Agreement, please specify In accordance with the recommendations of the Council of Europe, a national coordinating body, an Interdepartmental working group to ensure coordination of work to prevent and combat doping in sport in the Russian Federation, was established in 2016 and is currently successfully functioning. The working group, headed by the Minister of sports of the Russian Federation, includes representatives of all interested Federal Executive bodies and organizations, such as the Ministry of Health, the Ministry of Education, the Ministry of Foreign Affairs, the Ministry of Internal Affairs, the Federal Medical-biological Agency of Russia, the Federal Customs Service, RUSADA, the Russian Olympic Committee, the Russian Paralympic Committee. Within the framework of the meetings, the issues of prevention of anti-doping rules violations through the implementation of educational activities, organization of sociological research, harmonization of the national regulatory framework in the field of anti-doping in sports and other issues are discussed.
