# 1. Administrative issues / State of progress

## **State of Progress**

- First set up in 2014 as an informal platform through the Swedish Sports Confederation.
- ❖ Established platform at the Gambling Authority since January 1<sup>st</sup> 2019.
- Ongoing discussions regarding the platforms role and the exchange of information between the participants in the platform.

#### **Legal Status**

❖ A council against match-fixing set up by the Gambling Authority through a mandate in the Gambling Act (2018:1138).

#### 2. Structure / Operational Aspects

#### Priorities / functions of the NP

- Discuss match-fixing;
- Exchange information regarding match-fixing between the participants;
- Elaborate upon a national strategy against match-fixing.

#### **Objectives**

The council against match-fixing shall promote strategic operational cooperation in matters concerned with preventing match-fixing, which can be achieved through the exchange of information and collaboration on risk assessments.

#### **Operational procedures**

Meetings 4-6 times a year. The meetings are summoned by the Gambling Authority.

#### Implementation

#### Funding of the NP (estimated yearly budget, sources)

- ❖ There has been no funding of the NP between 2015 2018.
- From January 1st 2019 the council is run through the Gambling Authority.

# 3. Development Process

#### Origin of the initiative

❖ Initially the Swedish Sports Confederation took steps to initiate the platform. Since January 1<sup>st</sup> 2019 there is a new Gambling Act in which it is stipulated that the Gambling Authority shall install a council against match-fixing. Which is the national platform.

#### Leading actors involved in the development process

Since January 1st 2019 it is the Gambling Authority who is the leading actor.

# Work carried out to mobilise actors? How many meetings necessary / agendas?

- ❖ The work with creating the group in Sweden has been very smooth since all the work that takes place in the NP is on the strategic level.
- Since January 1<sup>st</sup> 2019 the work has continued.

# Process in defining priorities and objectives (assessments, analysis, documents produced / published)

# Previous situation (domestic law in application, difficulties in proceeding)

❖ Before January 1<sup>st</sup> 2019 match-fixing was entitled bribery and was a challenge with the difficulties of proceeding with such prosecution regarding evidence and the like.

# Challenges in defining tasks and responsibilities / Reasons for inclusion or exclusion of main actors (and inclusion/exclusion of representatives)

- The participants of the council share the same challenge as other platforms regarding the difficulty of sharing information between them. Information must be shared in compliance with the GDPR.
- ❖ In the Gambling Act (2018:1138) there is a new crime called cheating, there are some interpretation difficulties regarding this new paragraph:
- Those who take inappropriate actions to manipulate the outcome of a game that is subject to licence requirements under this Act shall be imprisoned for a maximum of two years for cheating.
