Purchase of consultancy services for the provision of English and Finnish translation services



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The Council of Europe is currently implementing a Project on Ensuring child-friendly justice through the effective operation of the Barnahus-Units in Finland. It is co-financed by the EU Structural Reform Support Programme and implemented in close cooperation with the EU DG Reform and the Finnish National Institute of Health and Welfare (THL) for the period 1/9/2021 to 29/2/2024.

In that context, the Council is looking for Providers for the provision of translation and proofreading services between English and Finnish and vice versa, to be requested by the Council of Europe on an as needed basis, in compliance with the ordering procedure defined below.

A. TENDER RULES

This tender procedure is a competitive bidding procedure. In accordance with Rule 1395 of the Secretary General of the Council of Europe on the procurement procedures of the Council of Europe¹, the Organisation shall invite to tender at least three potential providers for any purchase between $\leq 2,000$ (or $\leq 5,000$ for intellectual services) and $\leq 55,000$ tax exclusive.

This specific tender procedure aims at concluding a **framework contract** for the provision of deliverables described in the Act of Engagement (See attached). A tender is considered valid for 120 calendar days as from the closing date for submission. The selection of tenderers will be made in the light of the criteria indicated below. All tenderers will be informed in writing of the outcome of the procedure.

The tenderer must be either a natural person, a legal person or consortia of legal and/or natural persons.

Tenders shall be submitted **by email only** (with attachments) **to the email address indicated in the table below, with the following reference in subject:** Translation Tender – Barnahus Finland. Tenders addressed to another email address **will be rejected.**

B. EXPECTED DELIVERABLES

Background of the Project

Barnahus is a leading European model for a child-friendly multidisciplinary and interagency response to child sexual exploitation and abuse. In 2019, Finland initiated its own nationwide Barnahus project to be implemented around the core of five university hospital expert units specialising on forensic psychology/psychiatry (Barnahus-units). The EU-CoE Joint Project Barnahus in Finland sets to support the Finnish authorities in addressing the needs and challenges identified since the launch of their project so as to reduce significant existing delays in the pre-trial and judicial processes involving children.

The project is divided into three main components:

- 1. Improving the legislative and policy framework for the functioning of Barnahus services in Finland;
- 2. Strengthening inter- and multi-agency coordination mechanisms to reduce the delays in the duration of the judicial processes related to child victims of violence;
- 3. Increasing awareness on child sexual abuse through child participation.

The Council of Europe is looking for a maximum of 7 Providers (provided enough tenders meet the criteria indicated below) in order to support the implementation of the project with a particular expertise in translation and proofreading services between English and Finnish.

For information purposes only, the total budget of the project amounts to 666,667 Euros and the total amount of the object of present tender **shall not exceed 55,000 Euros tax exclusive** for the whole duration of the Framework Contract. This information does not constitute any sort of contractual commitment or obligation on the part of the Council of Europe.

Scope of the Framework Contract

Throughout the duration of the Framework Contract, pre-selected Providers may be asked to:

- Translate documents from English into Finnish
- Translate documents from Finnish into English
- Proofread documents in Finnish and English

The above list is not considered exhaustive. The Council reserves the right to request deliverables not explicitly mentioned in the above list of expected services, but related to the field of expertise object of the present Framework Contract.

C. FEES

Tenderers are invited to indicate their fees, by completing and sending the table of fees, as attached in Section A to the Act of Engagement. **One page is considered to be 1500 characters without spaces**. These fees are final and not subject to review.

The Council will indicate on each Order Form (see Section D below) the global fee corresponding to each deliverable, calculated on the basis of the unit fees, as agreed by this Contract.

D. HOW WILL THIS FRAMEWORK CONTRACT WORK? (ORDERING PROCEDURE)

Once the selection procedure is completed, you will be informed accordingly. Deliverables will then be delivered on the basis of Order Forms submitted by the Council to the selected Provider (s), by post or electronically, on **an as needed basis** (there is therefore no obligation to order on the part of the Council).

Pooling

For each Order, the Council will choose from the pool of pre-selected tenderers the Provider who demonstrably offers best value for money for its requirement when assessed – for the Order concerned – against the criteria of:

- quality (including as appropriate: capability, expertise, past performance, availability of resources and proposed methods of undertaking the work);
- availability (including, without limitation, capacity to meet required deadlines and, where relevant, geographical location); and
- price.

Each time an Order Form is sent, the selected Provider undertakes to take all the necessary measures to send it **signed** to the Council within 2 (two) working days after its reception. If a Provider is unable to take an Order or if no reply is given on his behalf within that deadline, the Council may call on another Provider using the same criteria, and so on until a suitable Provider is contracted.]

