The European Committee of Social Rights is established by the European Social Charter. It is composed of 15 independent experts. It works on two specific objectives: treating collective Origin/DG Remarks complaints and examining national reports on the application of the European Social Charter with a view to rule on the conformity of national situations under the Charter.

- To examine the pending collective complaints.
- To finalise and adopt the Ad Hoc review on the cost-of-living crisis.
- To examine developments relating to the procedure on nonaccepted provisions (Implementation of Article 22 of the 1961 Charter).

### Objective(s)

- To examine state reports on follow-up to decisions in collective complaints
- To examine the draft comments prepared by the Secretariat on the Parliamentary Assembly Recommendation 2286 (2024) on "Guaranteeing the human right to food".

# Output

1) The Committee adopted a decision on admissibility in the following complaints:

- Associazione Nazionale per l'Industria e il Terziario (ANPIT) and Confederazione Italiana Sindacati Autonomi Lavoratori (CISAL) v. Italy Complaint No. 232/2023
- Confederazione Unitaria di Base (CUB) v. Italy Complaint No. 234/2024
- 2) The Committee adopted a decision on the merits in the following complaints:
  - Confederación Sindical de Comisiones Obreras (CCOO) v.
    Spain
    Complaint No. 218/2022
  - Fédération SUD Santé-Sociaux v. France Complaint No. 226/2023
  - Open Society European Policy Institute (OSEPI) v. Bulgaria Complaint No. 204/2022
- 3) The Committee discussed the Ad Hoc review on the costof-living crisis with a view to its adoption at the next session (January 2025).
- 4) The Committee examined developments relating to the procedure on non-accepted provisions and adopted its report in respect of Denmark.

The Committee instructed the Secretariat:

- to follow the collective complaints procedure with the Rapporteurs for the pending complaints;
- to transmit to the parties the decisions on admissibility and to make them public;

## Conclusions/ Follow Up

- to transmit to the parties and to the Committee of Ministers the decisions on the merits in accordance with the usual procedure;
- to finalise the Ad Hoc review for adoption at the next session;
- to finalise and transmit the report on non-accepted provisions to Denmark.
