The Council of Europe implements and until December 2021 will implement a Project "Support to the judicial reform – enhancing the independence and professionalism of the judiciary in Armenia", funded within the European Union and Council of Europe Partnership for Good Governance. In that context, it is looking for a Provider for the provision of website design and development services for the Constitutional Court of Armenia (See Section A of the Act of Engagement).

A. TENDER RULES

This tender procedure is a competitive bidding procedure. In accordance with Rule 1395 of the Secretary General of the Council of Europe on the procurement procedures of the Council of Europe¹, the Organisation shall invite to tender at least three potential providers for any purchase between €2,000 (or €5,000 for intellectual services) and €55,000 tax exclusive.

This specific tender procedure aims at concluding a **one-off contract** for the provision of deliverables described in the Act of Engagement (See attached). A tender is considered valid for 120 calendar days as from the closing date for submission. The selection of tenderers will be made in the light of the criteria indicated below. All tenderers will be informed in writing of the outcome of the procedure.

The tenderer must be either a natural person, a legal person or consortia of legal and/or natural persons.

Tenders shall be submitted by email only (with attachments) to the email address indicated in the table below, with the following reference in subject: Competitive bidding procedure BH 4714 — Constitutional Court website design and development. Tenders addressed to another email address will be rejected.

The deadline for the submission of the tenders is **21 May 2021, 18:00** Yerevan time.

- the full list of services;
- the fee per type of deliverables (in the currency indicated on the Act of Engagement, tax exclusive);
- the total amount per type of deliverables (in the currency indicated on the Act of Engagement, tax exclusive);
- the total amount (in the currency indicated on the Act of Engagement), tax exclusive, the applicable VAT rate, the amount of VAT and the amount VAT inclusive.

D. ASSESSMENT

Exclusion criteria and absence of conflict of interests

(by signing the Act of Engagement,² you declare on your honour not being in any of the below situations) Tenderers shall be excluded from participating in the tender procedure if they:

- have been sentenced by final judgment on one or more of the following charges: participation in a criminal organisation, corruption, fraud, money laundering, terrorist financing, terrorist offences or offences linked to terrorist activities, child labour or trafficking in human beings;
- are in a situation of bankruptcy, liquidation, termination of activity, insolvency or arrangement with creditors or any like situation arising from a procedure of the same kind, or are subject to a procedure of the same kind;
- have received a judgment with res judicata force, finding an offence that affects their professional integrity or serious professional misconduct;
- do not comply with their obligations as regards payment of social security contributions, taxes and dues, according to the statutory provisions of their country of incorporation, establishment or residence;
- · are or are likely to be in a situation of conflict of interests;
- are or if their owner(s) or executive officer(s), in the case of legal persons, are included in the lists of persons or entities subject to restrictive measures applied by the European Union (available at www.sanctionsmap.eu).

Eligibility criteria

- At least 7 years of experience of website design and development services
- Experience in creating websites for the state agencies will be considered as an asset (desirable to
 possess experience in designing websites in compliance with the requirements of the
 Government's Decision N 1521-N of 26 December 2013- Link to the decision:

Award criteria

- Quality of the offer (60%), including quality of the services provided by the Provider, as evidenced by sample website(s) design and development provided in accordance with the technical parameters defined in the document annexed to the Act of Engagement as Appendix I;
- Financial offer (40%).

Multiple tendering is not authorised.

E. NEGOTIATIONS

The Council reserves the right to hold negotiations with the bidders in accordance with Article 20 of Rule 1395.

² The Council of Europe reserves the right to ask tenderers, at a later stage, to supply the following supporting documents:

An extract from the record of convictions or failing that an equivalent document issued by the competent judicial or administrative authority of the country of
incorporation, indicating that the first three above listed exclusion criteria are met;

For legal persons, an extract from the companies register or other official document proving ownership and control of the Tenderer;

F. DOCUMENTS TO BE PROVIDED

Tenderers are invited to submit:

- A completed and signed copy of the Act of Engagement³ (See attached)
- For tenderers subject to VAT <u>only</u>: **a quote, describing their financial offer**, in line with the requirements of section C of the Tender File (see above);
- A list of all owners and executive officers, for legal persons only;
- A copy of registration documents, as well as, where relevant, additional documents showing that the company is entitled to perform relevant commercial activities in Armenia;
- Examples of websites designed corresponding to the requirements listed in the Act of Engagement the Provider is applying for and produced during the last 2 years;
- For natural persons, a detailed CV in English, preferably in the Europass format, demonstrating clearly that the tenderer fulfils the eligibility criteria (where the tenderer is a legal person, this shall include the CV of the person(s) who will be assigned to carry out the work).

All documents shall be submitted in English, failure to do so will result in the exclusion of the tender.

If any of the documents listed above are missing, the Council of Europe reserves the right to reject the tender.

The Council reserves the right to reject a tender if the scanned documents <u>are of such a quality that the documents cannot be read once printed.</u>
