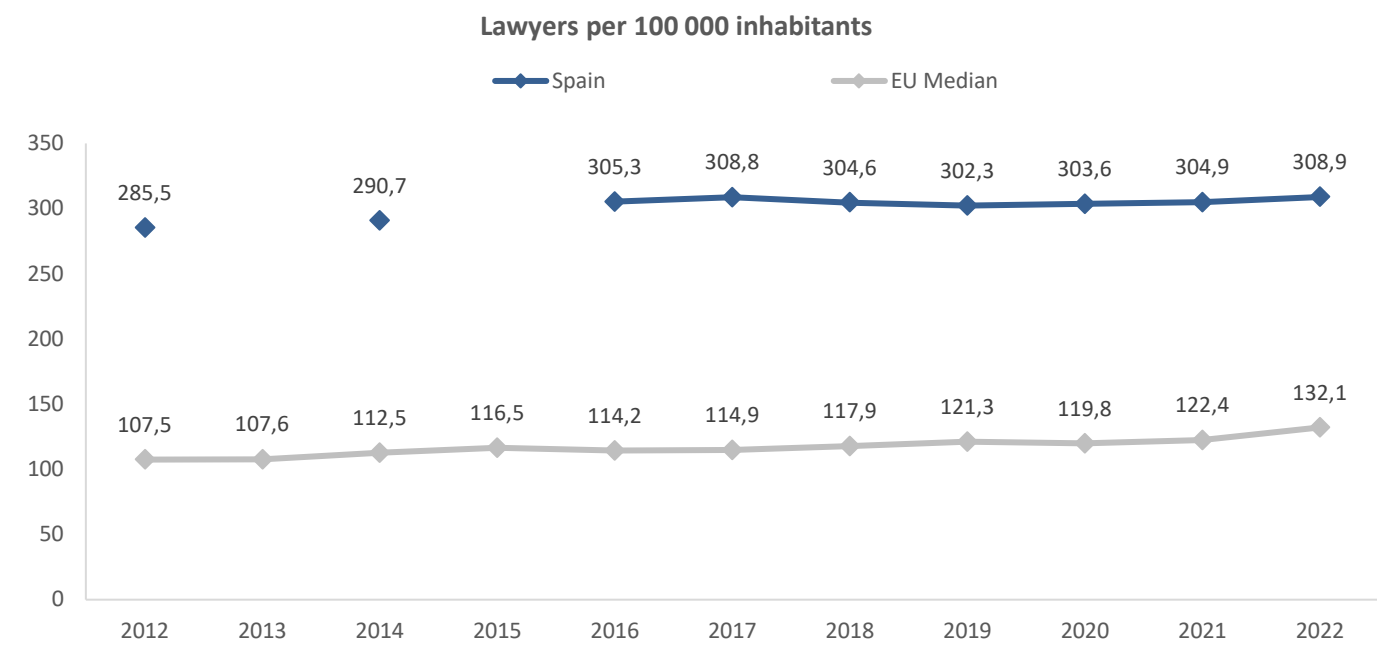
Ratio between non-prosecutor staff and public prosecutors

