- Regional exercise on the cooperation through the 24/7 Network for the Pacific (4-5 August, Fiji)
 - Fiji, Tonga, Vanuatu, New Zealand and Papua New Guinea
 - Topics: role and responsibilities, templates for request of data, capacities, resources, training and SOP
 - Supported by 24/7 of Serbia

- Annual meeting of the 24/7 Network (1 October, EUROPOL)
 - Participation: 100+ delegates, representing 72 countries (65 Parties and 7 Observers)
 - Topics: organisation and functioning of the 24/7 Network, capacity building, new responsibilities under the 2AP,
 - Operational cooperation: Philippines, Brasil, Chile, Romania, Ukraine
