The European Committee of Social Rights is established by the European Social Charter. It is composed of 15 independent experts. It works on two specific objectives: treating collective Origin/DG Remarks complaints and examining national reports on the application of the European Social Charter with a view to rule on the conformity of national situations under the Charter.

- To examine the pending collective complaints;
- to examine Ad hoc reports;

Objective(s)

- to examine developments relating to the procedure on nonaccepted provisions;
- to examine draft amendments to the Rules and Working Methods.

- 2) Committee adopted a decision on the merits in the following complaints:
 - Defence for Children International (DCI), European Federation of National Organisations working with the Homeless (FEANTSA), Magistrats Européens pour la Démocratie et les Libertés (MEDEL), Confederación Sindical de Comisiones Obreras and International Movement ATD Fourth World v. Spain Complaint No. 206/2022
 - European Organisation of Military Associations and Trade Unions (EUROMIL) v. Portugal Complaint No. 199/2021
- 3) Committee continued the examination of the Ad hoc reports submitted by States Parties.
- 4) The Committee examined developments relating to the procedure on non-accepted provisions and adopted its report in respect of Slovenia.
- 5) The Committee adopted amendments to the Rules.

The Committee instructed the Secretariat:

- to follow the collective complaints procedure with the Rapporteurs for the pending complaints;
- to transmit to the parties the decisions on admissibility and to make them public;

Conclusions/ Follow Up

- to transmit to the parties and to the Committee of Ministers the decision on the merits in accordance with the usual procedure;
- to finalise for publication the amended Rules;
- to finalise and transmit the report on non-accepted provisions to Slovenia.