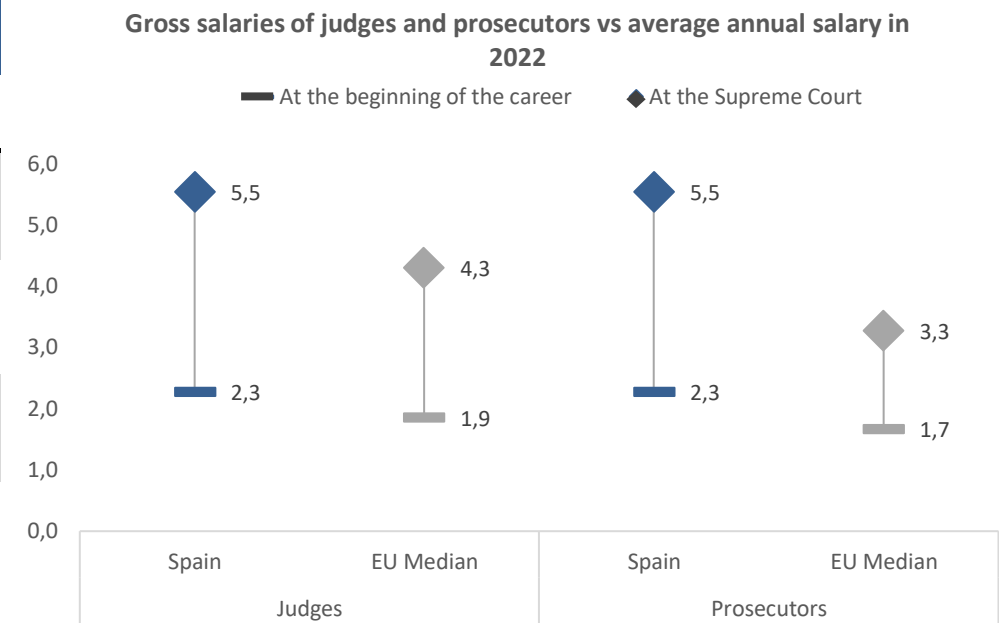


In 2022, there are 148 451 lawyers, which is 2,6% more than in 2021.
There are 66 802 female lawyers which is 45% of the total.

Spain has 308,9 lawyers per 100 000 inhabitants, which is significantly above the EU median of 132,1 lawyers per 100 000 inhabitants.

In the European Union, the absolute gross salary for a judge at the beginning of career ranges from a minimum of 26 931€ to a maximum of 140 244€.

According to 2022 data, the absolute gross salary of a judge at the beginning of his/her career in Spain is 57 855€, which is slightly above the EU median of 54 224€ (7% above).

Compared with the annual average salary in the country, the salary for a judge at the beginning of his/her career is 2,3 times higher (the EU median is 1,9).

At the highest level, the range of the EU absolute gross salary for a judge is from 53 144€ to 261 648€. Spain's absolute gross salaries for judges at the highest level is 32% above the EU median of 106 533€.

For the public prosecutors, the range for the absolute gross salary at the beginning of career is from a minimum of 24 609€ to a maximum of 96 084€.

In 2022, the absolute gross salary of a public prosecutor at the beginning of his/her career in Spain of 57 855€ is rather above the EU median of 48 728€ (19% above).

Compared with the annual average salary in the country, the salary for a public prosecutors at the beginning of his/her career is 2,3 times higher (the EU median is 1,7).

At the highest level, the minimum absolute gross salary for prosecutors in the European Union is 44 880€ and the maximum is 194 005€. Spain's absolute gross salaries for prosecutors at the highest level is 61% above the EU median of 87 247€.

As regards the way in which salaries are determined during the career of a judge/prosecutor the following should be noted. The regulation of the remuneration system for members of the judicial and prosecutorial careers is contained in Law 15/2003 of 26 May regulating the remuneration system of the judicial and prosecutorial careers and is based on the principles of objectivity, fairness, transparency and stability. The remuneration system for judicial and prosecutorial careers is generally made up of a fixed component and a variable component based on objectives, the quantification elements of which are detailed in the law.

The fixed component rewards the category and seniority in the judicial career, as well as the objective characteristics of the positions held. Fixed remuneration is divided into two categories: basic remuneration and additional remuneration. The basic salary is made up of salary (it remunerates the category held within the judicial career and is fixed) and seniority (it is remunerated by a successive increase of five per cent of the initial salary corresponding to the category of entry for every three years of active service or in other administrative situations in which time is recognised for this purpose). Salaries and seniority objectively reflect the category within the judicial career and the successive proportional increase on the initial salary, fixed at five per cent every three years. Judges and magistrates are entitled to two additional payments per year, each equal to one month's salary and recognised seniority, and, if applicable, a proportional amount for the destination allowance under the conditions established by law for the entire State public sector, paid in June and December.

The additional remuneration is made up of the allowance for each post and the specific allowance. The allowance corresponding to each post of judge or magistrate is quantified according to the following criteria The population group to which it belongs; the objective conditions of representation linked to the position held and other specific circumstances linked to the post. The amount of the special allowance for each post of judge or magistrate is set out in Annex II to the Act. The special allowance compensates for the special conditions of certain posts of particular responsibility, complexity or difficulty. The posts benefiting from the special allowance and the amount of the special allowance are listed in Annex III to the Act.

