General Elements

Best Interests of the Child Assessments

Best Interests of the Child Determinations

Identification and assessment of needs specific to a child (such as initial, health, protection, vulnerability, safety, gender, shelter, family, special needs) Ongoing assessment and addressing of needs

- 4. Provision of information (including rights and procedures)
- 5. Legal assistance
- 6. Guardianship

Role of guardian

When appointed

- 7. Caseworker/Case Management
- 8. Formation of individual care plan
- 9. Participation of child in procedures that may affect him/her
- 10. Care and accommodation adapted to the needs of a child

Detention and the best interests of a child

Accommodation should not amount to deprivation of liberty

Accommodation adapted to child's age, gender, ethnic, religious, cultural background
