COMPOSITION V

MEMBERS:

The Committee of Experts shall be composed of eight representatives of member States of the highest possible rank and/or independent experts with established expertise, including at international level, in law, policy and practice relating to combatting violence against children, prevention programmes, including through integrated approaches, and sex and relationship education as a possible response to prevent and combat abusive or harmful sexual behaviour.

The Committee shall be composed in accordance with Article 6 of Resolution CM/Res(2021)3 on intergovernmental committees and subordinate bodies, their terms of reference and working methods.

The Council of Europe will bear the travel and subsistence expenses of these eight members. Other member States may send a representative to the meetings of the Committee of Experts without defrayal of expenses.

Each member of the Committee of Experts shall have one vote. Where a government designates more than one member, only one of them is entitled to take part in the voting.
