Purchase of IT and office equipment for the Secretariat of the Ukrainian Parliament Commissioner for Human Rights

Contract N° 9138-27

The Council of Europe is currently implementing a Project "Enhanced social protection in Ukraine" in the framework of the Council of Europe Action Plan for Ukraine "Resiliency, Recovery and Reconstruction" for 2023-2026.

The project was addressed by the Ukrainian Parliament Commissioner for Human Rights with the request to provide IT and office equipment aiming at enhancing the capacity of its Department for monitoring the observance of the social and economic rights to work in the difficult war-related conditions.

In that context, the Project is looking for a Provider to purchase IT and office equipment for the Secretariat of the Ukrainian Parliament Commissioner for Human Rights for the proper implementation of its functions during the times of war (the deliverables described in the Technical Specifications represented in the Appendix I).

A. TENDER PROCEDURE RULES

This tender procedure is a competitive bidding procedure. In accordance with Rule 1395 of the Secretary General of the Council of Europe on the procurement procedures of the Council of Europe¹, the Organisation shall invite to tender at least three potential providers for any purchase between €2,000 (or €6,000 for intellectual services) and € 55,000 tax exclusive.

This specific tender procedure aims at concluding a **one-off contract** for the provision of deliverables described in the Technical Specifications (See Appendix I). A tender is considered valid for 120 calendar days as from the closing date for submission. The selection of tenderers will be made in the light of the criteria indicated below. All tenderers will be informed in writing of the outcome of the procedure.

The tenderer must be either a natural person, a legal person or consortia of legal and/or natural persons.

Tenders shall be submitted by email only (with attachments) to the email address indicated in the table below, with the following reference in subject: Tender – 9138-27. Tenders addressed to another email address will be rejected.

The general information and contact details for this procedure are indicated on this page. You are invited to use the Council of Europe Contact details indicated below for any question you may have. **All questions** shall be submitted at least <u>five working days before the deadline for submission of the tenders</u> and shall be exclusively addressed to the email address indicated below with the following reference in subject: Questions – 9138-27.

B. EXPECTED DELIVERABLES

The expected deliverables are described in the Technical Specifications (See Appendix I).

C FFFS

All tenderers are invited to submit a **Financial Offer**, indicating their fees by completing the Appendix II to the Contract.

Tenderers **subject to VAT** shall also send a quote (Pro Forma invoice) on their letterhead including:

- the Service Provider's name and address;
- its VAT number;
- the full list of services;
- the fee per type of deliverables (in Euros, tax exclusive);
- the total amount per type of deliverables (in **Euros**, tax exclusive);
- the total amount (in **Euros**), tax exclusive, the applicable VAT rate, the amount of VAT and the amount VAT inclusive.

Should the Provider be willing to further break down its financial offer, it is invited to do so on a separate sheet, attached to the other supporting documents.

Payment of the Provider's fees will be divided in accordance with the following (see Article 10.1 of the contract attached):

- 50% of advance payment within 60 calendar days as from the day of the last signature of the Contract;
- 50%: within 60 calendar days upon acceptance of the final deliverables by the Council and the Recipient and on presentation of an invoice in Euros.

D. ASSESSMENT

Exclusion criteria and absence of conflict of interests

(by signing the Declaration of Agreement (Appendix IV), you declare on your honour not being in any of the below situations).² Tenderers shall be excluded from participating in the tender procedure if they:

- have been sentenced by final judgment on one or more of the following charges: participation in a criminal organisation, corruption, fraud, money laundering, terrorist financing, terrorist offences or offences linked to terrorist activities, child labour or trafficking in human beings;
- are in a situation of bankruptcy, liquidation, termination of activity, insolvency or arrangement with creditors or any like situation arising from a procedure of the same kind, or are subject to a procedure of the same kind;
- have received a judgment with res judicata force, finding an offence that affects their professional integrity or serious professional misconduct;
- do not comply with their obligations as regards payment of social security contributions, taxes and dues, according to the statutory provisions of their country of incorporation, establishment or residence;
- are an entity created to circumvent tax, social or other legal obligations (empty shell company),
 have ever created or are in the process of creation of such an entity;
- have been involved in mismanagement of the Council of Europe funds or public funds;
- are or appear to be in a situation of conflict of interest;
- are retired Council of Europe staff members or are staff members having benefitted from an early departure scheme;
- have not fulfilled, in the previous three years, their contractual obligations in the performance of a contract concluded with the Council of Europe leading to a total or partial refusal of payment and/or termination of the contract by the Council of Europe.

² The Council of Europe reserves the right to ask tenderers, at a later stage, to supply the following supporting documents:

⁻ An extract from the record of convictions or failing that an equivalent document issued by the competent judicial or administrative authority of the country of incorporation, indicating that the first three and sixth above listed exclusion criteria are met;

⁻ A certificate issued by the competent authority of the country of incorporation indicating that the fourth criterion is met;

⁻ For legal persons, an extract from the companies register or other official document proving ownership and control of the Tenderer;

⁻ For natural persons (including owners and executive officers of legal persons), a scanned copy of a valid photographic proof of identity (e.g. passport).

- Being legally registered as a company or a private entrepreneur to provide requested services (for legal entities and private entrepreneurs);
- At least 2 years of experience in the provision of services related to purchase of office IT equipment;
- Correspondence with the minimum technical characteristics provided in the Technical Specifications (See Appendix I).

Award criteria

- Quality of the offer (60%), including
 - o offered equipment quality (50%)
 - o foreseen deadlines for the provision of services in accordance with the Technical Specifications described in the Appendix I (10%).
- Financial offer (40%).

Multiple tendering is not authorised.

E. NEGOTIATIONS

The Council reserves the right to hold negotiations with the bidders in accordance with Article 20 of Rule 1395.

F. DOCUMENTS TO BE PROVIDED

Tenderers are invited to submit:

- A completed and signed copy of the Contract ³ (see document attached);
- A completed and signed copy of the Financial offer for the estimated IT and office equipment (Appendix II to the Contract);
- A completed and signed copy of the Declaration of Agreement (Appendix IV to the Contract);
- For legal persons and private entrepreneurs: **Copy of the registration documents** (to be submitted in Ukrainian);
- Completed and signed **Tender proposal** in the form of official letter (to be submitted in English) that contains the following sections:
 - o Brief description of the main registration information of the Tenderer;
 - Brief description of the Tenderer's at least 2 years' experience of provision of services similar to the ones requested in this Tender File;
 - o Description of the proposed IT equipment, including the brand name and its serial number;
 - The contact details of three relevant referees (current or previous clients): name, surname, title, phone number or e-mail.

All documents shall be submitted in English with only exception to the registration documents. Failure to do so will result in the exclusion of the tender.

If any of the documents listed above are missing, the Council of Europe reserves the right to reject the tender.

The Council reserves the right to reject a tender if the scanned documents are of such a quality that the documents cannot be read once printed.

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³ The Contract must be completed, signed, scanned in its entirety (i.e. including all the pages). The scanned Contract may be sent page by page (attached to a single email) or as a compiled document. although a compiled document would be preferred. For all scanned documents, .pdf files are preferred.