The variable remuneration based on objectives is based specifically on the individual performance of each judge in the performance of his or her judicial and professional duties, as certified by the system of dedication modules. The objective for each assignment in the judicial career is set by the General Council of the Judiciary in accordance with the modules of dedication or other technical criteria it deems appropriate. The variable remuneration works by modulating the amount of the fixed remuneration in parallel with the performance of the previous six-month period. If the members of a court achieve a particularly noteworthy individual performance, i.e. if they exceed the objective assigned to the post by 20 percent, an increase of between five and 10 percent of the fixed remuneration is applied. In cases where, for reasons directly attributable to the judge, the individual performance is insufficient and does not reach 80 percent of the target, the fixed remuneration is automatically reduced by five percent of its amount. Under no circumstances can variable remuneration for targets be consolidated.

The following shall have the status of special remuneration: those corresponding to the performance of on-call duties; those derived from the performance of extraordinary duties without relief from judicial functions; those corresponding to substitutions involving the joint performance of another function, provided that they are in all cases compatible with the other remuneration concepts regulated by law and that their accrual and amount are adapted to the regulatory scheme approved by the Government.

Special mention should be made of the recent updating of the amounts of the representation allowance for members of the judicial and prosecutorial professions, which have been subject to an increase in remuneration of between 440 and 450 euros, depending on the type of body and post, by virtue of Royal Decree 775/2023 of 3 October updating the remuneration system for the judicial and prosecutorial professions, in accordance with Law 15/2003 of 26 May regulating the remuneration system for the judicial and prosecutorial professions. These increases are made ex officio by the administration and are retroactive to 1 January 2023.

