Origin/DG Remarks The European Committee of Social Rights is established by the European Social Charter. It is composed of 15 independent experts. It works on two specific objectives: treating collective complaints and examining national reports on the application of the European Social Charter with a view to rule on the conformity of national situations under the Charter.

- **Objective(s)** To examine the pending collective complaints;
 - To examine national reports for Conclusions XXII-2 (2021) of the 1961 Charter and Conclusions 2021 of the Revised Charter;
 - To adopt Conclusions XXII-2 (2021) of the 1961 Charter and Conclusions 2021 of the Revised Charter;
 - To adopt Findings 2021;
 - To examine developments relating to the procedure on non-accepted provisions;
 - To resume discussion of the progress of the work of the Committee of Ministers Working Party (GT-

- CHARTE); based on feedback from the most recent meetings with the participation of Karin LUKAS and Giuseppe PALMISANO;
- To examine and adopt draft comments for the Committee of Ministers on Parliamentary Assembly Recommendations 2216(2021);
- To examine and adopt the Rapporteurs responsibilities and composition of the subcommittees for the Conclusions 2022/Conclusions XXII-3 (2022)

Output

- 1) The Committee continued its examination of the pending complaints;
- The Committee adopted a decision on admissibility in European Organisation of Military Associations and Trade Unions (EUROMIL) v. Portugal, Complaint No. 199/2021:

- To follow the collective complaints procedure with the Rapporteurs for the pending complaints;
- To transmit to the parties and publish the decision on admissibility;
- To transmit the decision on the merits to the parties and to the Committee of Ministers in accordance with the usual procedure;
- To finalise and transmit the reports on nonaccepted provisions in respect of Austria, Moldova and Norway;
- To finalise and transmit to the Committee of Ministers the comments on the Parliamentary Assembly Recommendations.
