Main objective and objectives	The Project aims at improving access to justice, human rights protection, and information for war-affected population within civil and administrative proceedings. As a result, key groups of war-affected people will benefit from better access to justice along with restoration and protection of their human rights at the domestic level in line with Council of Europe standards and good practices.
Expected results	 The Government improved the national legal framework on effective remedies and data collection for war-affected people in line with Council of Europe human rights and rule of law standards. War-affected people gained better access to legal aid and benefit from effective judicial remedies for human rights protection adjusted in conformity with European standards and the case-law of the European Court of Human Rights.