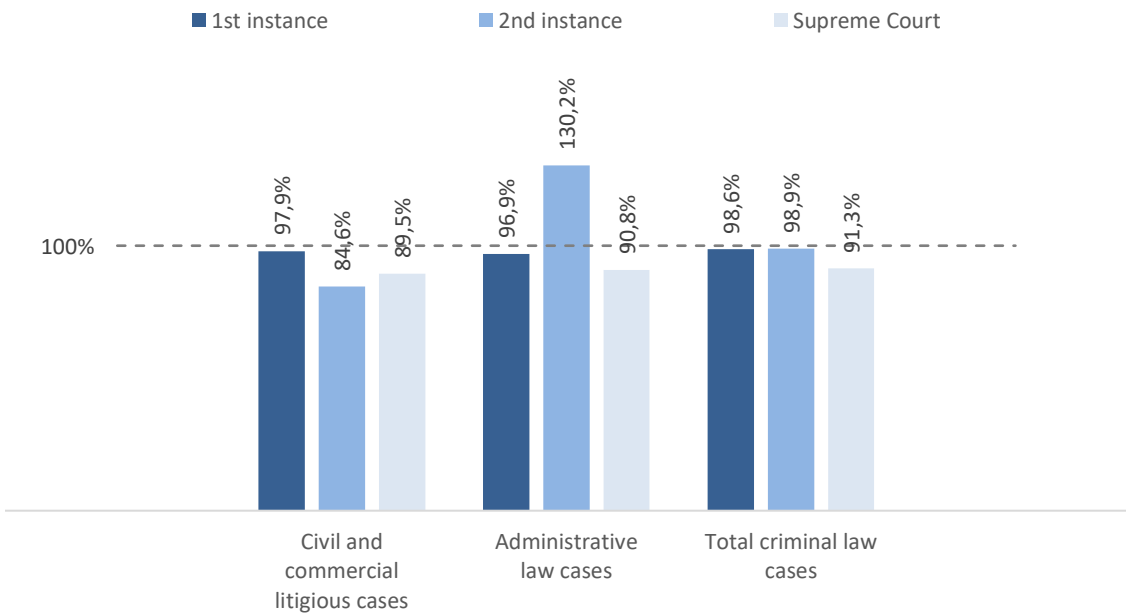

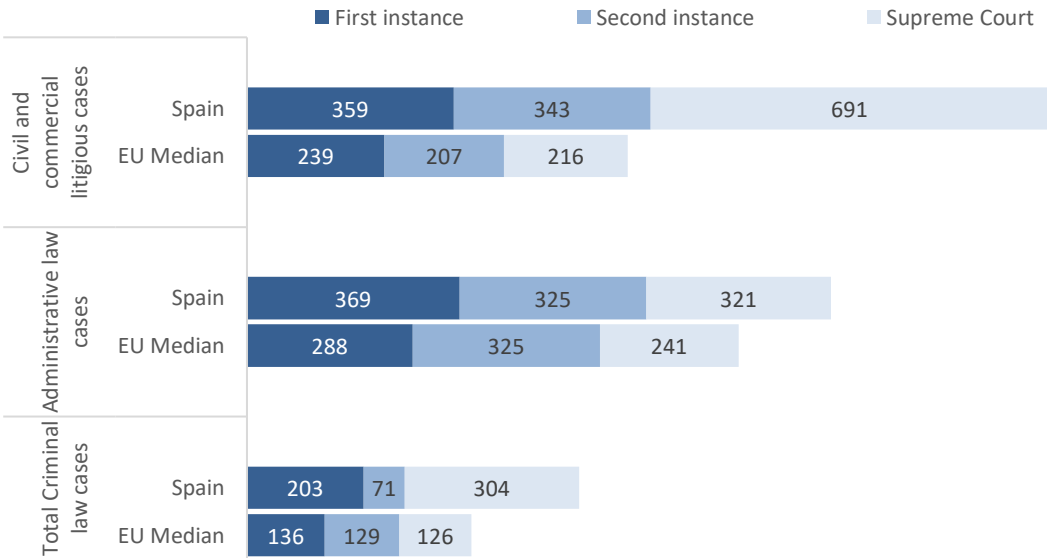

Disposition Time by instance and by matter in 2022 (days)