Providers subject to VAT

The Provider, **if subject to VAT**, shall also send, together with each signed Form, a quote² (Pro Forma invoice) in line with the indications specified on each Order Form, and including:

- the Service Provider's name and address;
- its VAT number;
- the full list of services;
- the fee per type of deliverables (in the currency indicated on the Act of Engagement, tax exclusive);
- the total amount per type of deliverables (in the currency indicated on the Act of Engagement, tax exclusive);
- the total amount (in the currency indicated on the Act of Engagement), tax exclusive, the applicable VAT rate, the amount of VAT and the amount VAT inclusive .

Signature of orders

An Order Form is considered to be legally binding when the Order, signed by the Provider, is approved by the Council, by displaying a Council's Purchase Order number on the Order, as well as by signing and stamping the Order concerned. Copy of each approved Order Form shall be sent to the Provider, to the extent possible on the day of its signature.

E. ASSESSMENT

Exclusion criteria and absence of conflict of interests

(by signing the Act of Engagement, you declare on your honour not being in any of the below situations)³

Tenderers shall be excluded from participating in the tender procedure if they:

- have been sentenced by final judgment on one or more of the following charges: participation in a criminal organisation, corruption, fraud, money laundering, terrorist financing, terrorist offences or offences linked to terrorist activities, child labour or trafficking in human beings;
- are in a situation of bankruptcy, liquidation, termination of activity, insolvency or arrangement with creditors or any like situation arising from a procedure of the same kind, or are subject to a procedure of the same kind;
- have received a judgment with res judicata force, finding an offence that affects their professional integrity or serious professional misconduct;
- do not comply with their obligations as regards payment of social security contributions, taxes and dues, according to the statutory provisions of their country of incorporation, establishment or residence;
- are an entity created to circumvent tax, social or other legal obligations (empty shell company), have ever created or are in the process of creation of such an entity;
- have been involved in mismanagement of the Council of Europe funds or public funds;
- are or appear to be in a situation of conflict of interest;
- are or if their owner(s) or executive officer(s), in the case of legal persons, are included in the lists
 of persons or entities subject to restrictive measures applied by the European Union (available at
 www.sanctionsmap.eu).

Eligibility criteria

- Being a registered company or freelance translator.
- When the Tenderer is a legal person: being able, as a registered company to provide **registration documents** and to **demonstrate 5 (five) years of experience** of providing translation services to international organisation or national public administrations or institutions.

² It must strictly respect the fees indicated in the Act of Engagement. In case of non-compliance with these fees, the Council of Europe reserves the right to terminate the Contract with the Provider, in all or in part.

³ The Council of Europe reserves the right to ask tenderers, at a later stage, to supply the following supporting documents:

⁻ An extract from the record of convictions or failing that an equivalent document issued by the competent judicial or administrative authority of the country of incorporation, indicating that the first three and sixth above listed exclusion criteria are met;

⁻ A certificate issued by the competent authority of the country of incorporation indicating that the fourth criterion is met;

⁻ For legal persons, an extract from the companies register or other official document proving ownership and control of the Tenderer;

⁻ For natural persons (including owners and executive officers of legal persons), a scanned copy of a valid photographic proof of identity (e.g. passport).

 When the Tenderer is a natural person: being able, as a freelance translator, to demonstrate 5 (five) years of experience of providing translation services to international organisation or national public administrations or institutions.

Award criteria

- Quality of the offer (70%), including:
 - Qualifications and experience of the translator(s) (50%);
 - Qualifications and experience of legal translation (20%);
- Financial offer (30%).

Multiple tendering is not authorised.

F. NEGOTIATIONS

The Council reserves the right to hold negotiations with the bidders in accordance with Article 20 of Rule 1395.

G. DOCUMENTS TO BE PROVIDED

- A completed and signed copy of the **Act of Engagement**⁴ (See attached);
- A detailed CV, preferably in Europass Format, demonstrating clearly that the tenderer fulfils the eligibility criteria;
- A list of all owners and executive officers, for legal persons only;
- CVs of persons allocated to the execution of the contract, for legal persons only;
- **Motivation letter** demonstrating the tenderer's understanding of the Council of Europe needs and clearly indicating relevant professional experience;
- Additional as relevant: links and/or samples of previous work if available in English.

All documents shall be submitted in English, failure to do so will result in the exclusion of the tender.

If any of the documents listed above are missing, the Council of Europe reserves the right to reject the tender.

The Council reserves the right to reject a tender if the scanned documents <u>are of such a</u> <u>quality that the documents cannot be read once printed.</u>

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⁴ The Act of Engagement must be completed, signed and scanned in its entirety (i.e. including all the pages). The scanned Act of Engagement may be sent page by page (attached to a single email) or as a compiled document, although a compiled document would be preferred. For all scanned documents, .pdf files are preferred.
