Origin/DG Remarks The European Committee of Social Rights is established by the European Social Charter. It is composed of 14 independent experts. It works on two specific objectives: treating collective complaints and examining national reports on the application of the European Social Charter with a view to rule on the conformity of national situations under the Charter.

- Objective(s)**
- To examine the pending collective complaints;
 - To examine national reports for Conclusions XXII-3 (2022) of the 1961 Charter and Conclusions 2022 of the Revised Charter;
 - To examine national reports for Findings 2022;
 - To examine developments relating to the procedure on non-accepted provisions;
 - To resume discussion of the progress of the work of the Committee of Ministers Working Party (GT-CHARTE) on strengthening the Council of Europe's;

- To examine and adopt draft comments for the Committee of Ministers on Parliamentary Assembly Recommendation 2233(2022) and 2234(2022);
- To examine amendments to the Rules with a view to their adoption.

Output

- 1) The Committee adopted a decision on admissibility in *Fédération européenne des Associations nationales travaillant avec les Sans-abri (FEANTSA) v. Belgium* Complaint No. 203/2021
- 2) The Committee adopted a decision on the merits in the following complaints:
Syndicat CFDT de la métallurgie de la Meuse v. France, Complaint No. 175/2019
- 3) The Committee continued its examination of the pending complaints;
- 4) The Sub-Committees examined draft conclusions for Conclusions XXII-3(2022) of the 1961 Charter and for Conclusions 2022 of the Revised Charter;
- 5) The Committee examined draft findings for Findings 2022;
- 6) The Committee adopted amendments to its Rules.
- 7) The Committee held a discussion of the on-going work of GT-CHARTÉ;

Conclusions/ Follow Up

The Committee instructed the Secretariat:

- To follow the collective complaints procedure with the Rapporteurs for the pending complaints;
- To transmit to the parties and publish the decision on admissibility;
- To transmit the decisions on the merits to the parties and to the Committee of Ministers in accordance with the usual procedure;

- To publish the revised Rules and to notify them as necessary.
- To re-schedule the consideration of the draft comments on Parliamentary Assembly Recommendation 2233(2022) and 2234(2022) to the Committee of Ministers for the September session.