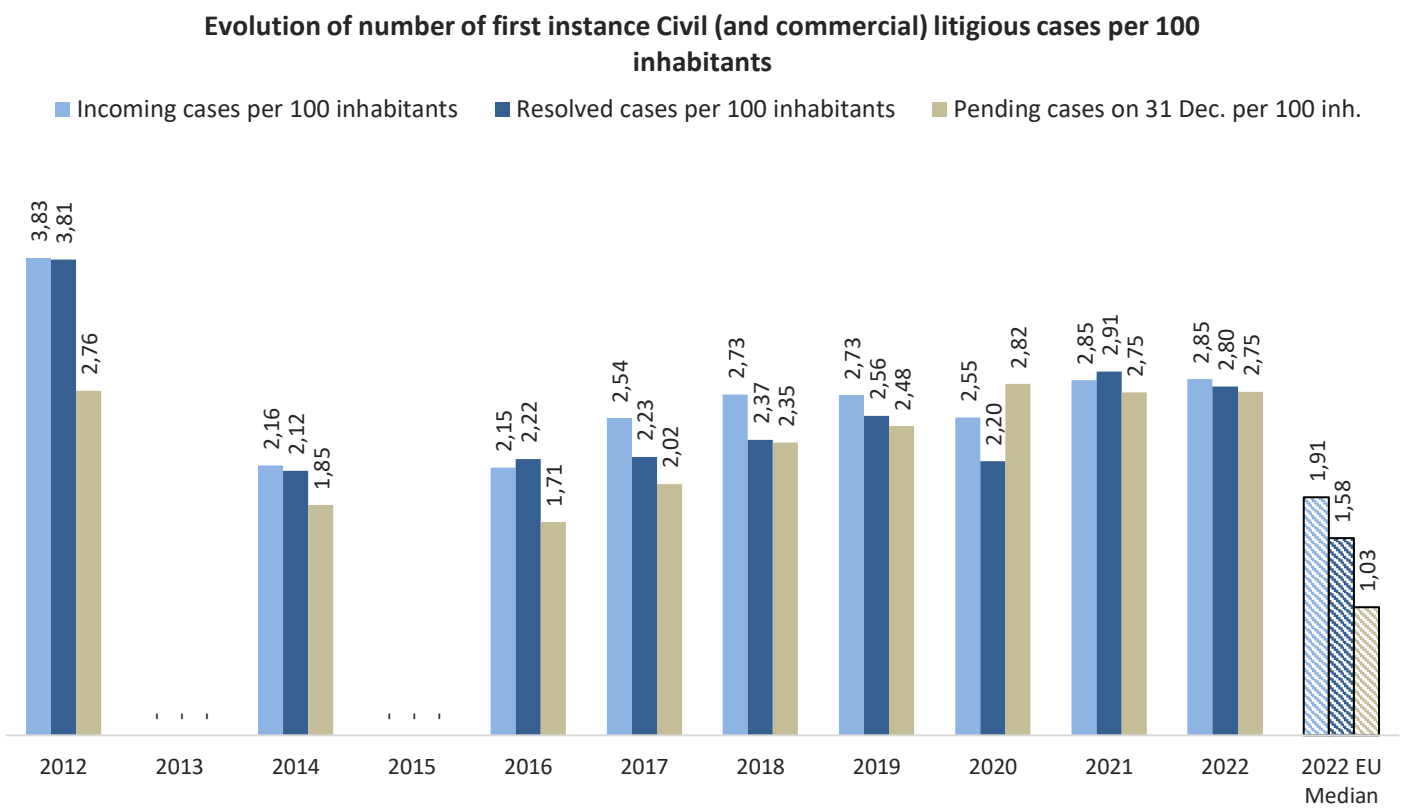


Analysis of disposition times for all three instances combined demonstrates that Spain has total levels that are higher than EU medians in all three case categories: civil and commercial, administrative and criminal. The shortest total disposition time is recorded for criminal cases, in line with EU tendencies. Looking at the civil and commercial cases on the one side, and administrative cases on the other, the first two instances show very similar disposition times. However, in the third instance, the highest disposition time by far is recorded for civil and commercial cases (691 days, more than 3 times higher than EU median). Looking at the overall CR levels, it could be noted that in all three instances and for all three case categories the clearance rate is below 100% and below EU medians, except for second instance administrative law cases. The clearance rate is the lowest for the second and third instance civil and commercial cases with 84,6% and 89,5% respectively, which indicates that efficiency challenges for civil and commercial cases in higher instances might be augmented in following years .

