The European Committee of Social Rights is established by the European Social Charter. It is composed of 15 independent experts. It works on two specific objectives: treating collective complaints and examining national reports on the application of the European Social Charter with a view to rule on the conformity of national situations under the Charter.

Origin/DG Remarks

- To examine the pending collective complaints.
- To examine national reports for Conclusions XXII-4 (2023) of the 1961 Charter and Conclusions 2023 of the Revised Charter.
- To examine draft findings for Findings 2023.
- To examine developments relating to the procedure on nonaccepted provisions (Implementation of Article 22 of the 1961 Charter).

Objective(s)

- To discuss and agree on the list of questions to be forwarded to the States Parties when requesting the ad hoc report on the cost-of-living crisis.
- To resume the discussion on strengthening the Council of Europe's social rights framework.
- To examine and adopt the session dates for 2024

- 4) The Committee examined draft findings for Findings 2023.
- 5) The Committee discussed and agreed on a list of questions to be forwarded to the States Parties when requesting the ad hoc report on the cost-of-living crisis.
- 6) The Committee resumed discussion on strengthening the Council of Europe's social rights framework in the light of the outcome of the Reykjavik summit (16-17 May 2023).
- 7) The Committee examined and adopted a proposal for session dates 2024.

The Committee instructed the Secretariat:

• To follow the collective complaints procedure with the Rapporteurs for the pending complaints.

Conclusions/ Follow Up

- To transmit to the parties the decisions on admissibility and publish them.
- To transmit to the parties and to the Committee of Ministers the decision on the merits in accordance with the usual procedure.
- To be in contact with States concerned by reports and meetings on non-accepted provisions.