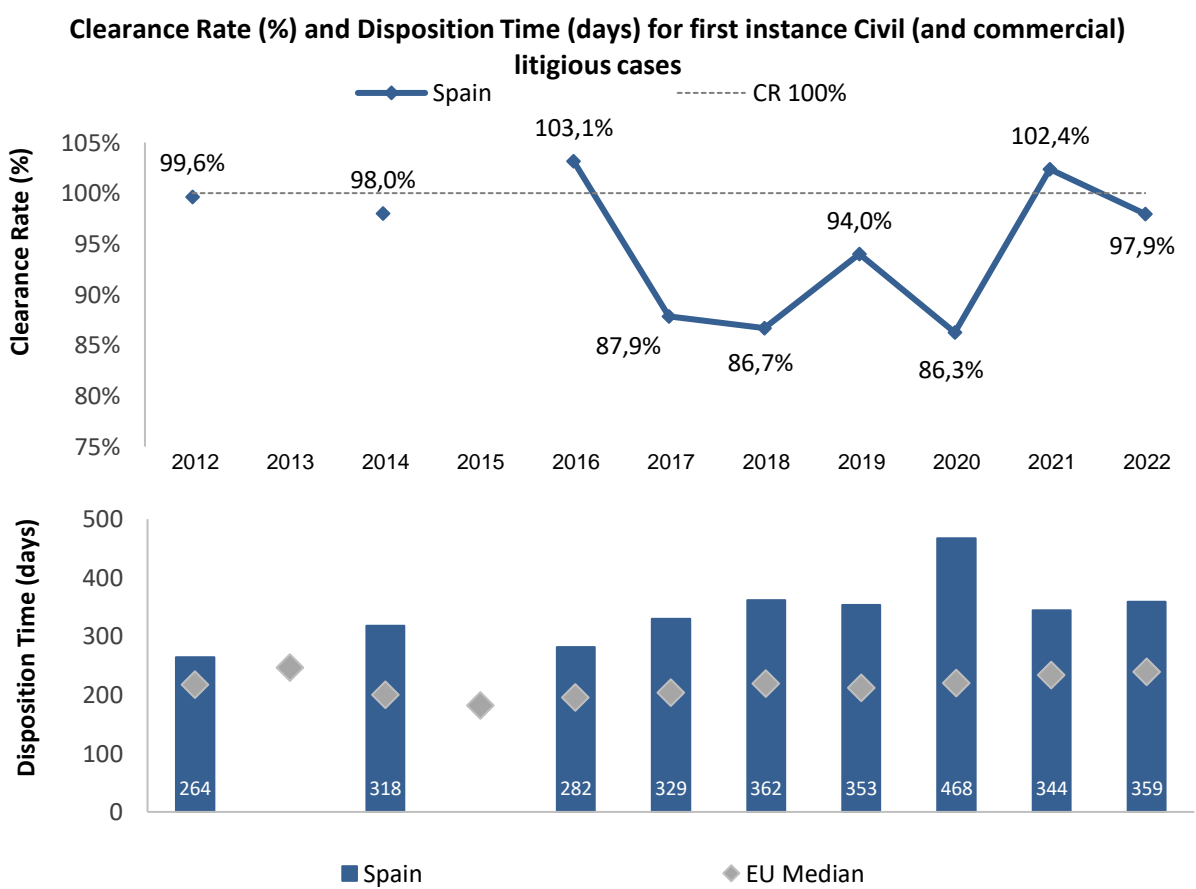

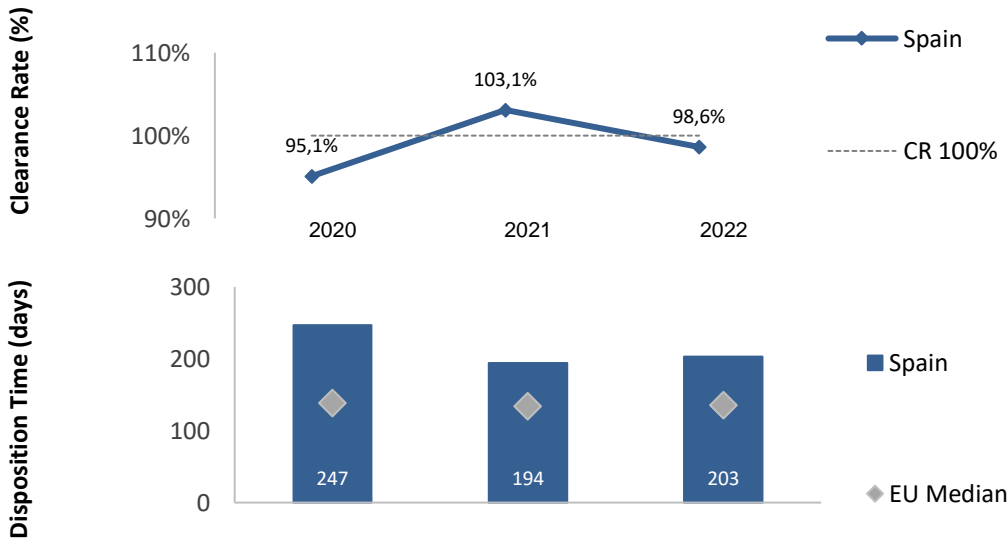

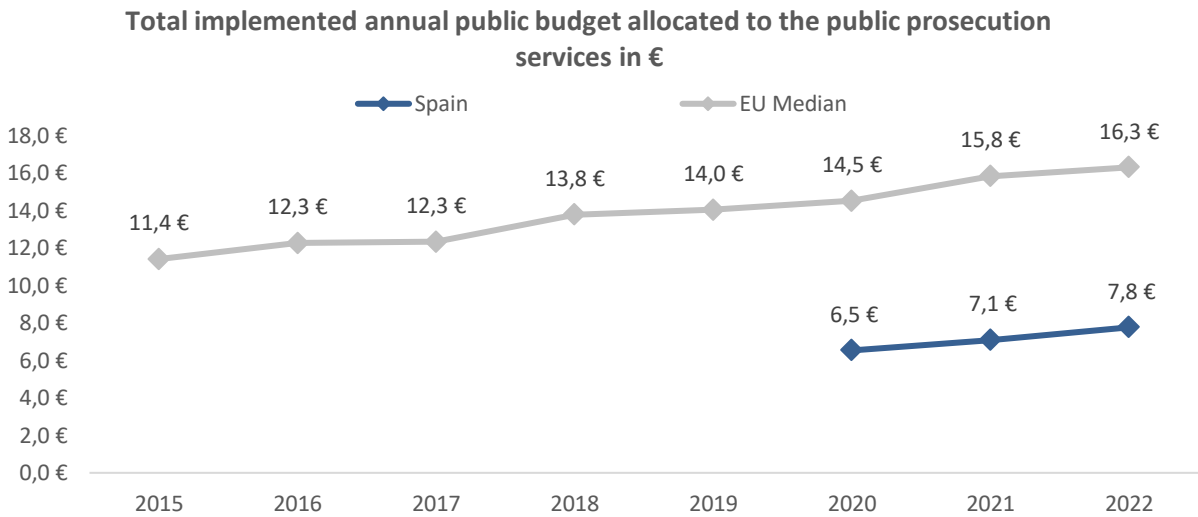

In Spain the general rule is that the Prosecutor is a party in the criminal cases, but the Prosecutor does not process (with exclusive competence) the criminal cases. The investigation Judge (Juez de Instrucción) does that. Data provided in this table tries to adapt the information in the Annual Report of the State Attorney General's Office to the criteria of CEPEJ, by offering the data of cases received by the Prosecution Service, according to the classification of procedures of the Spanish procedural legislation (diligencias previas, diligencias urgentes, procedimiento por delitos leves, sumarios y procedimientos del jurado). In addition to that, there are other two kinds of actions for which the Prosecution have exclusive competence: investigation of criminal responsibility of minors, and preliminary diligences of Article 773.2 of the Criminal Procedural Act.

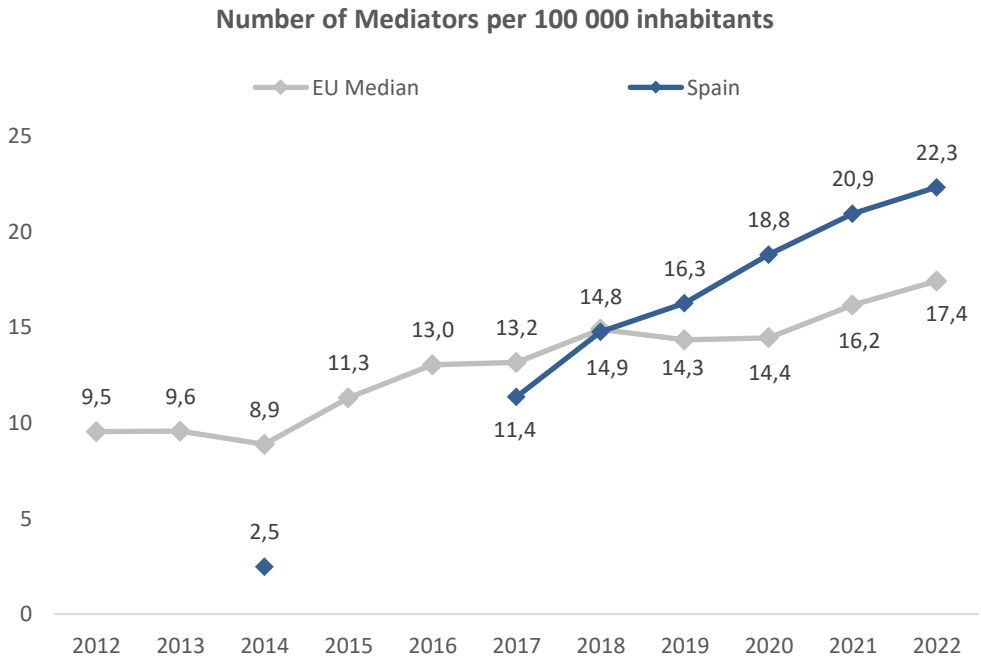

In 2022, there are 10 723 accredited or registered mediators who practise court related mediation which represents 22,3 accredited or registered mediators per 100 000 inhabitants.

The variation between 2021 and 2022 is about 8,1%.

It is worth noting that the figure provided is the number of mediators (natural and legal persons) registered in the Registry of Mediators. This Registry is not compulsory, so the number of persons that act as mediators may be higher.

As regards the requirements and procedure to become an accredited or registered mediator, according to Article 11 of Law 5/2012, of July 6, on mediation in civil and commercial matters, natural persons who are in full exercise of their civil rights can be mediators.

Legal entities that are dedicated to mediation, whether professional companies or any other provided by the legal system, must designate a natural person who meets the requirements set forth in this Law for their exercise.

The mediator must be in possession of an official university degree or higher professional training and have specific training to practice mediation.

The mediator must take out insurance or equivalent guarantee that covers civil liability arising from his actions in the conflicts in which he intervenes.

As officials, they exercise notarial public faith, which has and protects a double content:

- a) In the field of facts, the accuracy of what the notary sees, hears or perceives through his senses.
- b) And in the sphere of Law, the authenticity and probative force of the declarations of will of the parties in the public instrument drawn up in accordance with the laws.

As legal professionals, they have the mission of advising those who claim their ministry and advise them of the most appropriate legal means to achieve the lawful ends that they intend to achieve.

The Notary will enjoy full autonomy and independence in its function, and in its hierarchical organization it reports directly to the Ministry of Justice and the General Directorate of Registries and Notaries".
